

Burial Site Details

Thanks to the research done by local historian Rodney Haskell there is more that can be written about the people who are interned there with their names and background information as follows:

Grave no. 1. George Sisson died 22nd April 1941 aged 84 and Mary Matilda Sisson died 1st August 1949. They lived at 490 Charminster Road Bournemouth.

Grave no. 2. Alexander Grant Bishop died 31st October 1919 aged 37. He married Ellen Mary Baker of the parish of Hampreston on 10th April 1915 and lived at West View. Howeth Road Bournemouth.

Grave no. 3. Fredrick Harry Burrage died 31st October 1915 aged 2 years 9 months child of Amy and Harry Burrage.

Grave no. 4. Alice Mary White died 6th November 1943. Henry Hatfield White baptised 2nd December 1859 at Great Canford, Dorset, died 29th October 1949 aged 90, occupation, plasterer. They lived in East Howe Lane. His father was a baker and his mother's name was. Sarah.

Grave no. 5. Emmeline Alice White died 8th September 1947 aged 75 and Florence Lily White died 22nd December 1970 aged,96. Both single and lived at home with the family in Kinson. Emmeline was a Grocer's assistant and Florence Post Mistress. Their Parents were, Thomas and Sarah Hatfield White.

Grave no. 6. Ethel Anne Trowbridge died 20th May 1958 aged 71 and was born at Sandy, Bedfordshire. Arthur Trowbridge died 20th September 1972 aged 88 he was born at Okeford Fitzpaine. It is believed that Arthur was a landscape gardener and they lived at 61 South Road, Springbourne, Bournemouth.

Grave no. 7. Florence Emily Elms died 21st September 1940 aged 74. Florence was from Middlesex. Ernest Woodgate Elms died it was recorded that he was a poulterer. 24th December 1947 aged 86. Ernest was born in Abinger, Surrey and was a Law Stationer. They lived in East Howe Lane, Bournemouth and had a daughter, Gladys F. M. Elms.

Grave no. 8. Sarah Jane Cherrett died 13th January 1938 aged 72. Peter Saul Cherrett died 26th May 1953 aged 87. They married at St. Andrews Church Kinson aged 22 on 9th July 1887. The marriage certificate marked with X marks and witnessed by Edward and Mary Wright. Neither Peter nor Sarah could read or write. The service was conducted by the vicar, E. F. Daniels. Peter was an agriculture labourer and they lived at 183 Kinson Road.

Grave no. 9. Winifred May Cherrett died at Boscombe Hospital, Bournemouth on 29th January 1951 aged 50. Archibald William Chenett died 27th March 1941 aged 38. Archibald was killed by enemy action during World War 2 and was named in the Bournemouth Book of remembrance. They lived at 158, Kinson Road, East Howe, Bournemouth. Probate went to Ernest James Ellsworth, lorry driver and Gilbert Charles Cherrett, grocer.

Grave no. 10. Sarah Hatfield White died 25th May 1911 aged 74. Thomas White died 23rd May 1924 aged 87. They were parents of Henry Hatfield White in grave no.4. Lot Lawson owned two mud cottages in Manor Farm Lane Kinson. Thomas White purchased them from Lot and built a pair of cottages on the site for his sons Augustus and William. Thomas and Sarah Hatfield White had 6 children, Kate, Horace, Augustus, William, Lucy, and Sidney.

Grave no.11. Lucy Bell Gosling died 6th January 1937 aged 66. Her Father was, Thomas White, a baker. Alfred Joseph Gosling grocer and provision dealer came from Woodford, Essex, died 23rd May 1946 aged 71. They married at St. Mark's Church, Wallisdown Parish of Kinson, witnessed by Thomas White and William Thomas Gosling. Lucy and Alfred had 2 children Muriel Irene and Alfred Stanley.

Grave no 12. Horace Tom White died 1948 aged 81, son of Thomas and Sarah Hatfield White. Mary Ann White died 1958 aged 89. Horace and Mary married at Swanage on 26th February 1896; Mary's fathers name was George. Horace and Mary White lived with Joyce White (niece) at Herston, Wallisdown, Bournemouth. Horace is described as Assistant Overseer of the Poor and Rate Collector; he was church secretary at East Howe in the 1930s.

