The saint writes of 50 "Roses" or secrets of the Most Holy Rosary. It begins with explanations of the roses offered to the world.

A White Rose for Priests: Keep it in your heart. Make a practice of the Holy Rosary and taste its fruit: preach the Rosary and thus convert others by teaching them the excellence of this holy devotion.

A Red Rose for Sinners: Crimson because the Precious Blood of Our Lord has fallen upon it. Sinners' roses are actually cruel thorns that prick them during life by giving them pangs of conscience, at their death with bitter regret, and in eternity they turn to burning shafts of anger and despair. But in praying the Holy Rosary daily those thorns will turn into crowns of roses. The first a crown of merit during life, the second a crown of peace at death, and the third, a crown of glory in heaven.



# The Constant Prayer of St. Catherine of Siena





### JOURNEY THROUGH THE MASS

#### PART TWO

After the priest has kissed the altar he walks to the Presider's chair and leads the congregation in making the Sign of the Cross, the first action in the Introductory Rites. Here we begin to make the transition from our busy secular lives, and ready ourselves to take part in the beauty and wonder that lies ahead. Or at least we should.

How many times do we hurriedly invoke our Triune God... "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"...with little or no thought? And yet it was not always that way. Early Christians recognized this action



as a powerful ritual in which they called upon the power of God to bless them, to guard them against evil, and to protect them throughout their day. St. John Chrysostom said we should make the Sign of the Cross frequently throughout our day, covering ourselves with the Armor of God.

And St. Cyril of Jerusalem went on to say that crossing ourselves is not just a badge of the faithful, but a safeguard against evil, because demons dare not attack someone clothed in the Sign as it is a reminder of Christ Crucified, and therefore of their defeat!

Make each gesture thoughtfully...slowly from the forehead to your chest, from shoulder to shoulder. Speak the words intently...consecrate yourself to God for the next hour. Call upon the power of God that has dwelt within us since our Baptism, and prepare yourself to meet Him in the Liturgy.
