Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

We are honoured that St. John's choir has been invited to be the choir at our Diocesan Confirmation service this year.



Father Michael's Diary

22 OCTOBER CURSILLO



I shall be away this weekend, not on holiday or even a mini-break, I shall be working hard running a Cursillo weekend in our Diocesan retreat house Wychcroft. So, you can get some idea of what I get up to when I'm not around I'd better explain what Cursillo is. Cursillo is a lay empowerment movement. In other words, it aims to motivate Christians to be active leaders, not only in the Church but wherever their lives take them.

The Cursillo movement started in the Roman Catholic church in Spain in 1949 In Spain the Civil War which started in 1936 only ended in 1939 a few months before the second World War began. So Spanish life was disrupted (although Spain was neutral during the War) for a period of 9 years or more. So, a group of Spanish Catholics got together to devise a programme to revitalise the life of the Spanish Church. They took as their model the pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostella and the spirituality of St Ignatius Loyola.

They came up with the idea of a Cursillo, a short intensive course, conducted over a three-day weekend (Thursday to Sunday) which would provide attendees (styled "pilgrims") with a life changing experience which would motivate them to engage in more active discipleship. Cursillo was exported from Spain to the USA and thus to the Episcopal Church there and then to other parts of the Anglican communion. In this country it is organised in separate Diocesan organisations, and I am the Spiritual Director of Southwark Cursillo.

At a Cursillo weekend there is a mixture of activities: teaching, worship, meditation and music all aimed at encouraging the pilgrims to deepen their relationship to God and their commitment to Christian discipleship. The weekend is followed by regular group meetings and reunions aimed at maintaining the momentum established at the weekend. Pilgrims are not left to struggle on alone but are supported by a community of their fellow pilgrims. If anyone would like more information about the Cursillo movement just ask!