Grave no. 13. William Arthur White, baker, son of Thomas White. He was knocked down by a car when passing behind a van and died 26th May 1931 aged 62. Sophie Marshall White died 6th December 1946 aged 69, she was a teacher at Throop and it is believed born at Holdenhurst, daughter of Charles Marshall of Redhill a bricklayer, freeholder and common juror who had tea gardens at Riddles Ford and ran the ferry over to the Parley side of the Dorset Stour. William and Sophie lived at Oakleigh, Manor Farm Lane (later Road), Kinson; they had 5 children; Doreen born, 18th May 1904 was a Teacher of young children, Guider and Sunday School Teacher; Miriam worked in a nursery school and married Reginald Brown from Swanage who was a solicitors clerk; Ruth Olive born, 19 July 1909 was a trained office worker and in the Wrens for many years and married Harold Olson a navy man and writer; Phillip was born 19th August 1910 and he started as a carpenters apprentice with Pascoe Marshall and later became manager of the original Whites Bakery at Kinson. Phillip was in the Tank Corps during WW2 and after the war he became a motor engineer, he also served as a Special Constable; Dennis was born 30th July 1914 and became a grocer who took over from Phillip as manager at Whites Bakery.

Grave no.14. Mary Ann Rigler (Nee. Kirley) born 15th July 1835 died 17th April 1890 aged 55; Mary came from Sopley, Christchurch and was the wife of George Rigler bricklayer journeyman. Sarah Jane Rigler died 29th November 1911 aged 60. George Rigler died 14th March 1922. They had 5 children, Emily, Charles, Horace, Owen and Bessie. George Rigler's father and mother were William (labourer) and Elizabeth Rigler and they had 7 siblings, Edward, Elizabeth, Matilda, Hannah, Emily, Ann, and Caroline. In the 1851 census he described himself as a land proprietor. In 1891 a year after his wife Mary died, he was remarried to Sarah Jane Dacombe (widow) believed born in Puddletown, Dorset and they married at Wimborne Minster on 5th January 1891, they lived at Colehill, Wimborne, they were married for 20 years but had no children, Sarah's father was a local farmer. In the 1911 census it is recorded that he was a market gardener.

Grave no. 15. John Henry Bell died 7th September 1946. He was a minister for 41 years. He lived at the Manse, Longham and was responsible for Longham and East Howe Congregational Churches. His wife Emily Betl died 16th July 1959.

Grave no. 16. Henry James Day of Berkeley, Kinson Road, Wallisdown died 15th June 1931 aged 51 believed born in Devonshire. Maud Naomi Day died May 1960 aged 83.

Grave no. 17. Annie Louisa Walton died 24th March 1964 aged 84. Loved and sadly missed by her sons Geoffrey and Eric and family. The 1911 census tells us that Annie was married to Frank Walton who worked in Turkish Baths and they had a daughter, Violet Annie.

Grave no.18. William Henry Budden died 1942 aged 57, he was baptised at Kinson 20th September 1885, believed born at Talbot Village. Agnes Amelia Budden died 1966 aged 80. They had 3 children, William, Ellen and James. William's parents, James and Laura Budden lived at 209 Seaview Road, Bournemouth and they had 3 children, William, Ellen, and James. James Henry Budden worked as a water main layer and was born in Kinson, Laura was born in Colehill. Agnes is mentioned in connection with East Howe Farm, possibly she was a member of the Burt family who were at East Howe Farm before my grandfather took it over in the 1920s.

Grave no.19. Leslie James Budden of 25 Moorside Road, East Howe died 27th July 1964 aged 48 his wife Ida A. Budden born 29th November 1918 and died in 2003 aged 85. Leslie became a teacher at Kinson School for 15 years. He started at the school on 13th September 1949 and by 6th July 1955 he had 44 pupils in his

class and there were 836 pupils on the school role. On 7th September 1960 he was appointed Deputy-Headteacher a post he held until 1964, the year that he died. Ida was the last person to be buried in the East Howe burial grounds. Leslie's mother's name may have been Rigler.

Grave no. 20. Mary Jane Jerrard died 15th September 1930 aged 68. Walter Charles Jerrard died 6th December 1937, aged 82. They lived at 40 Sea Road, Boscombe. Walter was born in Chideock, near Bridport and was a domestic coachman. Mary came from Tincton.

