You see, we don't go around preaching about ourselves. We preach that Jesus Christ is Lord, and we ourselves are your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let there be light in the darkness," has made this light shine in our hearts so we could know the glory of God that is seen in the face of Jesus Christ.

We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. Notes from the Choirmaster

"The Great Os"

Well, what a to-do! I greet you from my inpatient bed under the fine care of the staff at Princess Royal University Hospital. I am on the mend slowly, but it will be a while before I am able to be with you in person once again. In the meantime, I thought I would share with you some background information about one of our most popular Advent hymns, O Come, O Come Emmanuel.



The **O Antiphons** (also known as the **Great Advent Antiphons** or **Great Os**)

are Magnificat Antiphons (a kind of response sung before and after a Psalm or canticle) used at vespers on the last seven days of Advent in Western Christian traditions. It is likely that they date to sixth-century Italy, and they subsequently became one of the key musical features of the days leading up to Christmas.

Each text, in the original Latin, begins with "O". Each antiphon is a name of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. They are:

- 17 December: O Sapientia (O <u>Wisdom</u>)
- 18 December: O Adonai (O Lord)
- 19 December: O Radix Jesse (O <u>Root of Jesse</u>)
- 20 December: O Clavis David (O Key of <u>David</u>)
- 21 December: O Oriens (O Dayspring)
- 22 December: O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations)
- 23 December: O Emmanuel (O <u>With Us is God</u>)

In the <u>Roman</u> tradition the O Antiphons are sung or recited at vespers from 17 December to 23 December inclusive. Some Anglican churches also used them at <u>evensong</u>; often according to medieval English usage, beginning on 16 December. However, since the severe decline in weekly parish Evensong services in the Anglican Church (due in no small part to the huge success of the Forsyth Saga TV series in 1967!) this tradition has now largely died out.

The hymn we now know as O come, O come, Emmanuel" (Latin: "*Veni, veni, Emmanuel*") was originally written as a metrical paraphrase of the Latin <u>O Antiphons</u>. The 1861 translation by <u>John Mason Neale</u> for <u>Hymns Ancient and Modern</u> is the most prominent by far in the English-speaking world, but other English translations also exist. Translations into other modern languages (particularly German) are also in widespread use. While the text may be used with many metrical hymn tunes, it was first combined with <u>its most famous tune</u>, often itself called *Veni Emmanuel*, in the English Hymnal in 1851.

So, next time you sing this hymn, remember that you are part of a tradition stretching back fifteen centuries during which countless Christians have proclaimed the names our saviour and entreated to come to us.
