Welcome to the 2021 Croydon Churches prayer booklet

Most people will agree that if there was ever a time or a season to pray for Croydon, it is this year, 2021, following on from the challenges we faced as a borough in 2020.

Firstly, we had the Covid-19 pandemic that hit Croydon badly with so many sad consequences. Secondly, we were faced with a very serious economic challenge. Our borough was plunged into a financial crisis which resulted in the Council issuing a section 114 notice in November. Thirdly, Croydon was in the news again over the brutal shooting of a Police Officer (Sergeant Matt Ratana) who was on duty when he was tragically killed.

How did the church respond? As a community of believers, we turned to God. We humbled ourselves before Him. We repented for the things which went wrong. We reminded God of His promise that *“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”* (2 Chronicles 7:14)

We also rolled up our sleeves and got to work, taking our services on-line and transforming our ministries in order to meet the many and varied needs of the communities around us.

We welcome 2021 with a renewed zeal and determination to pray until something happens (PUSH). This booklet, published only in pdf format, is being launched in the midst of all that is going on around us and it is a call to prayer. Whether you pray for one minute or an hour, we are asking every believer in Croydon to use it as a tool to pray. We are trusting God “for mountains to move” and for God to turn around for good what the enemy had intended for evil. We have the faith to believe God that, “all things will work out together for the good of His people and the borough”.

I commend this prayer booklet to everyone who calls on the name of the Lord in Croydon.

Day 1 Wednesday 17th February

Good Friday Walks of Witness

In various locations across the borough local church groups traditionally unite for a walk of witness and a short open-air service.

This topic is usually the Good Friday entry.

But last year, with the nation in lockdown, all walks had to be cancelled and it is looking likely that social distancing restrictions will apply this Easter too.

So the Central Croydon planning team has been working hard to produce an online version of the dramatisation of the Crucifixion, which in normal years is enacted outside the Whitgift Almshouses.

Day 2 Thursday 18th February

Woodside Bereavement Service (The Listening Ear)



“Bind up the broken-hearted...comfort all who mourn...bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes...joy instead of mourning...praise instead of a spirit of despair.” Isaiah 61:1-3

Woodside Bereavement Service (WBS) has been operating in Croydon for over 25 years as a supportive Christian-based bereavement service for those experiencing severe or prolonged shock or depression arising from bereavement and loss. It also serves to educate and increase awareness of the nature of grief and bereavement. Support is provided through counsellors who are trained specifically in grief counselling. WBS is a volunteer-based free service offering one-to-one and group bereavement counselling to adults at our centre or at a mutually agreed location. Children and young people are seen in their schools or at our centre. From April to August 2020 we had to suspend all one-to-one counselling and the training course for new volunteer counsellors, but we were able to provide some existing clients with telephone counselling and support.

We have now adapted our service model, allowing us to resume service in a Covid-safe environment and accommodate the unique constraints on bereaved individuals by the prescriptions put on end of life processes and funerals. We have developed a model for group counselling targeted at those who have lost loved ones in the past few months. We can now see individuals and groups and are able to meet new referrals without significant delay.

1. With thanks to God for the generosity of our volunteers and of the community organisations which support WBS.
2. That those in the local community who are experiencing loss and change in their lives may find the help and support they need.
3. For volunteers to come forward to train as WBS counsellors and for our ongoing financial needs to be met.

Day 3 Friday 19th February

Croydon Churches Floating Shelter/ Croydon Nightwatch



“I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me.” Matthew 25:35-36

Sadly, because of the pandemic, and restrictions which required each guest be allocated a single room (or pod), CCFS has been unable to provide a night shelter this winter and we have had look for other ways to support the homeless.

Each night, from November to the end of March, volunteers from our 21 host churches, instead of accommodating rough sleepers on the nights they should have been on duty, have been making the sandwiches to take down to Nightwatch in Queen’s Gardens.