Grave no. 21. Anne Jane Cull (Nee. Lovell) died 20th May 1935 aged 80 her husband Ernest Cull (gardener) died 28th May 1940 aged 83. They married on 29th April 1888 at St. Phillip, Lambeth, Surrey. John Cull, Ernest's father was a woodman and Jane's father Mark Lovell was a coachman. They lived at 96 Stewart Road, Bournemouth and they had 6 children, Anna, Kate, May, Ernest, Ella and Lily. The 1911 census tells us that the family had moved to 103 Stewart Road, Bournemouth and Ernest was a domestic gardener working at the Royal Victoria Hospital.

Grave no.22. Charles Stagg (a keeper) died 1925 aged 51. Bessie Olive Stagg (nee Gibbs) died 29th May 1955 aged 81 and they lived at East Howe. They had a son Gilbert W. Stagg who became a Carpenter & Joiner. Charles was a gamekeeper and his father Thomas was a train driver. Bessie's father, Jasper Walter Gibbs was a bricklayer. Widow, Bessie Olive Stagg was living at 42 Noel Road, Wallisdown when she died in the Royal Victoria Hospital, Boscombe.

Grave no.23. Susan Elizabeth Hicks died 7th March 1906 aged 75. Susan came from Poulner nr. Ringwood and was a dressmaker. John William Hicks, born in Ringwood and became a Carpenter & Thatcher, he died 13th October 1916 aged 83. They had 5 children, Walter, Eva, Agnes, Francis and Miriam and they all lived at East Howe.

Grave no.24. Fredrick William Gibbs died 2nd July 1902 aged 17; son of Jasper Walter Gibbs (labourer) who died 28th June 1915 aged 64. Elizabeth Talbot Gibbs (nee. Rigler) died 25th February 1927 aged 74. They married at St. Andrew's Kinson on 23rd August 1869. All 3 are buried in the same grave. Jasper was the son of Charles Gibbs a plasterer and Mary Gibbs and they lived at East Howe.

Grave no.25. Ann Cure died 3rd July 1892 aged 53. She lived with her husband, Ebenezer Samuel Cure (retired baker) at Ashley Cottage, near East Howe Lane. Ebenezer came from Lytchett, Dorset. He re-married to Melinda and they lived at 59 Victoria Road, Bournemouth and had a son, Ebenezer S. Cure.

Grave no.26. Mary Ann Sheppard died 5th May 1942 aged 71. Mary Eleanor Sheppard was born 5th April 1896 and died 21st February 1977 aged 81. Mary Eleanor Sheppard was a spinster. She had a brother Stephen Sheppard who lived at Hill View, Mount Road, East Howe. Stephen died 30th July 1924 at 48a Lower Road, Rotherhithe, London. The probate on Stephen's estate was just £140 and it went to his sister Mary Eleanor.

Grave no.27. Elizabeth Charlotte Day (Nee Maidment) died 9th October 1930 aged 62. On the 25th December 1890 at Cranbourne Elizabeth married George Fredrick Day who had a greengrocer shop at 33 Northcote Road, Springbourne. David Maidment, Elizabeth's brother also had a greengrocer shop in Kinson. Their parents are buried in plot 29.

Grave no.28. William Fancy died 8th June 1899 aged 73. Matilda Fancy (nee. Rigler) died 14th September 1906 aged 75; Matilda was born in Kinson and worked as a laundress. William was a general labourer; he was born at Canford and lived at East Howe. William and Matilda married at Kinson 29th August 1853 and they had 6 children, William. Edward, Walter, Anthony, Emily and Lucy. William's father was David Fancy a

Bournemouth brick maker. As a freeholder William could be called to serve as a common juror. On 15th February 1849 the Poole & Dorset Herald printed a letter that complained of robberies and poaching in the neighbourhood and suggesting that it was led by a man named Fancy!

Grave no. 29. David Maidment died 7th July 1908 aged, 72. Harriett Maidment died 8th January 1928 aged 92. David was a Coachman and Gardener living at 2 Wyke Villas, Wallisdown. Probate, £237.10s 1d. They are the parents of Elizabeth and David, (plot27).

