In addition to the normal ongoing property management work:

- Sought quote for an onsite shredding event. Vendor info and quote sent to the board.
- Met with Atlantic Southern paving to get quotes for repairs and reseal.
 - 1. Set up meetings with 2 additional seal coating vendors (DuraSeal and Burton Asphalt) to get competitive bids.
- Arranged for meeting with Fountain Blue Pool company to seek a permanent solution to ongoing pool related issues.
 - 1. Resolved the pool heating issue with Fountain Blue Pools.
 - 2. Working on a long-term issue with their engineering department regarding what needs to be done to resolve ongoing pool issues and reliability.
- Sought and received a proposal for a Commercial Appraisal of the community with Cushman & Wake-field (David Beshears).
 - 1. Conducted an onsite meeting with Richard Mupo on Wednesday, 11.29.23.
 - 2. Responded to all requested information from Mr. Mupo.
- Investigated and listed all realtors in 3 counties (St. Lucie, Indian River and Martin) who hold Mobile Home Brokers licenses. These were required for the RFP being sent to lease the onsite realty office.
- Created and sent October Manager report to board and newsletter.
- The 60 day (First) notice of the Annual meeting was created and mailed to members.