The 80 sandwiches and biscuits that we provide are proving a great help to Nightwatch, who had been experiencing a strain on their funds due to an increase in the daily numbers looking for something to eat.

It is our hope and prayer that CCFS should run again in November 2021 to provide a night shelter for the homeless if there is a need for one.

2. Thank God for the faithful work 40 years the nightly work of Nightwatch
3. Please pray for long term solutions to the problems of homelessness

Toddler Groups

“He gently leads those who have young.” Isaiah 40:11



Many of our churches have run parent and toddler groups for many years, offering friendship and support to parents as well as play opportunities and social contact for pre-school children. But these groups had to close when lockdown began in March 2020 and at the time of writing the majority are still closed and it's unclear when they might be able to re-open.

In normal times toddler groups can be a lifeline for carers struggling to cope with the challenges and responsibilities of being at home with small children. This is particularly true for new mums or single parents who can find the whole experience overwhelming. At toddler groups, carers help each other through their shared experiences. If a mum is having a rough day there is usually another pair of arms ready to hold a baby or distract a crying child. Children get used to interacting with others. Now, because of Covid restrictions, a generation of children is growing up who have not experienced any human contact outside their family bubble.

1. For churches to find new and creative ways of connecting to parents or carers.
2. For patience, energy and well-being for parents stuck at home and missing the friendly interaction.
3. That any who are lonely, struggling to cope or in need encouragement, may find the help and support they need.

Croydon Street Pastors and School Pastors

The Church in Action on the Streets



Our Street Pastors and School Pastors are trained volunteers from local churches, who usually patrol the streets of Croydon town centre to be a Christian presence and demonstrate God's love in practical ways.

Historically Street Pastors have operated most Friday evenings and School Pastors have operated on Monday and Thursday afternoons in term time. The work of both teams has been severely impacted by the pandemic. On top of this both teams are going through a time of transition and change.

The Croydon night time economy is much quieter than it used to be and St Andrew's, our original partner school for School Pastors, has now closed. Both teams have also shrunk in size. If we are to continue, both teams will need to adapt to the changing needs of Croydon.

Croydon Community Against Trafficking (CCAT)



An effective UK anti-trafficking/anti-slavery organisation working on the ground, in the community - where it matters.

Human traffickers are drawn to Croydon because of its good transport links and highly-populated commercial centre. CCAT campaigns vigorously to free slaves of human trafficking within Croydon and beyond, ensuring that the issue remains high on the agenda, locally and nationally.

We work in partnership with various services in Croydon to help and motivate them to improve support for victims and to disrupt trafficking activity. Progress is being made but there is still much work to be done.

The Covid pandemic creates circumstances that make it impossible for many victims to escape from their captors thus it is essential that we all keep our eyes open to spot the potential signs of people being controlled and enslaved, reporting our findings to the Modern Slavery Helpline.

The pandemic has also had a financial impact on our operations. Several of our traditional funding streams have dried up and we are relying entirely on our volunteers to campaign and petition local and national government.

If anyone feels they can help CCAT in its quest to prevent slavery in Croydon in these challenging times, please do not hesitate to get in touch with us.

A quiet shared space where it's OK not to be OK...

Renew Wellbeing provides simple café-style spaces run by local churches for people who might find a traditional environment overwhelming.

Renew 23 was set up in 2019 by Purley & Kenley Churches Together, partnering with local mental health practitioners.

Each Thursday, when restrictions allow, Purley Baptist Church offers a place for people to come and sit quietly or to share their hobbies and activities.

Three times during the day we stop to pray simple prayers and visitors are welcome to join us. We have been encouraged by the response. Our prayer times have been well-attended and we regularly have people of other faiths praying with us.

During Covid-19 we are using Zoom, and meeting together when the rules allow (following social distancing guidelines) either in a local park or in Get Fired (a local pottery studio) so that we can keep this support group available for those who need it. Our guests have been so grateful to have this lifeline. We have also kept in touch in other ways with those unable to travel during these challenging times.

