

# PLEASE READ THIS ENTIRE DOCUMENT

# Fasting:

- ADULT cats and dogs must be fasted prior to surgery. This means NO FOOD after 10:00pm the night before surgery. Ensure they have access to water at all times.
- KITTENS and PUPPIES under 16 weeks of age should be fed dinner the night before surgery AND
  fed a small breakfast (1 tablespoon of soft food) on the morning of surgery. Ensure they have
  access to water at all times.

### Microchip:

• Have you requested a microchip? If so, it is a legal requirement in Victoria to obtain a microchip source number. <u>Click Here</u> to register and answer "No" to the first question regarding breeding. Bring your source number to your appointment.

#### Identification:

• If you are bringing multiple cats/kittens/puppies, they must be identified in some way. Different coloured collars or paper wrist bands with names written on them are good options.

### Admission for desexing:

- Bring your pet in a secure carrier or on a secure lead. Do not carry your cat in your arms as there is a high risk of them running away and getting injured or lost.
- Admit time varies based on location. Please follow the instructions in your appointment reminder
  e-mail (check your junk folder). All animals must be present, identified, and in secure carriers at
  that time.
- Failure to arrive on time may result in cancellation of your appointment with no refund.

#### Pre-anaesthetic blood tests:

Pre-anaesthetic blood tests increase patient safety by alerting the veterinarian to underlying
conditions that might not be obvious but could still cause a complication. As a low-cost, mobile
desexing service, we do not offer pre-anaesthetic blood tests. You have the option of attending a
local veterinary clinic for a pre-anaesthetic blood test prior to the appointment with us. If you
choose to do this, please bring a copy of the results to your appointment.

#### **Risks and complications:**

- While all professional care and attention will be given to each animal, inherent risks exist with any
  procedure, including unexpected complications and loss of life. General risks include anaesthetic
  complications, surgical bleeding, surgical complications, infection, and drug reactions.
- All anaesthesia involves a minor risk however this risk has been greatly reduced since the
  development of modern anaesthetics. Risks are higher in older animals and those with early or
  undetected disease. There are specific risks associated with certain pre-existing conditions. You
  must tell us about any known pre-existing conditions and provide us with information about any
  medications your pet may be taking. Each anaesthetic is monitored closely by a veterinary nurse.
- Please discuss any concerns you may have with the veterinary nurse at the time of admission.

# Discharge:

- Discharge time is generally between 2:00pm-3:00pm. You must arrange for someone to be available during this time to pick up your pet.
- Keep your phone close by and turned on so that we can contact you as needed.
- Please note that we cannot hold animals for late pickup as we need to leave on time to reach our next destination.

# **Cancellation/No Show Policy:**

- If you need to reschedule or cancel your appointment, you must contact us via e-mail at <a href="mailto:info@thevetproject.com.au">info@thevetproject.com.au</a> at least 24 hours before the event.
- If you give at least 24 hours' notice, we will hold your deposit for 14 days. If you do not reschedule your appointment within that time frame, your deposit will be forfeited.
- Please note that if you reschedule your appointment, you may need to bring your animal to a different location/suburb than originally scheduled for.
- Last minute cancellations (less than 24 hours' notice) or no shows will NOT be refunded.
