Letter from Outgoing President

I have withdrawn my name from consideration for the 2024 BOD, while having enjoyed, for the most part, my Board tenure. As you know, I was appointed to the Board when only a few volunteered and therefore, no vote needed to be taken. Then, when a President resigned, I was voted to Vice President. Shortly after that, the 2nd President resigned, and I was voted by the BOD to be President. I attempted to do my best, to be as transparent as possible and to follow all the rules and regulations. I am not "The Great I Am" and know that no goal was achievable without the partnership of the other Board members. In departing from my role, I would like to list a few accomplishments of which I am very proud of the Board of which I had the privilege to be a member.

Rules and Regulations: We had begun work on updating the Rules and Regulations but didn't get very far. Residents often inquire about: (1) No smoking being allowed in the enclosed pool area and to enforce similar to 2023 update in Florida statutes; (2) parking at the clubhouse under the overhang, (3) The flag rules need to be updated and reflect the most current Florida laws. We had been advised that this could cost up to \$20,000. We checked this information with our legal firm, and they advised that it should be more like \$5,000.

Moratorium on share sales: I believe we acted too quickly when we imposed this on our residents and feel this should be revisited. I think we need an analysis of the true potential impact future sales would have on our annual budget.

RV Lot: The co-op derives income from 35+ residents who rent slots in the RV lot. When I joined the board, it was a mess, safety being an issue. We have had it cleaned up, new gate locks and cameras installed for surveillance. I think a realtor type lock box would be beneficial for vendors that need to get to the area.

Reserve Study: Universally considered a valuable tool for organizations to maintain property values and the integrity of communities. Our existing study indicates it is time to address our aging electrical pedestals/meters at the recommended rate of 25%/year until all are replaced. I feel strongly that hoping the problem will either not manifest, or that it will go away is not a viable solution. Ignoring this could prove detrimental and more costly in the near future.

Buildable Lots. Each lot represents potential income. During the RFP interviewing process, we became aware of several options and feel this is definitely worth pursuing.

POOL: we have been looking at other pool companies, while trying to also hold the current company responsible for past ineffectiveness.

Diseased Trees: we have worked with Carlos to remove and scheduled to replace some diseased palms.

I want to extend my gratitude to the BOD members with whom I had the privilege to serve. My best wishes for a successful and profitable run for the next Board of Directors!

Valentine's Day is the best-known holiday for romantic love and tokens of affection: flowers, chocolates, and jewelry. But who was Saint Valentine, why is February 14 significant, and what other lore and legends are associated with this heartfelt occasion?

Saint Valentine was indeed a real person, but the details of his life, background, and accomplishments are muddled in centuries of interpretation. There are many origin stories of St. Valentine, but the most detailed account says he was a physician-turned-priest who lived in Rome in the third century, during the reign of Claudius Gothicus (Claudius II). Claudius II was a cruel emperor who outlawed marriage as he believed it interfered with military prowess.

St. Valentine performed secret marriages and was imprisoned for doing so. After some time, he befriended the jailer's daughter, Julia, whom he tutored. He was urged to renounce his faith, but refused, and was sentenced to death. Before his execution, he crushed violets to make purple ink and wrote a letter to Julia. He signed it, "from your Valentine." Thus marked the mystical origin of the first Valentine's Day card. Valentine was martyred on February 14, 270 AD.

According to historians, there are many tales of the same man and it is impossible to tell which details are accurate and which may be exaggerated. In total, more than 50 priests, bishops, and other church officials have taken the name Valentine, and bits and pieces of all their histories may be part of the St. Valentine legend.

(Check washing is a form of check fraud in which a scammer steals a completed, signed check and erases everything but the signature. The scammer then rewrites the check to send money to themselves. The check can be stolen from mailboxes or postboxes, and washed in chemicals or copied or scanned. This scam can cause financial losses to the victims if not detected and corrected.) Try not to send checks through the mail. It will also save you a stamp, which has gotten increasingly expensive. I usually call in my payments or bank online.