Work with Elderly Folk

“Even to your old age and grey hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you.” Isaiah 46:4



Isolation and loneliness are very real issues for many elderly people. According to Age UK, more than 2 million people in England over the age of 75 live alone, and even before Covid-19 more than one million older people said they could go for over a month without speaking to a friend, neighbour or family member. The requirement for the elderly to shield during lockdown, even if fit and well, has made life extremely tough and added to the anxiety levels for many. This is especially true for those who aren't able to access technology to keep in touch.

There are some church ministries for the elderly which haven't opened at all since March 2020, others have adapted to enable contact to be maintained. Praise House, in Central Croydon, for example, has transformed its weekly lunch club into a meals-on-wheels service, delivering to their members and stopping for a short socially distanced chat at the same time.

Some groups have been able to keep in contact through phone calls and New Life Church has set up a phone line by which members without internet access can join in their church services by phone.

Some churches have worked with their community to form Covid support groups, such as Selsdon Contact which has made more than 5,000 "befriending calls" by phone to the elderly and vulnerable.

1. For the physical and mental health and well-being of our seniors.
2. For a successful vaccination roll-out so that they are able to re-engage with society without fear.
3. For lonely people to be drawn into communities of love and acceptance and for many of them to meet Jesus.
4. For senior members in your church fellowship and for your own church's ministry to the elderly.

Day 12 Sunday 28th February

Croydon Christian Youthworkers



Networking the borough's Christian youthworkers.

Croydon Christian Youthworkers is a network for youthworkers who usually meet termly to pray, share information and keep updated on issues relevant to young people and youth ministry.

The last 12 months have proved to be very challenging for church youthwork, with most youthwork moving online rather than face to face.

Youthworkers have worked so hard to adapt and to stay in touch with our young people. It's also been a difficult year for our young people with education and exams being disrupted and limitations on their ability to meet other young people.

Please pray:

1. That the young people in our churches will grow spiritually even in this challenging time.
2. For all young people who have been impacted educationally, mentally and socially by the pandemic.
2. For Christian youthworkers as they continue to adapt and innovate in the ways they engage with young people.

Alpha and Christianity Explored

Informal introductions to the Christian faith.



Alpha and Christianity Explored are two popular courses offered by many churches in Croydon. They are designed for those who want to know more about the Christian faith, or to brush up on the basics, and offer opportunities to ask questions and think through issues in an informal setting.

The Alpha course centres on “big” questions such as “Who is Jesus?” whereas Christianity Explored bases sessions on Mark’s Gospel. Both have proved very effective tools for leading people to faith.

The pandemic has led many people to investigate or re-engage with matters of faith. One report claimed as many as one in four people attended an on-line religious service during the first lockdown. Churches are still reporting surprising numbers of visitors to their virtual services, and increased interest in their Alpha or Christianity Explored courses.

Virtual courses may not include conversation over a meal but they are still able to offer time to connect, relax and build friendships at the start of each session.

Each year over 1.3 million people globally participate in these courses.

Croydon NHS Trust Chaplaincy and Spiritual Care

As part of its provision of holistic care, Croydon Health Services NHS Trust’s Chaplaincy & Spiritual Care Team provides pastoral, spiritual and religious care for people of all beliefs. This includes patients, relatives, staff and volunteers. Since March 2020 we have had no alternative but to stand down our Chaplaincy volunteers for their own safety and to help stop any possible spread of Covid-19. However, Rev Andy Dovey (Team Lead) and Rev Lynbert Douglas (Ecumenical Chaplain) have continued full duties to all those in need regardless of whether they are Covid-positive or not.

The function of our team has been a critical element in the Trust’s support of those in their needs and will continue to be so. We see our chaplaincy responsibility as that set out in “The Great Commission” - we are called to serve on the front line, providing God’s grace and the Holy Spirit’s help and guidance to those in need, in their darkest hours, regardless of the risks to us.

