Management Report

- Met w/ Carlos to get updated insurance documents for liability, vehicles, workman's comp and licenses for his company.
- Reviewed existing contracts for lawn maintenance, rubbish collection and custodial work with current vendor (Carlos Manzanares) in preparation for updating contracts for the balance of 2023 and 2024.
- Created and sent an incident reporting process to the Board for approval. This process was adopted at the board meeting of 10.23.23.
- Purchased and arranged for installation of 4 programmable thermostats for the clubhouse. Oversaw the installation of the 4 thermostats in the clubhouse to better control energy costs.
- Reviewed various violations throughout the community.
- Prepared for and attended the Board meeting that was held on 10.23.23.
- Designed and submitted to the board for approval custom signs for parking restrictions at the storage lot.
- Sought and received a bid for an onsite "shredding day".
- Sent input to Tropical Isles newsletter editor re September's Managers report and a notice to owners re contracting with vendors and that the Association is independent of these transactions.
- Pond update Met with Solitude Lake Management again re the cat tail issue in our ponds. They've
 agreed to spray again at no cost and do it from a boat so they can spray the cattails that are difficult to
 reach from the shore.
- Bulk cable I've been asked to investigate the potential of the Co-Op offering cable, telephone and
 internet (or a subset of those three) by looking at "bulk rate" contracts with vendors. Bulk rate costs
 are always less expensive than individual retail service from major vendors like Comcast, BlueStream
 or Hotwire.
- Pool Update We have asked the owner of Fountain Blue pools to do an in-depth review of the pool
 equipment as we believe there are too many ongoing issues related to the plumbing and pumps. We
 expect the results of that investigation and proposed solutions to any problems to be available just
 after the Thanksgiving holiday.
