Through your unwavering backing, we have achieved remarkable milestones. Our total support and revenue reached an astounding \$57 million, a figure that speaks volumes about the trust and commitment you have placed in us. The generosity of our in kind donors was particularly striking, with donated inventory valued¹ at an incredible \$57,107,453 which played a critical role in our operations. This year has not only been a journey of challenges and triumphs but also one of profound impact and meaningful connections.



Our commitment to providing essential medical aid and fostering community development has never been more impactful. We have had the privilege of serving over 100 recipient organizations, delivering essential medical supplies and support. In addition to our particular emphasis on helping cancer and psychiatric patients, we were exceptionally pleased to be able to facilitate much needed medications to

Multiple Sclerosis patients. Our investments in Essential Medicine Distributions, amounting to \$46.6 million, have brought hope and healing to hundreds of thousands of men, women, and children in Lebanon. Through our Disaster and Rare Disease Program, with medicines and medical supplies valued at \$4.7 million, we responded swiftly and effectively to crises, mitigating suffering and restoring wellbeing. Additionally, our Community Development Initiatives, funded at \$329,792 in small grants and in-kind donations, have laid the groundwork for sustainable growth and empowerment in numerous communities.

We have also upheld our commitment to fiscal responsibility and operational efficiency. Our total assessments and fair distribution services ensured that the majority of our resources were directed towards our core mission of "delivering aid from donor to recipient the fastest way possible".



Our supporting activities, including General & Administrative and Logistics expenses, managed at a total of \$191,919, reflect our dedication to efficiency, stewardship, and accountability. Here, I pause to be wholeheartedly grateful to our grant donors and individual contributors. Without you, we could not have possibly continued our operations. "THANK YOU"

As we look ahead, we remain grounded in our mission and inspired by the resilience and strength of those we serve as well as with the dedications of our staff and volunteers. Operation Multiple Sclerosis

In Lebanon, the support for Multiple Sclerosis (MS) patients is significantly upheld by organizations such as the Nehme & Therese Tohme Multiple Sclerosis Center at the American University of Beirut Medical Center (AUBMC) and L'Association Libanaise contre la Sclérose en Plaques (ALiSEP).

People to People Aid Corp.'s involvement in bringing essential medications to MS patients in Lebanon is particularly noteworthy. Our effort to supply much-needed medications fills a critical gap, especially given the challenges in the availability and accessibility of MS treatments in the region. This support is crucial in a country where the prevalence of MS is significant, and the disease is commonly diagnosed in young adulthood totaling approx. 3000 patients in Lebanon that have been neglected as a result of the failed healthcare services. The commitment of People to People Aid Corp. to support these patients, when other organizations or systems may not have adequately addressed their needs, is a valuable contribution to the healthcare landscape in Lebanon, especially for those underserved population living with MS.

By providing these medications (totaling \$600,750 in wholesale value), People to People Aid Corp. is not only contributing to the physical well-being of these patients but also supporting the overall mission of organizations like ALiSEP and the Nehme & Therese Tohme Multiple Sclerosis Center to improve the quality of life for people affected by MS in Lebanon.





Community Outreach

In an effort to empower local communities and to instill hope through improving the wellbeing of marginalized populace, Our Community Development Initiatives, funded in small grants and in-kind donations, have laid the groundwork for sustainable growth and empowerment in numerous communities. Our support via empowering smaller clinics serving marginalized neighborhoods have significantly impacted the lives of men, women, and children living under the poverty line. In addition, sponsoring social development and inspirational programs for teachers, particularly those educating young children, is a critical investment in our future. These programs not only enhance the skills of the teachers but also have a profound impact on the children they teach. Especially for children traumatized by wars or living under challenging economic and social conditions, such initiatives can be transformative. By instilling hope and fostering a nurturing environment from an early age, we lay the foundation for a more resilient, enlightened, and emotionally healthy generation. The influence of these programs extends beyond the classroom, contributing significantly to the overall well-being and development of children in society.





Disaster and Special Programs

Following the recent devastating earthquake in Morocco, our partner Direct Relief International, a notable humanitarian aid organization, played a crucial role in the emergency response. The earthquake, which struck the High Atlas Mountains region near Oukaïmedene, approximately 40 miles southwest of Marrakesh, resulted in over 1,000 fatalities and more than 1,200 injuries. The situation was particularly challenging due to the rural and less resourced areas affected by the earthquake, which posed significant challenges for the delivery of medical aid and relief efforts.

People to People Aid Corp.'s local Emergency Response team along with our in country partner the Mayshad Foundation and in cooperation with Direct Relief ER department have conducted on site assessment programs focused on the immediate and near-term medical needs in coordination with local offices and other various organizations in Morocco. In addition to coordinating with local networks, we engaged with the regional Ministry of Health team in the affected regions and recognized the critical need for timely access to pharmaceuticals and emergency supplies to support earthquake crush victims.

Our efforts were vital in addressing the acute medical needs arising from the earthquake. We deployed our resources to swiftly address the local community's healthcare needs by coordinating, ordering and receiving 15 pallets worth more than \$3 million which were distributed along with the local health authorities and Foundation de Sud to clinics and organizations in need.

We expect to sustain our services in 2024 by building along with our partners a primary healthcare clinic in the High Atlas Mountains that provides essential healthcare services enhanced by health awareness programs to educate the population on local prevalent diseases and emergency response training.