Over the past five years Croydon Vineyard has provided free conversational English classes in Croydon Central Library to people whose first language is not English.

Currently we are operating entirely through Zoom, with around 25 people logging on each Wednesday and Thursday morning to both improve their English and connect with others.

Each morning of teaching is followed by an optional online “Discovery Bible Study”, where people discuss easy English translations of the Bible and how it applies to life. People of all faiths stay on for this group, and it's wonderful to be able to share God's Word openly with people from all over the world who are hungry to learn.

Purley Cross Information Centre

During this unprecedented time Purley Cross Centre has remained open but providing a limited service to its clients and enquirers. All face-to-face services were suspended in March until further notice but we continue to respond to requests for information, training, help, guidance and advice, online and by phone.

Services currently being offered include IT training (online); 15-minute free legal and family law advice (consultation by phone); tax help advice for older people (by phone) as well as socially prescribing and signposting clients to external agencies such as the Food Hub, Job Centre, Benefits and Welfare etc. We hope to restart our English Language for Beginners course (“Speak It Out”) as soon as restrictions are lifted.

1. That God will give us wisdom and guidance to sustain us and inspire us with a new vision as we move forward into the next season.
2. That our volunteers will feel safe to return when restrictions are relaxed.

Day 18 Saturday 6th March

Purley Food Hub

Showing God's love and provision to people in crisis.



In 2020 the number of meals provided to hard-pressed clients and their families was 48,987 - by far the most in a year since the Food Hub opened eight years ago, and an increase of 60 per cent on 2019.

The Food Hub is an independent charity run by Purley & Kenley Churches Together. Since our launch in January 2013 we have provided more than 215,000 meals to nearly 24,000 people without enough food. We receive donations of longlife food from churches and schools, supermarkets and businesses, uniformed organisations, Rotary and WI, and many local families and individuals. We are grateful for their generosity and to God who ensures that we always have enough.

Clients are referred to us by frontline staff in around 130 agencies in the borough. For the duration of the Covid-19 pandemic we are operating as a home delivery service, delivering the food parcels direct to our clients' homes in Purley, South Croydon, Coulsdon and Waddon, with three days' food for each family member.

Please pray:

1. For our hard-pressed clients and their individual difficult circumstances.
2. For opportunities to talk about Jesus, to offer prayer and to see people coming to know Him. This isn't always easy when we have to keep our distance.
3. For continuing support - food, volunteers and finances, giving thanks to God for His provision.

Church Schools



There have been church schools in Croydon since the late 16th century when Archbishop John Whitgift opened a school for the poor of the borough.

Some years later, in 1714, Archbishop Tenison founded a school for some “ten poor boys and ten poor girls”, which is now believed to be the oldest surviving mixed-gender school in the world.

The Church has always been at the forefront of education, not just providing church schools for church kids, but opening doors of opportunity for those who were disenfranchised.

Today, on governing bodies, PTAs and in other community involvement in and around our schools, Christians in Croydon continue to be heavily committed to the education of our young people and to being salt and light within their sphere of influence.

Please pray:

1. Thank God for the many church schools in Croydon, of different denominations, both primary and secondary. May the name of Jesus be honoured through each one and may they be distinctive because of this.
2. That staff may teach well and work with God-given energy, patience, compassion and humility, and not be knocked off track by all that is happening at the moment.
3. That pupils and students this year may be given the strength and confidence they need to cope with the challenges imposed on them by the pandemic and the restrictions it has brought.
4. That God will meet the many financial and practical needs that families (and schools) have at the moment and help us to get through this year successfully - it is worth praying particularly for those scheduled to have their GCSE and A Level exams this year.
5. That many young people in this Borough would come to know Christ personally and grow up with a deep and genuine understanding of God's purpose for their lives.

Day 20 Monday 8th March

The Well

The Well exists to help mend broken lives.