Grave no. 30. Herbert Rigler died 27th December 1924 aged 59. His parents were Edward and Christian Rigler who lived in Holdenhurst Road, Bournemouth and he was one of 7 children, Sophia, Francis Henry, Kate, Walter, Edger, and Herbert was the youngest. In 1911 they had moved to 92 Wimborne Road, Winton. Son Herbert like his father traded as Coal & Corn merchants He married Marcia and they lived at 5 Talbot Road, Winton and they had 3 children, Alfred, Harold and Rose plus a live in servant, Elizabeth Saunders.

Grave no. 31. Fredrick James Ford died 12th January 1925 aged 77. Mary Eleanor Ford died 28th November 1956 aged, 96. They lived at Burleigh Park Road, Wallisdown. As a widow Mary moved to 41 Alton Road, Wallisdown and died at St. Leonards Hospital, Ringwood.

Grave no. 32. Francis Rigler died 10th May 1880 aged,28. Also in the same grave site, Alfred Rigler died 24th 1866 aged 3. Harriet Anne Rigler died 16th July 1870 aged 20. Alfred Rigler died March 1817. They were the beloved children of Edward Barnes Rigler and Christian Ann Bennett Rigler of East Howe. Edward Rigler was an agriculture labourer and his wife, Christian Ann was born in Newtown, Newfoundland.

Grave no.33. Christian Ann Rigler died 2nd April 1886 aged 63. Edward Barnes Rigler died 7th October 1905 aged 79. Their children are buried in plot 32.

Grave no.34. William Kent retired builder and was the son of Jonathan Kent of Blandford who died 20th November 1898 aged 72 and his mother Elizabeth Kent who died 13th August 1909 aged 72, Elizabeth was also from Blandford. The 1871 census tells us that they lived in Blandford and ten years later William was a builder employing one man and they were living at Winton House, Holdenhurst Road, Bournemouth. By 1891 he had retired and lived at Kinson. Three people named on the memorial in the grave yard were buried in Australia, they are; Martha Francis, died 23rd August 1883 aged 73 - Martha was interned at Campbell's Creek, Cemetery, Castlemaine, Victoria, Australia; Silas Francis, died 17th February 1858 aged 44, he was interned at Brighton, Victoria, Australia, his mother was Ann Francis of East Stour near Blandford and he was christened on 8th May 1814 at Marnhull, Dorset; and Augustus Snook, died at Coolgardie, Western Australia on 25th October 1896 aged 60. Augustus Snook had a daughter named Annie L. Snook

Grave no.35. Charles Barnes died 7th July 1904 aged 70. Charles was a labourer and gardener. and a very staunch supporter of East Howe Congregational Church. He never earned more than 30 shillings a week but managed to save £200 to build a cottage in the church grounds and called it "Hope Cottage". When he died, he left the cottage to the church. Charles was married to Ann who came from Longham. His Probate was £66-5s-10p. They were neighbours of Samuel Garland who was Headteacher of the old Kinson Village School.

There are also two un-marked graves in the burial grounds. Interned in the first un-marked grave is Ivy Kate Bachelor (Nee. Keeping) who was buried in the East Howe burial ground on 27th July 1932. Ivy's son Leslie Norman Bachelor is buried alongside her aged 14. Leslie left East Howe Boys School in March 1941 at the age of 14 and started work at the Alder Road Gasworks. Just two weeks later a German aircraft dropped a bomb on the gasworks killing 31 men including Leslie. Leslie had a brother Desmond Ivan Bachelor who died in 2002 and two sisters. Betty Calder (Nee Bachelor) who lives in Scotland and Joan Kathleen born 10th January 1930, died 4th February 1989. Ivy Kate Bachelor was one of eleven siblings of

Mr. H. J. Keeping. There is also believed to be seven un-marked graves of babies who died from a local epidemic in 1902.

Mrs. Hester Nottage (Nee. Rigler) told me that Edward Barnes Rigler and Christian Ann Bennett Rigler (grave no. 33) were her great-grandparents, Herbert, and Marcia Rigler (grave no.30) were her grandparents and Harold Rigler (not in the East Howe burial ground) was her father. Hester lived in East Howe Lane and married a gentleman from Auckland, New Zealand. They moved out there to live, keeping the house in East Howe Lane to use when they returned to England for holidays. Hester's husband died in 1994 and she returned to England, sold her house in East Howe Lane and is now living in Salisbury. They had no children
