Gospel reading:

Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.' And Mary said,

'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.' *Luke 1.39-45(46-55)*

FORM OF WELCOME into the Parish for Jan Lynas as Reader

Jan stands with the Archdeacon, the Rector and Churchwardens before the Congregation

Archdeacon: The Church of England admits women and men to the Office of Reader. Their duties are to assist in the leading of the worship of the people, to preach the word of God, to share in the spiritual, teaching and pastoral work and in the leadership of our parish.

Jan, you have been Admitted to the Office of Reader and the Bishop has Licensed you. Are you willing to exercise this Ministry in this Parish?

Reader: I am, the Lord being my Helper. Reader faces congregation and reads out the Licence/P.T.O.

Rector: As Rector of this Parish and on behalf of the Clergy and Readers of this Parish, I welcome you to share in our Ministry.

The Rector turns to the Congregation and asks them:

I present to you Jan as a Reader in this Parish. Will you support her with your prayers, your love and your loyalty and so help her in the work and development of her Ministry?

All: We will.

Churchwardens: As Churchwardens of St John the Divine Parish we welcome you in the name of the people and pray that God may bless your Ministry among us.

The Reader faces the Archdeacon and Rector

Archdeacon: May God guide you in all your work undertaken in His name and keep you faithful in His service: +and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit be among you and remain with you always. Amen.

After a short period of silence the Reader turns to the congregation.

Reader: Almighty and everlasting God,

by whose Spirit the whole Church is sanctified; hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people, that each in their vocation and ministry may serve you in holiness and truth to the glory of your Name; through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen.** If you'd like to discuss arranging a baptism (christening), a wedding or a funeral, please call Jenny on 0208 657 2343.

Even if you can only commit to one or two Sundays a month, please have a word with our Director of Music, Ian Brentnall if you might be interested. All voice parts welcome!



ST JOHN'S SELSDON GARDEN ROOM



As you know, we've all been hard at work planning, and fundraising to build St John's Garden Room - a comfortable and welcoming space for church and

community groups to use and enjoy. With all your hard work, and particular thanks to Peter Crocombe and his planning team and Gill Salter and her fundraising team, we now have sufficient funds, and the necessary permissions in place from the Diocese and from Croydon planning office, to be able to begin building.

Inevitably there is quite a bit of mess and disruption, especially in these early weeks as foundations and drainage channels are dug. For the moment, access to the south side of the church is severely limited, and the path from the main door round the side of the church is currently out of action. The Garden of Remembrance itself is safely fenced off, but if you need to access it over the next few weeks, please go across the grass at the front of the church. If you find this difficult for any reason, please have a word with Jenny. If you would like a floral tribute laid at the grave of a loved one, please let Jenny know if we can help you with this.

The building work is expected to last until early summer 2019. I'm sure you will bear with us while the work goes on. If you have any particular needs or concerns at any time, please do speak to Jenny.

Although we've done really well with fundraising, and securing funds from external sources, we do still need to raise a bit more to cover all our costs. So our fundraising continues – please continue to support events which will raise much-needed funds for the project
