

Welcome to St John's this morning!

Whether you are here for the first time, or a more regular worshipper, we are delighted to have you with us, and we hope that you will enjoy the service. We would particularly like to welcome Horatio Scott Weerasuriya who is to be baptised this morning, and his family, godparents and friends who have come to support him.

All that you need to follow the service from beginning to end is contained in this booklet, except for the hymns which we will sing from the hymn books you have been given. Apart from that, you can follow the service all the way through using this booklet. **Hymns numbered 1-799 can be found in the green hymnbook. Hymns numbered 800 and above can be found in the blue books.**

Suggestions are given in this booklet for posture – when to sit, stand and kneel. These are suggestions only. Please adopt whatever position is most comfortable for you, and helps you to concentrate on your prayers. Since the Eucharistic Prayer is one complete prayer, it is best to adopt the same position from beginning to end – i.e. from “The Lord be with you” to the Lord’s Prayer.

Please join in anything written in **bold type!**

CHILDREN ARE WELCOME AT ST JOHN'S

If you have children with you, you may want to take advantage of the Children’s Area – a special part of the church where parents/carers and children can share the service together, perhaps using the toys, books and puzzle sheets provided. If you have any suggestions on how we can make it even better, or help you enjoy the service more with your child, please let Jenny know.

Please do not worry or feel embarrassed if your child makes a noise; your children may actually be happier at the front where they can see what’s going on, so don’t be shy! There are toilets and baby changing facilities in the hall opposite the church. Just ask a sidesperson for directions

We hope you enjoy worshipping here. Do stay after the service for refreshments which are served in the church hall.

Please help us to keep everyone safe in church! Small children running around can so easily trip or tip something over and hurt themselves or others. Please try to keep children out of the sanctuary area (where the altar is) during the service and out of reach of the candles!

About this service of Christian Baptism

Baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God which continues for the rest of our lives, the first step in response to God's love. For all involved, particularly the candidates but also parents and godparents, it is a joyful moment when we rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring the faith. The wider community of the local church and friends welcome the new Christian, promising support and prayer for the future. Hearing and doing these things provides an opportunity to remember our own baptism and reflect on the progress made on that journey, which is now to be shared with this new member of the Church.

The service paints many vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian way. There is the sign of the cross, the badge of faith in the Christian journey, which reminds us of Christ's death for us. Our 'drowning' in the water of baptism, where we believe we die to sin and are raised to new life, unites us to Christ's dying and rising. Water is also a sign of new life, as we are born again by water and the Spirit. This reminds us of Jesus' baptism. And as a sign of that new life, a lighted candle is presented to each newly baptised person, a picture of the light of Christ conquering the darkness of evil. Everyone who is baptised walks in that light for the rest of their lives.

As you pray for Horatio, picture him with yourself and the whole Church throughout the ages, journeying into the fullness of God's love.

Jesus said, 'I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.' *John 10.*



Please stand for the

Processional hymn 905 Christ, when for us you were baptised
(in the blue book)

During this hymn the choir and clergy will process to their places.

The president greets the people recalling the baptism which all Christian people share:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

The president introduces the service and presents Horatio to the congregation, asking:

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.
We thank God for Horatio who has come to be baptised today.
Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church.
So I ask you all:

Will you support Horatio as he begins his journey of faith?
We will.

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family?
We will.

The president then addresses the parents and godparents

God knows each of us by name and we are his.
Parents and godparents, you speak for Horatio today.

Will you pray for him, and help him to follow Christ?
We will.

The president introduces a brief period of silent prayer before saying the Opening Prayer on behalf of the congregation.

Faithful Creator,
whose mercy never fails:
deepen our faithfulness to you
and to your living Word,
Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Please sit for the

Reading from the second letter to the Corinthians

(2 Corinthians 4.13-5.1)

In the Scriptures it says, "I spoke because I had faith." We have that same kind of faith. So we speak because we know that God raised the Lord Jesus to life. And just as God raised Jesus, he will also raise us to life. Then he will bring us into his presence together with you. All of this has been done for you, so that more and more people will know how kind God is and will praise and honor him.

