#### First Reading read by Margaret Smith

I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty thunder-peals, crying out,

'Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready; to her it has been granted to be clothed with fine linen, bright and pure' – for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints.

And the angel said to me, 'Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.' And he said to me, 'These are true words of God.' Then I fell down at his feet to worship him, but he said to me, 'You must not do that! I am a fellow-servant with you and your comrades who hold the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.'

#### Gospel

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.



#### Garden Room Planned Giving

#### **GARDEN ROOM PROJECT UPDATE - January 2018**

As reported in our last update, in October last year we issued a package of information to three Contractors for Tender pricing, and we have now received their Tender Returns. The lowest return price was just over £114k, but this price included a couple of Provisional Sums which we think are bit low; the return also included some suggestions for alternative details that should make the extension more economic to run; so we think this price should be assessed as being more in the region of £120k. The other two Return Sums were £155k and £170k. We are happy with the lowest Tenderer's ability to undertake the work and to work collaboratively with us throughout the project.

The Tender sums do not include VAT, or items that I think we can undertake ourselves (such as internal decorating), furniture or further fees.

In the next few weeks we will update our Design Development Statements to accord with our lowest Tenderer's suggestions and recommendations, and submit our drawings and documentation for DAC Approval. We will also develop further Construction Details and submit for Building Regulations Approval.

It is essential to remember that the prices listed above are current – they will increase with building cost inflation. So, the longer it takes us to raise the full funding for this project, the higher the final cost will be!

The focus now needs to be wholly concentrated on fund raising. The hard work of lots of people is bearing fruit and we hope to be able to publish more details soon – this year will be about building on that success and reaching our total to enable building to begin!


It is located within the Sainsbury's store complex and welcomes the retired and elderly living locally to bright, comfortable and friendly surroundings.
