
We heard from a few of you about not receiving the November newsletter on the email. As

I want to remind all of you that on February 1st, 2019, we will be 32 years old. As we do, each year, we celebrate by gathering for the Noon Mass at the Visitation of Our Lady Church, 3500 Ames Blvd. in Marrero. We would like as many of you, as possible, to join us for this solemn event. Wear black and white, if you have it, and ladies, if you have a tie, wear that as well. We have lost several of our active members over the years, but we are still here and we want to make our presence known.

I want to tell you about something I saw on TV recently. I have the Lawrence Welk television program automatically set up to record on my TV. Last week, I watched their Christmas program from 1966 which aired December 22nd on Public Television, Channel 12 locally. The show was beautiful, filled with all the Christmas songs. What touched me the most was when Natalie Nevens sang the "Ave Maria" so beautifully. When she got to the name of JESUS, in Latin, she bowed her head. Well, she gave it away, she had to be Catholic, cause only Catholics do that. I didn't delete the show, when it got to the end. I was so proud of her for bowing her head at the Name of Jesus on national television.

entry on St. John the Baptist, "as the presence of any sin whatever is incompatible with the indwelling of the Holy Ghost in the soul, it follows that at this moment John was cleansed from the stain of original sin." (Formore on John's cleansing from Original Sin, see Who Was Born Without Original Sin?)

Elizabeth, too, is filled with joy, and cries out in words that would become part of the Hail Mary, "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb," before acknowledging her cousin as "the mother of my Lord" (Lk 1:42-43). Mary responds with the Magnificat (Lk 1:46-55), a canticle or biblical hymn that has become an essential part of the Church's evening prayer (vespers). It is a beautiful hymn of thanksgiving, glorifying God for choosing her to be the mother of His Son, as well as for His mercy "from generation until generations, to them that fear Him."

History of the Feast of the Visitation of the B.V.M.

The Visitation is only mentioned in Luke's Gospel, and Luke tells us that Mary stayed with her cousin about three months, before returning home just before Elizabeth gave birth. Gabriel, as we have seen, told Mary at the Annunciation that Elizabeth was six months' pregnant, and Luke seems to indicate that the Blessed Virgin departed for Elizabeth's home very soon after the Annunciation. Thus, we celebrate the Annunciation on March 25 and the Birth of St. John the Baptist on June 24, about three months apart. Yet we celebrate the Visitation on May 31st. Why?

While many Marian feasts are among the first feasts to have been celebrated universally by the Church, East and West, the celebration of the Visita-

**The Visitation of Our Lady**



The feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the visit of the Mother of God, with the child Jesus in her womb, to her cousin Elizabeth, who was herself six months'

pregnant with the forerunner of Christ, St. John the Baptist. At the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel, in response to Mary's question "How shall this be done, because I know not man?" (Lk 1:34), had told her that "thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age; and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren: Because no word shall be impossible with God" (Lk 1:27-36). The evidence of Elizabeth's own near-miraculous conception had called forth Mary's fiat: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to thy word." It is thus appropriate that the very next action that St. Luke the Evangelist records is the Blessed Virgin "making haste" to visit her cousin.

and Elizabeth, Mary greets her cousin, and something wonderful happens: John the Baptist leaps in Elizabeth's womb (Lk 1:41). As the Catholic Encyclopedia of 1913 puts it in its entry on the Visitation, Mary's "presence and much more the presence of the Divine Child in her womb, according to the will of God, was to be the source of very great grace to the Blessed John, Christ's Forerunner." John's leap was no ordinary movement of an unborn child, for as Elizabeth tells Mary, "as soon as the voice of thy salutation sounded in my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy" (Lk 1:44).

His joy, the Church has held from the time of the early Church Fathers, came from his cleansing at that moment of Original Sin, in accordance with the angel Gabriel's prophecy to Zachary, before John's conception, that "he shall be filled with the Holy Ghost, even from his mother's womb" (Lk 1:15). tion, even though it is found in Luke's Gospel, is a relatively late development. It was championed by St. Bonaventure, and adopted by the Franciscans in 1263. When it was extended to the universal Church by Pope Urban VI in 1389, the date of the feast was set as July 2nd, the day after the octave (eighth) day of the feast of the Birth of St. John the Baptist. The idea was to tie the celebration of the Visitation, at which St. John had been cleansed of Original Sin, to the celebration of his birth, even

though the placement of the feast in the liturgical calendar was out of sync with the account given by Luke. In other words, symbolism, rather than chronology, was the deciding factor.

