

# Rules for Flying the American Flag

- 1. **Positioning**: When displayed vertically or horizontally against a wall, the union (the blue field with stars) should be at the top and to the observer's left. When displayed from a staff, the union should be at the peak.
- 2. **Half-Staff**: The flag should be flown at half-staff to honor deceased officials or military personnel. It should first be raised to the peak and then lowered to half-staff.
- 3. **Time of Display**: The flag should be displayed from sunrise to sunset. *It may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated at night.*
- 4. **Weather Conditions**: The flag should not be displayed during severe weather unless it is an all-weather flag made of durable material.
- 5. **Handling**: The flag should never touch the ground, floor, or water. It should be carried aloft and free, never flat or horizontally.
- 6. **Dipping**: The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing, except in response to a salute from a ship of a foreign nation.
- 7. **Multiple Flags**: When displaying multiple flags, the American flag should always be at the highest point or in the center if on separate poles.
- 8. **Special Occasions**: The flag should be displayed on certain holidays, including Independence Day, Memorial Day, and Flag Day, among others.
- 9. **Disposal**: When the flag is no longer fit for display, it should be disposed of in a dignified manner, typically by burning.

By following these guidelines, individuals and organizations can show proper respect for the American flag, honoring its significance as a symbol of the nation. For more detailed information, you can refer to the U.S. Flag Code and related resources.
