- Thank you to everyone who donated food to the food bank. In the month of December, we donated 99 pounds of food.
- Fountain Blue Pools came out and repaired the timer to the pool heater. There was an issue with the time schedule, but it was repaired quickly. Please notify the office of any issues.
- 2 violation notices and 10 courtesy notices were sent out during the month of December.
- There have been some recent personnel changes and we would like to welcome Francesca Lucania as the new CAM for the property. She will be working alongside CAM Sharla Ramrattan.
- Pike Electric is an FPL subcontractor and is currently working on the utility easement in the back of the
 property, replacing the electrical poles. This project will stretch from the storage lot area down Tropical
 Isles Circle on the back side of the property. We have contact information for the Project Manager, so
 please report any questions or complaints to the office.
- Fish and Wildlife Conservation was contacted regarding an alligator located in the Harbor Shoal Lake and we are awaiting the removal.
- We are in the process of receiving additional proposals for the light pole at the entrance.
- We are in the beginning stages of repairing the culvert in the lake.

Reminders as stated in the Co-Op Rules and Regulations:

I. Guests

- A. means a person whose stay in the community at the request of the resident does not exceed fifteen (15) consecutive days or thirty (30) total days per calendar year, unless such person has the written permission of the Board of Directors or unless permitted by a properly promulgated rule or regulation. The spouse of a resident is not considered a guest.
 - 1. For the protection and safety of all residents, guests who stay in the community overnight or more must register their names with the management. Weekend guests must be registered during the weekday office hours prior to their arrival.

B. Utilities

- 1. Any clogging, stoppage or malfunction of the sewer line and the sewer line itself, from the mobile home to the riser, is the responsibility of the resident. If the resident fails or refuses to correct any problems with that portion of the sewer line that is the responsibility of the resident, the Co-Op will have the corrective work done and all charges in connection therewith shall be paid by the resident.
- 2.The water meter is the responsibility of Fort Pierce Utilities Authority. The resident is responsible for the maintenance and replacement of all piping and connections from the output of the water meter up to and including the mobile home.

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
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Valentine's Day occurs every February 14. Across the United States and in other places around the world, candy, flowers and gifts are exchanged between loved ones, all in the name of St. Valentine. But who is this mysterious saint and where did these traditions come from?

Valentine was a popular name in ancient Rome, and there are at least 50 stories of different saints by that name. But Forbes said the earliest surviving accounts of the two February 14 Valentines, written starting in the 500s, have a whole lot in common. Both were said to have healed a child while imprisoned, leading to a household-wide religious conversion, and they were executed on the same day of the year and buried along the same highway.

The historical evidence is so sketchy that it's not clear whether the story started with one saint who then became two or if biographers of one man borrowed details from the other—or if either ever existed at all.

Perhaps more disappointing for the romantics among us, the early accounts of the two Valentines are typical martyrdom stories, stressing the saints' miracles and gruesome deaths but containing not a word about romance.

"They're both mythical to begin with, and the connection with love is even more mythical," says Henry Kelly, a scholar of medieval and renaissance literature and history at UCLA.