We never give up. Our bodies are gradually dying, but we ourselves are being made stronger each day. These little troubles are getting us ready for an

eternal glory that will make all our troubles seem like nothing. Things that are seen don't last forever, but things that are not seen are eternal. That's why we keep our minds on the things that cannot be seen.

Our bodies are like tents that we live in here on earth. But when these tents are destroyed, we know that God will give each of us a place to live. These homes will not be buildings that someone has made, but they are in heaven and will last forever. I am the Lord All-Powerful, the first and the last, the one and only God.

Israel, I have rescued you! I am your King. Can anyone compare with me? If so, let them speak up and tell me now. Let them say what has happened since I made my nation long ago, and let them tell what is going to happen. Don't tremble with fear! Didn't I tell you long ago? Didn't you hear me? I alone am God— no one else is a mighty rock.

The Gospel book will be brought to the middle of the congregation to remind us that Jesus, God's Living Word, walks among his gathered people

Please turn to face the gospel book.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

Glory to you, O Lord.

(3:20-21;31-35)

Jesus went back home, and once again such a large crowd gathered that there was no chance even to eat. When Jesus' family heard what he was doing, they thought he was crazy and went to get him under control.

Jesus' mother and brothers came and stood outside. Then they sent someone with a message for him to come out to them. The crowd that was sitting around Jesus told him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside and want to see you."

Jesus asked, "Who is my mother and who are my brothers?" Then he looked at the people sitting around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who obeys God is my brother or sister or mother."

The Decision

The president addresses Horatio through her parents and godparents

We all wander far from God and lose our way:
Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.
In baptism we respond to his call.
Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin?
I do.

Do you reject evil?
I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?
I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?
I do.

Signing with the Cross

The president makes the sign of the cross with the Oil of Baptism on Horatio's forehead, saying

Christ claims you for his own.
Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ.
You are his for ever.
**Stand bravely with him
against all the powers of evil,
and remain faithful to Christ
to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you
from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light
and obedience of Christ.
Amen.

Horatio, his parents and godparents gather with the president at the baptismal font. Please move so you can see the font if you need to! While everyone moves to their places, the following hymn is sung:

Prayer over the Water

The president stands before the water of baptism and says

Praise God who made heaven and earth,
who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.
Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.
We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.
By it we share in his resurrection.
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.
Now ✠sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again.
Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

The president addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, let us affirm,
For ourselves and on behalf of those who are being baptised,
our faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,
source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,
who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in
God the Holy Spirit,
who gives life to the people of God
and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.
This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism

The president pours water on Horatio, saying

I baptise you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The president anoints Horatio with the Oil of Chrism, as a sign of his new life in the Holy Spirit, his participation in the community of the Anointed One (the meaning of the word Christ or Messiah), and in the royal priesthood of the Church, saying

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.**

Welcome and Peace

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism:
Horatio, by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body.
We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;
we are children of the same heavenly Father;
we welcome you.

All remain standing for the Prayers of Intercession.

We join in the response:

Heavenly Father,
hear our prayer.

At the end of the prayers we say together:

For yours is the majesty,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit;
yours is the kingdom
and the power and the glory,
now and for ever. Amen.

All stand as the president introduces the Peace.

The peace of the Lord be always with you
and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Please shake hands with those around you as a sign of sharing God's peace with each other

Please stand to sing the Offertory hymn

During the hymn, we make our way back to our places. Bread and wine and any money gifts are collected and taken to the altar. The bread and wine are put on the altar and everything is prepared.

Offertory hymn 845 Lord, we come to ask your healing *(in the blue book)*

After the hymn, we pray:

With this bread that we bring
we shall remember Jesus.

With this wine that we bring
we shall remember Jesus.

Bread for his body, wine for his blood,
gifts from God to his table we bring.

We shall remember Jesus.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The president begins the Eucharistic Prayer – the great prayer of thanksgiving over the bread and wine that recalls all that God has done for the world.

