First Reading - Isaiah 53: 4 - 12

Surely, he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases. yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth. like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice, he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore, I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death and was numbered with the transgressors. yet he bore the sin of many and made intercession for the transgressors.

The Gospel according to

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

Singing hymns and spiritual songs...

Our Communion hymn this morning is "To Be a Pilgrim" (also known as "He Who Would Valiant Be") and is the best known hymn using words of John Bunyan in The

Pilgrim's Progress. It first appeared in Part 2 of The Pilgrim's Progress, written in 1684. The hymn recalls the words of Hebrews 11:13: "...and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth."

The words were modified extensively by Percy Dearmer for the 1906 The English Hymnal. At the same time it was given a new tune by composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, who used a melody taken from the traditional song "Our Captain Cried All Hands" which he collected in the hamlet of Monk's Gate in West Sussex – hence the name of "Monks Gate" by which the melody is referred to in hymn books.

For a time, Bunyan's original version was not commonly sung in churches, perhaps because of the references to "hobgoblin" and "foul fiend." However, one commentator has said: "Bunyan's burly song strikes a new and welcome note in our Hymnal. The quaint sincerity of the words stirs us out of our easygoing dull Christianity to the thrill of great adventure." Recent hymn books have tended to return to the original, for example, the Church of England's Common Praise.

THE SOCIETY OF CATHOLIC PRIESTS

On Thursday with great regret, I gave up a job which has meant a great deal to me – being Provincial Secretary of the Society of Catholic Priests. It has been my privilege and joy to serve the society in this capacity for the last 17 years, but the time has come for me to make way for a younger person.

The Society was formed here in the Diocese of Southwark in 1994 following the vote to approve the ordination of women to the priesthood. The two existing societies for catholic-minded priests decided that membership was incompatible with approving women priests. As a result, those who did approve were obliged to leave. This was a very painful step for some of them who had to part company with men they had be friends with since college days.

The then Bishop of Southwark encouraged them to form a new society for mutual comfort and support and so the Society of Catholic Priests came into being. As members we affirm that the Anglican Communion is part of the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church and has the right to ordain men and women to all three Holy Orders, we also acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and undertake to use and practice the seven sacraments. The society now has over 500 members throughout the United Kingdom and provinces have been established in North America and Australia.

Although I am no longer Provincial Secretary I am still a member of the society and you see its red cross badge in my lapel

The shopping bus runs on a fortnightly basis to Sainsbury's at Warlingham. Clients are collected from their home and are fully supported by our drivers and escorts. One to one help is available. (if you use a wheelchair) Each client is able to fill a maximum of three bags of shopping, during the hour in store. Help with packing is given and the bags are lifted onto the bus and upon arrival home, to your door. These sessions are treated as a social occasion by many of our clients, enjoying conversations on the bus and forming new friendships.

The cost of this is £7 per trip......much cheaper than a taxi!