For over 11 years The Well has been running from 11:00am-2:30pm on a Monday to “provide rest, support and hope to all of those within our community marginalised through homelessness, the threat of homelessness, and related addiction and mental health challenges”.

Working closely with outside professional agencies, we see up to 35 clients each week, some just dropping in, some being referred to us. These sessions aim to meet both the immediate day-to-day needs of homeless people, and those with the potential of becoming homeless and to address underlying, complex issues over the longer term. The project works in effective partnership with wonderful volunteers from our own church, other churches and the local community.

When the lockdown restrictions began in March 2020 we continued the work by operating from the church car park. Keeping within the Covid guidelines has been challenging but we have managed to provide a hot meal every week as well as providing access to the homeless outreach agency who come along to support.

One amazing statistic: at the time of writing (December 2020) we were able to say that from March to December it hadn't rained on us once!

In the same time our (Salvation Army) food hub was able to provide well over 2,700 food bags which is meeting a very real need here in our community.

Please pray for renewed energy for the task before us, for focused working to meet our intended mission, for more volunteers to join the team and for the lives of our visitors to be changed and transformed into what God intends.

Day 21 Tuesday 9th March

HGEO Foodbank

When we opened our foodbank four years ago we could never have imagined that God might use it to transform our church.



Before lockdown last year we opened one day a week, helping around 130 people. But from March till June we found ourselves operating six days a week (with PPE and social distancing) serving up to 500 people with queues forming outside the building. It was exhausting but we discovered that the more food we gave away, the more we were given: we were contacted by restaurant chains offering lorries-full of food deliveries which they were unable to use. We became a small hub for distribution to other food banks around the borough.

Through this ministry we have had the joy of leading 15 of our visitors to the Lord. One Sunday morning just before the second lockdown, three Spanish-speaking families (with very limited English) who we'd helped, walked into our church service. I asked if anyone in the congregation could translate and amazingly someone spoke Spanish. That was the start of our church transformation. These guests have stayed and integrated into our church family. They've committed their lives to the Lord. Each week in our Zoom service, our worship team chooses well-known songs that have already been translated into Spanish and we all sing along, in our homes, in our native tongue.

Currently we are operating two days a week, helping around 350 people. We offer fresh and dry produce, cupboard basics, toiletries, kitchen utensils, baby clothes, shoes- we try to give people whatever they need.

Please pray that God will continue to resource us to meet the needs we face. And we will be willing to adapt to welcome those He brings our way.

Public awareness of the importance of good mental health has increased during the Covid-19 pandemic.

At APCMH we are working towards a better understanding of mental health, illness and distress and to remove barriers to acceptance and inclusion which are so often a part of our society. We are a Christian foundation but people of all faiths and none use our services.

Established in 2000, in partnership with Croydon Council and local churches, to provide temporary supported accommodation for homeless young people aged 16-25.



Very sadly, after 21 years of operation, The Foyer will be closing in June 2021.

Over the years the building has developed some structural issues which require substantial repair work to remedy. The landlord has taken the decision to sell rather than repair the property and given our team until the end of June to vacate the premises.

The Foyer was set up in partnership with the Council, but has to bid for the required funding. This year we were unsuccessful in their latest round of bidding and as a result the project will be winding down in the next few months.

Our vision has been “for everyone to be part of a community where they are included, belong and have what they need to reach their God-given potential”. Each of our residents has received an individual programme of holistic support aimed at developing life skills, independence and employability.



In January 2014, Dan went to a party and made a fatal decision to take the drug ecstasy with a group of friends. He died two days later from multiple organ failure.

Dan was from a strong Christian family, a member of the church youth group at Emmanuel, South Croydon, and a popular student at Archbishop Tenison's School. His parents, Fiona and Tim, felt that if this could happen to him, it could happen to anyone, and their determination to do all they can to prevent it has led to the establishing of a drugs education charity in his name.