For close to six centuries, the Visitation was celebrated on July 2, but with his revision of the Roman calendar in 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the celebration to the last day of the Marian month of May so that it would fall between the feasts of the Annunciation and the Birth of St. John the Baptist.

A Daily Eucharist Reflection – Dec. 10, 2018  
- Bread of Life -

In the Old Testament, the Messiah was announced as the "Prince of Peace" (Is 9:5). His birth was proclaimed as the new era of peace "to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Lk 1:79). Jesus Himself established His kingdom as a reign of peace. "Peace is my farewell to you, My peace is My gift to you" (Jn 14:27). After His resurrection, His first greeting was, "Peace be with you." Through the Eucharistic celebration, Jesus continued His work of establishing and implementing His peace in our hearts. Peace comes into our hearts only through our personal intimate relationship with Jesus. At Mass this relationship is deepened and enriched. At Mass the entire Body of Christ comes together to pray for peace. As His family we pray, "Lord, may this sacrifice, which has made our peace with You, advance the peace and salvation of all the world" (Eucharistic Prayer III). Later we pray for

peace as a healing balm: "Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day." As we become more and more aware of the indwelling of the risen Jesus within us, we are more and more at peace. How appropriately the Church incorporates her prayer for peace just before Holy Communion, when Jesus comes to us to augment our peace by His very presence. "Lord Jesus Christ, You said to Your Apostles: I leave you peace, My peace I give you. Look not on our sins, but on the faith of Your Church and grant us the peace and unity of Your kingdom where You live forever and ever. Amen."

Part 36 CHAPTER THREE

**THE PROCLAMATION OF THE GOSPEL**  
Culture, thought and education Continued  
133. It is not enough that evangelizers be concerned to reach each person, or that the Gospel be proclaimed to the culture as a whole. At theology – and not simply a pastoral theology – which is in dialogue with other sciences and human experiences is most important for our discernment on how best to bring the Gospel message to different cultural contexts and groups. The Church, in her commitment to evangelization, appreciates and encourages the charism of theologians and their scholarly effort to advance dialogue with the world of cultures and sciences. I call on theologians to carry out this service as part of the Church's saving mission. In doing so, however, they must always remember that the Church and theology exist to evangelize, and not be content with a desk-bound theology.

134. Universities are outstanding environments for articulating and developing these evangelizing commitment in an interdisciplinary and integrated way. Catholic schools, which always strive to join their work of education with the explicit

proclamation of the Gospel, are a most valuable resource for the evangelization of culture, even in those countries and cities where hostile situations challenge us to greater creativity in our search for suitable methods.

II. The homily  
135. Let us now look at preaching within the liturgy, which calls for serious consideration by pastors. I will dwell in particular, and even somewhat meticulously, on the homily and its preparation, since so many concerns have been expressed about this important ministry, and we cannot simply ignore them. The homily is the touchstone for judging a pastor's closeness and ability to communicate to his people. We know that the faithful attach great importance to it, and that both they and their ordained ministers suffer because of homilies: the laity from having to listen to them and the clergy from having to preach them! It is sad that this is the case. The homily can actually be an intense and happy experience of the Spirit, a consoling encounter with God's word, a constant source of renewal and growth.

136. Let us renew our confidence in preaching, based on the conviction that it is God who seeks to reach out to others through the preacher, and that he displays his power through human words. Saint Paul speaks forcefully about the need to preach, since the Lord desires to reach other people by means of our word (cf. Rom 10:14-17). By his words our Lord won over the hearts of the people; they came to hear him from all parts (cf. Mk 1:45); they were amazed at his teachings (cf. Mk 6:2), and they sensed that he spoke to them as one with authority (cf. Mk 1:27). By their words the apostles, whom Christ established "to be with him and to be sent out to preach" (Mk 3:14), brought all nations to the bosom of the Church (cf. Mt 16:15-20).

The liturgical context  
137. It is worthy remembering that "the liturgical

proclamation of the word of God, especially in the eucharistic assembly, is not so much a time for meditation and catechesis as a dialogue between God and his people, a dialogue in which the great deeds of salvation are proclaimed and the demands of the covenant are continually restated." The homily has special importance due to its eucharistic context: it surpasses all forms of catechesis as the supreme moment in the dialogue between God and his people which lead up to sacramental communion. The homily takes upon it more the dialogue which the Lord has already established with his people. The preacher must know the heart of his community, in order to realize where its desire for God is alive and ardent, as well as where that dialogue, once loving, has been thwarted and is now barren.

