Father Michael's Diary

24 DECEMBER 2021 TRUE GOD AND TRUE MAN

The Council of Chalcedon met at Chalcedon in modern Turkey in the year 451. It was the last and largest of the four great Ecumenical Councils which brought together



bishops from the whole Christian world (hence ecumenical) to discuss and decide the great doctrines of our faith. All four council were concerned with Christology: the doctrines concerning Jesus Christ, especially the doctrine of the incarnation. The issue they all addressed was this: the second person of the Trinity (Christ) is the active principle of the Godhead through whom the cosmos was created yet this same Christ was born into our world as the man Jesus. How could this be? And how were Christ and the man Jesus related?

Over the years between 319 and 451 four explanations were advanced all of which were found to be unsatisfactory: that Christ was a created being and not divine, that Jesus was not a true man, that the two natures God and man existed side by side in Jesus who was sometimes one and sometimes the other and finally that the manhood of Jesus was swallowed up by his divinity. Between them the four councils rejected all of these unsatisfactory explanations and were left with the conception that Jesus Christ was 100% man and 100% God at one and the same time. They embodied this in a definition which has come down to us as the Nicene creed which we recite every Sunday at the Eucharist (named after the first council which was held at Nicaea in the year 325). The Nicene definition is very hard to get your head around and its very easy to fall back on one of the unsatisfactory explanations which were rejected by the councils, a danger we always need to be aware of: the unsatisfactory explanations are still with us.

In the days following Christmas the Church commemorates these Christological debates: 1 January is the feast either of the Circumcision of our Lord (which commemorates his manhood) or of Mary Mother of God which celebrates the title given to Mary by the third council which defended the divinity of our Lord. The following day we remember Basil the Great and Gregory of Nazianzus two theologians who championed the orthodox doctrine of the incarnation in the fourth century.
