Report from the Board

The 2023 Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30. We are more than halfway through! We won't jinx us by saying any more than that! We now (finally) have a full seven (7) person board with the addition of James Raimondi. We look forward to working with him. We would also like to thank Thomas Carey, Gary Charles and Eric Lindbloom who volunteered for consideration. A new Keystone CAM, Les Goldman, will be here on Mondays & Wednesdays.

We had a very informative visit by a registered arborist to discuss the diseases affecting our palm trees. We took him on a brief tour to see diseased trees identified by Carlos and to give us any additional advice he might have. Some of the information he shared:

1. Weed whacking is damaging trees. All trees should have a 2-3 ft circle around them that is weed and grass free. Mulch is advisable, but not absolutely necessary.

2. No green fronds should be removed from palm trees as they provide nutrition to the trees. Even if it is partially brown, it should be left until the center stem goes brown.

3. Cutting should only be done once a year.

4. Fruiting stems can be removed at any time as they draw nutrients from the tree.

5. Hurricane cutting is destroying palm trees throughout Florida, making them vulnerable to disease. He said that if hurricane cutting continues in Florida, as has been the practice, in 40-50 years there will be no more palm trees in Florida. It is of great concern to arborists and horticulturists.

6. When a diseased palm tree is removed, no palm tree of any type should ever be planted where it was removed.

7. Removing stumps by grinding is advised. Store in plastic bag for disposal.

We have begun the lengthy process of updating the rules and regulations. If you have any suggestions for changes and/or improvements, please let us know.

Some of you may have noticed the new paint job at the mail center, and Coleen has made new labels to replace the faded ones.

Signage updating throughout the park is continuing. Stop signs have been ordered. Please let us know if we missed any.

Later this month board members and Carlos will be cleaning out the closets in the community center. The walls will be painted, floors cleaned and supplies reorganized. We will be seeking suggestions from committees/clubs that use these spaces for what is needed.

The 2024 budget process is gearing up.

We would like to know if residents would be interested in looking into adding some storage units, near the RV section. If this is something you think you would like, please let Coleen know.

The ice maker appears to be unrepairable because it's too hard to get the part needed. We are looking at other alternatives.

Les will be getting information on replacing the kitchen floor tiles, possibly with non-slip tiles.

Last, but not least, we are planning a Coffee Klatch for all residents, hoping to have it on the morning of Saturday, November 11th, which is also Veterans Day. More information to follow.






PING PONG






All the yarn was donated anonymously by someone in the park. All donations are welcome. If we get donations we will be happy to make shawls and afghans for people in the park.