They work with young people, families, professionals and teachers in schools, colleges and communities across London and further afield, through an evidence-based drug and alcohol education programme "*Making Safer Choices*", and a powerful play "*I Love You, Mum - I Promise I Won't Die*", published by Methuen Drama, which has toured professionally since 2017.

This is not where they would have chosen to be but God has opened doors for their message from the very beginning.

Alive Community Centre Food Bank

Elim Pentecostal Church, Thornton Heath.



Our existing “Fresh Food Bank” had to close in March 2020 when the first lockdown began. We immediately expanded our operation in order to deliver food to those shielded or otherwise unable to access food and became the “Elim Food Hub”. By the end of April we were delivering food six days a week to around 180 households in Croydon.

We were so blessed by the response of the local community; so many people who had been furloughed or made redundant came forward to help, often delivering food several times a week.

Once shielding ended in August, the demand halved and we dropped to three days a week, while encouraging people to come and collect instead of us delivering. Finally, we dropped again and are now running a mix of deliveries and self-collection on Tuesday and Saturday afternoons. We are still serving around 100+ households.

All this has led to one of the biggest witnessing opportunities our church has ever had, as our dedicated group of volunteers are a mix of both Christians and non-Christians and most of our clients are also non-Christians.

We believe that we have responded as the Church of Jesus should- reaching out to meet the physical and often emotional needs of a community in shock and despair.

Please pray for many of our volunteers to respond to Jesus and give their lives to Him and for God to continue to give us the strength and perseverance to maintain our service in what is one of the poorer areas of the Borough. "A place of love and peace where ordinary people from around the world are welcomed..."

(Asylum seeker)



During the first lockdown in March 2020 we had to close our Tuesday Drop-in completely, simply because we couldn't have people rubbing shoulders. Instead we started to make up and give out food parcels and toiletries packs to those in need. We have formed working partnerships with other organisations such as the Jesuit Refugee Service and now deliver food parcels and toiletries packs to their clients who live in the area also. Eventually, after doing a Covid-Secure risk assessment, we were able to offer a clothing-giveaway service enabling 12-15 people at a time into the large hall where we set out racks and boxes of clothes for people to choose, with our volunteers acting as personal shoppers.

The second lockdown meant, once again, we had to stop people coming in to the building but we were able to serve some people who came to the door. A number of asylum seekers who were put up in hotels in Croydon by the Home Office were recently transferred to the Napier Barracks in Folkestone. We're in touch with the camp's Anglican Chaplain and have been able to send clothes and shoes for named individuals we got to know while they were in Croydon. Before Christmas we were able to take another delivery of warm winter coats and shoes which were donated by a film studio costume department. At present we're not looking for any more second-hand clothes or household equipment but we would welcome donations of new underwear and socks for men and women plus toiletries and long-life food.

2. That it won't be too long before we are again able to safely open our doors to offer a warm welcome and practical help to Croydon's asylum seekers.

Unfortunately the pandemic has rather spiked our guns but two of us are now sufficiently trained to act as befrienders. This involves being allocated clients whom we ring weekly to offer our support. If more specialised help is required by our clients, we are able to liaise with PACT for advice.



Food Stops

"For people who have more month than money!"
(Food Stop member)



Food Stops are community food sharing membership schemes whereby for £3.50 a week you can buy about £20 worth of food. They are run in partnership with Croydon Council and the Fareshare food charity and are open to anyone who is on benefits or who has been furloughed or laid off from their job as a result of the pandemic. They are also available to anyone who is self-isolating and has no support locally.

Since March 2020 membership of these schemes has almost doubled.

Council staff would normally be on hand to help with advice relating to welfare benefits, debt, job support and skills training, but since the pandemic began, face to face meetings have been replaced by phone calls.

Croydon Gospel Festival

Reaching the community; preaching the gospel; bridging the generational gap.



