If you know anyone who needs good thoughts sent their way or needs a helping hand please let me know.



From the Secretary's desk:

On December 28, 2023, I emailed 2024 Dues Notices to each Old West member who has an email address recorded in the chapter's database. Paper notices were sent via USPS mail to those who do not have email addresses on approximately the same day. For our new members, a Notice of Dues was mailed to you soon after your initiation.

The reason I bring this up is that less than 50% of our members have made 2024 dues payments.

The Old West Chapter's Uniform Code of Bylaws state annual dues, along with the Grand Chapter assessments are due on January 1st of each year. This year, the total is \$89.86. The \$40.00 dues portion pays for the chapter's operating costs; the \$49.86 per capita portion is collected to pay to the Grand Chapter in August. If all dues payments are not received by mid-August when the chapter writes the check, the chapter pays the remaining per capita portion from the general fund.

This month, I will be sending out Notices of Delinquent Dues by email and USPS mail to each member whose dues are unpaid. You should know that we are no longer accepting payments through the Zelle app. Checks should be written payable to Old West Chapter #642. You may also pay cash at any meeting you attend. You will receive a cash receipt and your dues card at the end of that meeting.

Please let me know if you did not receive the notice in January and I will resend it to you. Also, let me know if paying your 2024 dues is a hardship on your finances. I will be happy to pass it on to the Worthy Matron in a confidential manner.


