Hi Neighbors,

Nick and I (and another willing volunteer?) are looking forward to hosting the August 15 potluck! Our event of the evening will be Sabino's 2nd fundraiser of the season - our famous Silent Auction. For those of you who haven't participated before, here's how it works:

- * Bring an auction item to be displayed on the dining tables no surprises this time. Along with your item, you can put a description, if you choose, particularly if the item has an interesting history or might need a little explaining. You can also suggest a starting bid.
- * If possible, we'd like you to bring your auction item before 6pm so that the bidding can start as early as possible.
- * We will put a sheet of paper and a pen by each item. You'll be able to roam around and check out all the items repeatedly through the pre-dinner social time and during dinner, placing bids (or upping your previous bid) until the bidding time is closed.
