The Lord said to Abram: Leave your country, your family, and your relatives and go to the land that I will show you. I will bless you and make your descendants into a great nation. You will become famous and be a blessing to others. I will bless anyone who blesses you, but I will put a curse on anyone who puts a curse on you. Everyone on earth will be blessed because of you. Abram was seventy-five years old when the Lord told him to leave the city of Haran. He obeyed and left with his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, and all the possessions and slaves they had gotten while in Haran.

Gospel

There was a man named Nicodemus who was a Pharisee and a Jewish leader. One night he went to Jesus and said, "Sir, we know that God has sent you to teach us. You could not work these miracles, unless God were with you."

Jesus replied, "I tell you for certain that you must be born from above before you can see God's kingdom!"

Nicodemus asked, "How can a grown man ever be born a second time?" Jesus answered:

I tell you for certain that before you can get into God's kingdom, you must be born not only by water, but by the Spirit. Humans give life to their children. Yet only God's Spirit can change you into a child of God. Don't be surprised when I say that you must be born from above. Only God's Spirit gives new life. The Spirit is like the wind that blows wherever it wants to. You can hear the wind, but you don't know where it comes from or where it is going. "How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.

Jesus replied:

How can you be a teacher of Israel and not know these things? I tell you for certain that we know what we are talking about because we have seen it ourselves. But none of you will accept what we say. If you don't believe when I talk to you about things on earth, how can you possibly believe if I talk to you about things in heaven?

No one has gone up to heaven except the Son of Man, who came down from there. And the Son of Man must be lifted up, just as that metal snake was lifted up by Moses in the desert. Then everyone who has faith in the Son of Man will have eternal life.

God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who has faith in him will have eternal life and never really die. God did not send his Son into the world to condemn its people. He sent him to save them!

About this service of Admission to Communion before Confirmation

Today is a day of great celebration for our church community, as we welcome Hannah to receive Holy Communion for the first time. When she was baptised she became a member of God's Kingdom of love, starting out on the journey of faith to which God calls her. Now she takes another step on that journey as she receives with us the bread and wine that is the sacrament of Christ's body and blood, given at such great cost for the life of the world.

As we welcome Hannah into the Eucharistic community, let us pray for her, and rejoice that as she journeys through life with us we will learn with her and from her. Please keep her in your prayers today and every day, that, in maturity, she will come to be confirmed and continue to grow in the knowledge and love of God.

We welcome also all those who have come to support Hannah today, especially family, friends and godparents who are with us this morning.

Admission to Communion

After the address, Hannah stands and the president welcomes her and presents her to the congregation.

The president then asks:

Hannah, you love God, you follow Jesus, and you live the Christian life. Do you wish to receive Holy Communion?

You have been baptised into God's church, and, with all of us gathered here today, you have been given new life through the resurrection of Jesus. He gave us this special service of Holy Communion to bring us together as his family, to remember all he has done for us and to receive him into our lives as we share the bread and wine. Now God calls us and invites us to say 'Yes' to him. So now I ask you:

Will you try to love God our Father who made us? with God's help.

Yes,

Will you try to follow his Son Jesus Christ who gave his life for

us? Yes, with God's help.

Will you try to trust in his Holy Spirit who guides us?

Yes, with God's help.

The president stands with Hannah, who turns to face the congregation. The president addresses the entire congregation.

People of God, Hannah is part of our family. Will you also support and encourage her on her Christian pilgrimage by your friendship, by your example and by your prayers?

Yes, with God's help.

We pray together:

God of life, you invite us to eat at your table; may we know your love, follow you in the world, and shine with your light all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Hannah, I admit you to receive Holy Communion. May you know Christ's special presence as we share the bread and wine together.

And finally, thank you for making the past 6 years some of my happiest in ministry.



church to finish our session and enjoy some Easter food together!



The Annual Parochial Church Meeting, and the Meeting to Elect Churchwardens

will take place on Sunday 19th April

after the 10am service at 11.30am (approx.) in the hall.

This is the single most important non-worship event in the life of the parish community, and you are warmly encouraged to attend. Full papers will be available in good time before the meeting. As well as reviewing the year gone by, this is the time when we elect our churchwardens (who are elected year by year) as well as members of the Church Council (the PCC), and our representatives to Deanery Synod (who are elected every three years).

In total, we are seeking to elect two churchwardens, four members to the PCC and four representatives to Deanery synod.

Broadly speaking, anyone over 16 and on the electoral roll may be nominated for membership of the PCC and as a Deanery synod representative.

The key thing to consider when making such a nomination is the extent to which that person is involved with the life of the church community, and how likely they are to "co-operate with [the parish clergy] in promoting...the whole mission of the Church."




