1. How many members were there in the Second Continental Congress at any given time?

Sixty. Many people would answer this question as 56 which is the number of members of the Second Continental Congress who signed the Declaration of Independence. But, all members of the Second Continental Congress did not sign the Declaration of Independence.

2. Did anyone go to jail for participating in the Boston Tea Party?

No one admitted to being a part of the Boston Tea Party because of the ramifications of this admission. However, there was ultimately one individual who went to prison for his actions as part of the Boston Tea Party and his name was Francis Akeley.

3. What happened to much of the tea the next day after being dumped into the harbor?

Much of the tea floated up to the surface. For

several days, members of the Sons of the Liberty floated out on boats and hit the tea with ores in order to render the tea completely useless.

4. What was the name of the individual who built George Washington's War Tent and built it so well that it still exists today?

His name was Plunkett Fleeson and he was an upholsterer who resided in Philadelphia.

5. What was the name of the group that delayed the British at the Battle of Brooklyn (aka Battle of Long Island) long enough so that the Americans were not fully surrounded and destroyed?

The Maryland 400

6. Why is Maryland known as the "Old Line State"?

The Old Line State is named that in honor of the Maryland 400 who delayed the British advancement long enough to make sure that the Americans were never fully surrounded during the Battle of Brooklyn.

7. Who owned the ships carrying the tea that was ultimately dumped into the Boston Harbor?

All ships were American ships, but were hired by the British East India Company to carry the Tea from London to Boston. Two of the ships (Beaver and Dartmouth) were owned by the Rotch family and the Eleanor was owned by John Rowe.