This annual inter-denominational event aims to bring a lot of fun into sharing the Gospel. By April last year it became apparent that the festival would have to be cancelled. Organiser, Pastor Bola Thomas, explains: “We tried to go ahead, but there were so many hurdles to overcome, particularly with track and trace. We took a decision to cancel with heavy hearts. However, almost as soon as we cancelled the venue, through Divine insight, we began to think about taking the festival to the streets. We sensed God was saying, ‘It’s going to happen!’ So we then had to ask, ‘Well how can it happen?! How can we evangelise and win souls?’ We realised it would have to be completely stripped back. God began to open doors: we identified spaces, around the borough that we might like to use- at East Croydon station, North End, outside Ambassador House (Thornton Heath) and Streatham Common. All, apart from the station, were given the OK with no payment required. Our theme was HOPE ON THE STREET. We invested in mobile speakers and had teams of people handing out PPE to those watching. Six out of our 21 original artists agreed to perform and more came forward wanting to take part.

Ten churches took part in evangelism training and prayer and fasting beforehand and in the end that wasn’t enough: people came forward for prayer and over 115 gave lives to the Lord— people were just so ready to receive. It seems amazing but out of Covid-19 God has brought a blessing!”

Growbaby

Growbaby is a ministry of Grace Vineyard Church, Purley, providing pre-loved clothes, equipment and toys for children from birth to five years, to any who have need. We support refugees, asylum seekers, trafficked victims, those on benefits and those with no recourse to public funds. This year, due to the pandemic, we have seen more and more families unable to provide for their children's basic needs.

When we opened seven years ago, we operated out of a garage. For the last couple of years we have been given use of the most amazing space in Montpelier Church, South Croydon. This has been such a blessing to us and our clients.

During lockdown, we have been unable to open as usual but on many occasions we've been able to respond to an emergency call and then deliver the goods to the clients themselves.

In Tier 2 we were able to serve together again, although with everyone masked and socially distanced. Clients could no longer touch clothes and equipment, instead they would give us their list and we chose for them. At Christmas we were able to give presents to the children and beautiful toiletries to the mums. We also offered everyone our prayers.

God is good and we are blessed to serve in this ministry. We look forward to the time when we can again open our doors.

Torchlight Ministries

“Like many other ministries we have been galvanised to increase our operations to meet the needs of those who are vulnerable and disadvantaged. We have had to be inventive in terms of delivery and style of outreach.” Rev Alison Johnson

Prior to lockdown we were serving hot meals in several local hostels. Now the teams prepare take-away food for delivery direct to homes or to reception areas in hostels. At Christmas we were given the go-ahead to prepare (on site) a lunch for the students and staff of a central Croydon pupil referral unit. Forty meals were provided alongside some additional sweet treats. Our Doorstep Blessings initiative has encouraged people to nominate an individual they want to surprise with an unexpected gift. Over 50 of these have been delivered including bouquets of flowers, birthday cards and pressies and food hampers.

In the last two months we have served over 300 hot meals to rough sleepers living in temporary accommodation. Over the last 10 months we have contributed to over 150 dental kits being donated to St Mungo's; delivered over 150 sanitary-ware items for women living in temporary accommodation; provided clothing for children living in DV (domestic violence) refuges; given clothes and toiletries to Croydon Refugee Day Centre and also donated small household items (as part of our Bottom Drawer Initiative) to young people leaving supported living, women entering DV refuges and for students heading off to university. We continue to collect food surplus donations from Aldi, Greggs, Lidl and M&S and these items are then redistributed to those individuals and families in need in our borough.

CCF would usually host three breakfasts for church leaders in Croydon each year, gathering between 40-60 leaders. These events allow ministers to keep up-to-date, share their stories and get to know and encourage one another. Ministers and priests can move jobs more frequently than many members of their churches. The average time spent in a church is around seven years. The breakfasts provide a real opportunity for new clergy to meet other leaders and get involved in church unity as soon as they arrive in the borough.
