





July 13, 2025 Meeting of the SVLC Council

Council members present: Julie Mikula, Diane Johnson, Virgil Binkley, Jim Beck, and Rick Arnold

Council members absent: Clint Watson, Dave Rowell, and Aiden Mosher

Others attending the meeting: Treasurer Mike Colbert, Daryl Blumhagen, and Steve Ward, SAM

The meeting was called to order at 10:35 am by President Rick Arnold. Rick led the council in prayer.

Church member comments:

Daryl Blumhagen said that the renter at 307 N Cherry St. mentioned to him that the pond from the church sump pumpage is larger than she has seen before. The water surface has reportedly extended to the east beneath the back yard fence for the rental. She has also asked that the dead tree at the southwest corner of the lot be removed. There was no objection to the tree removal. Because of the standing water and saturated condition in the area, it was thought that it would be better to wait until fall to consider an alternative water disposal method.

Steve Ward made a motion to accept the minutes of the June 8, 2025 regular-meeting. The motion was seconded by Virgil Binkley and passed.

Treasurer's report: Mike Colbert reported:

The June offering was \$6609 and other income was \$811

The monthly expenses were \$9100, with \$4380 of that being for the deck, ramp, and step renovations

Rent income for the month was \$1650, with associated expenses of \$747

The month end checking account balance was \$4000

The Money Market balance was \$47,580, with \$3000 of that encumbered

The CD balance was \$210,000 with \$30,000 of that in a plumbing reserve

Steve Ward moved to accept the treasurer's report, Diane Johnson seconded the motion, and it passed.

SAM Report:

Steve Ward reported that he had worked with a member with health concerns so that she could comfortably attend church. He brought up that the adult confirmation class would begin on Monday July 21.

Call Committee Report:

It was asked if there had been any interest in our open pastor position. Jim said that he had not received any communicationfrom the Synod concerning a prospective pastor. There was a discussion if SVLC could provide support for a seminary student with the prospect that he/she might come to New Life/SVLC. This fall, Steve Ward will explore that possibility with the Synod.

Rental Committee Report:

Notice has been given to the parsonage (208 N Cherry St.) renters of a rent increase in August

The storm doors have been installed at the rental (307 N Cherry St.)

Townsend flooring is to install flooring in the kitchen of the rental sometime during the week of July 14

An electrician is to look at the replacement of two wall heaters and kitchen light in the rental

The Northwestern Energy notice at both rentals has been satisfied.

Committee Reports:

It was related that the deck, ramp, and step renovations were complete. A report of the work was reviewed by the council.

With two of the heavy rains this past month there has been some seepage into the southeast corner of the new basement. The seepage was mopped and dried with fans. This appears to be caused from runoff from the bare ground beneath the pine trees on the east side of the church ponding in the area of the bicycle rack.

Continuing Business:

The discussion of additional handicapped parking was postponed until the September regular meeting



New Business:

Jim Beck made, and Diane Johnson seconded a motion to authorize assistant treasurer, Lisa Rowell, to sign checks and other financial documents on behalf of the church at Opportunity Bank and Mission Investment Fund. The motion passed.

Council Member Concerns:

President Arnold summarized a letter from Lutheran World Relief seeking assistance for people affected by the Texas flood. Steve Ward made, and Julie Mikula seconded a motion to contribute \$500 to the flood relief and allow the congregation to make a free will offering through August 1. The motion passed.

There being no further business, Steve Ward made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Diane Johnson and passed at 11:29 am. The meeting attendees prayed the Lord's Prayer.
