

WHISTLEBLOWER POLICY

If any employee reasonably believes that some policy, practice, or activity of the African Council of Non-Governmental Organisations (AFRONGO) is in violation of law, a written complaint may be filed by that employee with the President/Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

It is the intent of AFRONGO to adhere to all laws and regulations that apply to the Council, and the underlying purpose of this Policy is to support the Council's goal of legal compliance. The support of all employees is necessary to achieving compliance with various laws and regulations. An employee is protected from retaliation only if the employee brings the alleged unlawful activity, policy, or practice to the attention of the African NGO Council and provides AFRONGO with a reasonable opportunity to investigate and correct the alleged unlawful activity. The protection described below is only available to employees that comply with this requirement.

The African NGO Council will not retaliate against an employee who, in good faith, has made a protest or raised a complaint against some practice of the Council, or of another individual or entity with whom AFRONGO had a business relationship, on the basis of a reasonable belief that the practice is in violation of law or a clear man-date of public policy.

AFRONGO will not retaliate against an employee who discloses or threatens to disclose to a supervisor or a public body any activity, policy, or practice of the Council that the employee reasonably believes is in violation of a law, or a rule, or regulation mandated pursuant to law or is in violation of a clear mandate or public policy concerning health, safety, welfare, or protection of the environment.