**Remain standing, or seated, or kneeling
throughout the prayer**

The Lord be with you

And also with you

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

It is right to give thanks and praise

It is always right to give you thanks,
God our Creator, loving and faithful, holy and strong.

You made us and the whole universe,
and filled your world with life.

You sent your Son to live among us,
Jesus our Saviour, Mary's child.

He suffered on the cross;
he died to save us from our sins;
he rose in glory from the dead.
You send your Spirit to bring new life to the world,
and clothe us with power from on high.
And so we join the angels to celebrate and sing:

**Holy, holy, holy, holy,
Holy, holy, Lord God almighty.
And we lift our hearts before you
As a token of our love.
Holy, holy, holy, holy.**

Father, on the night before he died,
Jesus shared a meal with his friends.
He took the bread, and thanked you.
He broke it, and gave it to them, saying:
Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.
Do this to remember me.

After the meal, Jesus took the cup of wine.
He thanked you, and gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you.
This is my blood, the new promise of God's unfailing love.
Do this to remember me.

Jesus Christ is Lord:
**Lord, by your cross and resurrection
you have set us free.
You are the Saviour of the world.**

Father, as we bring this bread and wine,
and remember his death and resurrection,
send your Holy Spirit,
that we who share these gifts
may be fed by Christ's body and his blood.
Pour your Spirit on us that we may love one another,
work for the healing of the earth,
and share the good news of Jesus,
as we wait for his coming in glory.
For honour and praise belong to you, Father,
with Jesus your Son, and the Holy Spirit:
one God, for ever and ever.

Amen, amen, alleluia! Amen, amen, alleluia!
And we lift our hearts before you
as we give you thanks and praise.
Amen, amen, alleluia!

*All kneel as the president introduces **the Lord's Prayer***

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break the bread of life,
and that life is the light of the world.
God here among us, light in the midst of us,
bring us to light and life.

We sing together:

Holy Jesus, holy Jesus,
Give us peace within our hearts, holy Jesus
And we lift our hearts before you
to receive the love you give
Holy Jesus, holy Jesus

The president invites everyone to receive communion

Come, not because you are strong but because you are weak,
come, not because you must but because you may,
come, not because any goodness of your own gives you a right to
come, but because you need mercy and help,
come, because you love the Lord a little
and would like to love him more,
come, because he loved you and gave himself for you.

Anyone who normally receives communion in any Christian church is most welcome to receive the bread and wine(communion) this morning. If you don't usually receive bread and wine in church please still come forward for a blessing.

Please ask one of the churchwardens or other helpers if you would like some help to come up to communion, or if you would like the clergy to bring communion to you in your place.

During the distribution of Communion the choir will sing the anthem:

Lord for thy tender mercy's sake *Farrant*

Then the following hymn will be sung. Please join in singing the hymn if you would like to

The president blesses the people and dismisses them to go out into the world taking the Good News of Jesus Christ to all those they meet.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you

You are called and loved by God the Father
and kept safe by Jesus Christ.

Mercy, peace and love be yours:
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The president gives Horatio a lighted candle and says:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness
and has given us a place with the saints in light.

You have received the light of Christ;
walk in this light all the days of your life.

**Shine as a light in the world
to the glory of God the Father.**

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

In the name of Christ. Amen.

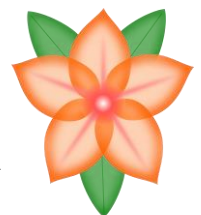

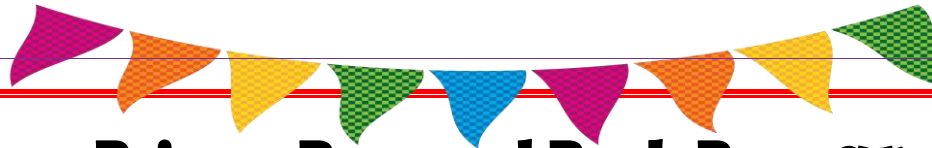