138. The homily cannot be a form of entertainment like those presented by the media, yet it does need to give life and meaning to the celebration. It is a distinctive genre, since it is preaching situated within the framework of a liturgical celebration; hence it should be brief and avoid taking on the semblance of a speech or a lecture. A preacher may be able to hold the attention of his listeners for a whole hour, but in this case his words become more important than the celebration of faith. If the homily goes on too long, it will affect two characteristic elements of the liturgical celebration: its balance and its rhythm. When preaching takes place within the context of the liturgy, it is part of the offering made to the Father and a mediation of the grace which Christ pours out during the celebration. This context demands that preaching should guide the assembly, and the preacher, to a life-changing communion with Christ in the Eucharist. This means that the words of the preacher must be measured, so that the Lord, more than his minister, will be the centre of attention.



The testimonies contained in this article are miracles that were recently recorded at St.

Maron's Monastery in Annaya, Lebanon where St. Sharbel lived, died, and is buried.

The first of two testimonies is from the father of a seven month old baby boy named Georgio.

The father states that on October 10, 2018, Georgio was admitted to the hospital after he suffered from high temperatures for three consecutive days. Diagnostic tests were run to discover the cause of his fever. The baby was diagnosed with a congenital defect of his urethra which caused the urine to back up into his left kidney. Georgio was treated for three days in the hospital and was discharged to his

home with treatment to continue for another ten days with instruction to have a cystoscopy on the ninth day.

Upon discharge from the hospital, the family went to Annaya to visit St. Sharbel. The mother kneeled in front of St. Sharbel holding her little boy in her hands and offering him to St. Sharbel and asking his intercession before the Lord to grant her child the grace of healing.

On the ninth day after his hospital discharge, and as instructed, a cystoscopy was performed which showed no sign of any congenital defect as seen on the previous test. The treating pediatrician consulted with a pediatric urologist who insisted on running a scintigraphy test to further evaluate the boy's condition. This test also showed no congenital defect as previously seen.

The family took Georgio and returned to Annaya to visit St. Sharbel and to thank him for the grace of the child's healing. The miracle was registered on November 4, 2018.

The Second testimony regards a Muslim baby girl, named Nivine Hussein Meqdad. The baby's mother is a Muslim Iraqi woman who lives in Lebanon. The mother states that she gave birth to her little girl, Nivine, on October 21, 2018 at a community hospital. One day after the baby was

born, the child became unresponsive, turned blue, and the doctor pronounced her dead. Once the mother was informed she started crying and screaming out loud in grief for her baby girl. Another patient, a woman who happened to be a Christian, saw and heard her. The Christian woman approached her and told her to pray to St. Sharbel and ask his intercession to bring back her little girl. The mother states that she never in her life heard of St. Sharbel and knew nothing about him, yet she faithfully prayed and asked his intercession. He answered her prayers and brought her baby back to life to the astonishment of all!


The Muslim woman went with her family to visit Annaya and to thank St. Sharbel for the grace of healing her child. The miracle was registered on November 10, 2018.

This time I was going to baby-sit the new baby for a week, while my daughter, who teaches children with autism, finished out the school year. Something inside of me kept telling me to bring a print of Our Lady of Compassionate Protection with me for their home. I was really pushed to do this.

I arrived there Sunday evening right before supper. When we were finished eating, it was

time for Thomas to go to bed. I noticed that he was never ready to go to bed. He gave a lot of trouble to his mom and dad, who took turns reading him stories and showing him picture books to calm him down. It seemed like forever before he would give in.

I took out the picture I brought and placed it on a stuffed Teddy bear which sat on a rock in Thomas' room, where he could get used to seeing it. My daughter had not decided just where, in his room, she was going to hang it. Wednesday, May 15th, at 10:00 a.m., my son-in-law, who is an architect, walked through the room where I was feeding the baby saying, "I don't know about this 'being in business for yourself' stuff, I'm going to have to look for a job." I asked him what he meant by that and he answered, "I haven't received any 'call backs' on the many proposals I'd submitted." When I asked how long he had been working for himself he said, "Since January." "Son, I know what you need to do, but you're going to laugh at me," I said. "No, I won't," he answered. "You have to pray. You saw the picture I put on the rocker in Thomas' room, go get it and put it in your office." Tom brought the picture in and placed it to the right over his desk. "Look up at her several times during the day and say a prayer for your business."

When I finished feeding Jack and he went to sleep, I put him down in the portable bed. I went into the dining room, took a chair and brought it into Tom's office. I sat down with my Rosary in my hand and I told Tom, "I'm going to sit here and pray the Rosary for your business, silently, so I do not disturb you." When I finished, I picked up the chair and replaced it in the dining room. The picture went back into Thomas' room when he went to bed.

The next morning, Thursday, about the same


