The saint writes of 50 "Roses" or secrets of the Most Holy Rosary. It begins with explanations of the roses offered to the world.

A White Rose for Priests: Keep it in your heart. Make a practice of the Holy Rosary and taste its fruit: preach the Rosary and thus convert others by teaching them the excellence of this holy devotion.

A Red Rose for Sinners: Crimson because the Precious Blood of Our Lord has fallen upon it. Sinners' roses are actually cruel thorns that prick them during life by giving them pangs of conscience, at their death with bitter regret, and in eternity they turn to burning shafts of anger and despair. But in praying the Holy Rosary daily those thorns will turn into crowns of roses. The first a crown of merit during life, the second a crown of peace at death, and the third, a crown of glory in heaven.



PART SIX

We conclude the Introductory Rites of the Mass with the Gloria, followed by the Collect! As we sing out these words, praising God, let's take a moment to explore the lyrics. We begin by echoing the words of the angels in Bethlehem, shouting out the good news of Our Lord's

> birth. This puts us the mindset of preparing to welcome the Lord into our hearts as He was welcomed into the world 2000 years ago. Did you know the Gloria used to be called "The Angelic Hymn" for that reason?

The entire song is a collection of Scriptural quotes, and a praise of the Holy Trinity. Throughout this glorious song we sing out the titles by which God has been known throughout history. We recognize not just His omnipotence and power, but also the gift of His fatherhood to us, a relationship made known to us by Christ Himself.

As we sing out our praise for God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, that praise is not given out of fear but out of love and gratitude. We are not just praising Our Creator for all He has given us, we also praise Him in appreciation of the Incarnation, for humbling Himself to become man, as the Creed notes later in the Mass "for our sake."

The Mass unites heaven and earth and at each Mass we are praising God along with all the Angels and Saints. If you imagine that, and fully participate in that moment each Sunday, you will be gifted with a more spiritually meaningful Lent and Advent Season because you will truly experience the loss of that united praise during those long weeks of preparation.
