But it was too late.

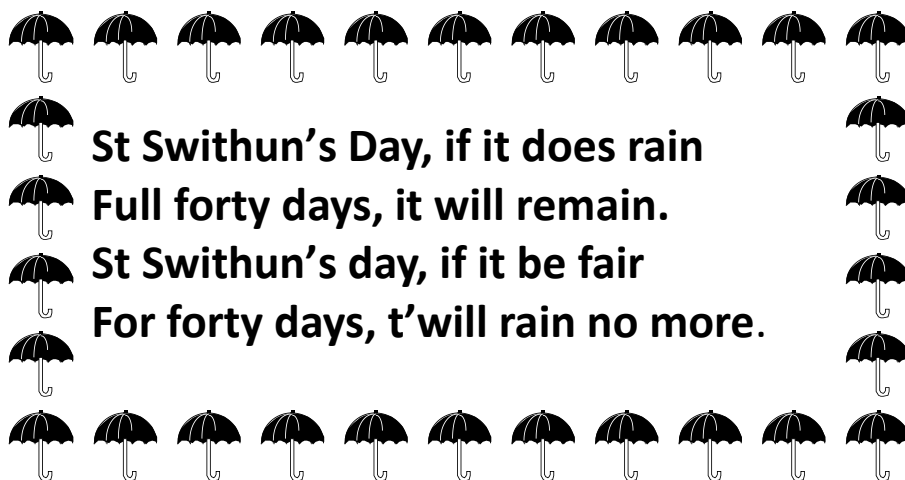


We all hate cruelty.

St Swithun was a Saxon Bishop of Winchester who asked to be buried out of doors where he would be "trodden and rained on". The monks of Winchester tried to move his remains to a splendid shrine inside the Cathedral on 15 July 971. There was a heavy rain storm which lasted a long time and this led to the legend that if it rains on St Swithun's day it will rain for the next 40 days and a fine 15th July will be followed by 40 days of fine weather.
