Sister Dede Byrne's Speech AT RNC

Good evening. I am Sister Dede Byrne, and I belong to the Community of the Little Workers of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

Last Fourth of July, I was honored to be one of the president's guests at his Salute to America celebration. I must confess that I recently prayed while in chapel, begging God to allow me to be a voice, an instrument for human life. And now here I am, speaking at the Republican National Convention. I guess you'd better be careful what you pray for.

My journey to religious life was not a traditional route, if there is such a thing. In 1978, as a medical school student at Georgetown University, I joined the Army to help pay for my tuition, and ended up devoting 29 years to the military, serving as a doctor and a surgeon in places like Afghanistan and Egypt's Sinai Peninsula. After much prayer and contemplation, I entered my religious order in 2002, working to serve the poor and the sick in Haiti, Sudan, Kenya, Iraq and in Washington, D.C.

Humility is at the foundation of our order, which makes it very difficult to talk about myself. But I can speak about my experience working for those fleeing war-torn and impoverished countries all around the world. Those refugees all share a common experience. They have all been marginalized, viewed as insignificant, powerless and voiceless.

And while we tend to think of the marginalized as living beyond our borders, the truth is the largest marginalized group in the world can be found here in the United States. They are the unborn.

As Christians, we first met Jesus as a stirring embryo in the womb of an unwed mother and saw him born nine months later in the poverty of the cave. It is no coincidence that Jesus stood up for what was just and was ultimately crucified because what he said was not politically correct or fashionable. As followers of Christ, we are called to stand up for life against the politically correct or fashionable of today.

We must fight against a legislative agenda that supports and even celebrates destroying life in the womb. Keep in mind, the laws we create define how we see our humanity. We must ask ourselves: What we are saying when we go into a womb and snuff out an innocent, powerless, voiceless life?

As a physician, I can say without hesitation: Life begins at conception. While what I have to say may be difficult for some to hear, I am saying it because I am not just pro-life, I am pro-eternal life. I want all of us to end up in heaven together someday.

CHAPTER THREE THE PROCLAMATION OF THE GOSPEL

183. Consequently, no one can demand that religion should be relegated to the inner sanctum of personal life, without influence on societal and national life. without concern for the soundness of civil institutions, without a right to offer an opinion on events affecting society. Who would claim to lock up in a church and silence the message of St. Francis of Assisi or Blessed Teresa of Calcutta? They themselves would have found this unacceptable. An authentic faith – which is never comfortable or completely personal – always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better that we found it. We love this magnificent planet on which God has put us, and we love the human family which dwells here, with all its tragedies and struggles, its hopes and aspirations, its strengths and weaknesses. The earth is our common home and all of us are brothers and sisters. If indeed "the just ordering of society and of the state is a central responsibility of politics", the Church "cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice".[150]All Christians, their pastors included, are called to show concern for the building of a better world. This is essential, for the Church's social thought is primarily positive: it offers proposals, it works for change and in this sense it constantly points to the hope born of the loving heart of Jesus Christ. At the same time, it unites "its own commitment to that made in the social field by other Churches and Ecclesial Communities, whether at the level of doctrinal reflection or at the practical level".[151]

184. This is not the time or the place to examine in detail the many grave social questions affecting today's world, some of which I have dealt with in the second chapter. This Exhortation is not a social document, and for reflection on those different themes we have a most suit-

able tool in the Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, whose use and study I heartily recommend. Furthermore, neither the Pope nor the Church have a monopoly on the interpretation of social realities or the proposal of solutions to contemporary problems. Here I can repeat the insightful observation of Pope Paul VI: "In the face of such widely varying situations, it is difficult for us to utter a unified message and to put forward a solution which has universal validity. This is not our ambition, nor is it our mission. It is up to the Christian communities to analyze with objectivity the situation which is proper to their own country".[152]

185. In what follows I intend to concentrate on two great issues which strike me as fundamental at this time in history. I will treat them more fully because I believe that they will shape the future of humanity. These issues are first, the inclusion of the poor in society, and second, peace and social dialogue.

II. The inclusion of the poor in society 186. Our faith in Christ, who became poor, and was always close to the poor and the outcast, is the basis of our concern for the integral development of society's most neglected members.

In union with God, we hear a plea 187. Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of society. This demands that we be docile and attentive to the cry of the poor and to come to their aid. A mere glance at the Scriptures is enough to make us see how our gracious Father wants to hear the cry of the poor: "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them... so I will send you..." (Ex 3:7-8, 10). We also see how he is concerned for their needs: "When the Israelites cried out to the Lord, the Lord raised up for them a deliverer" (Jq 3:15). If we, who are God's means of hearing the poor, turn deaf ears to this plea, we oppose the Father's will and his plan; that poor person "might cry to the Lord against you, and you would incur guilt" (Dt 15:9). A lack of solidarity towards his or her needs will directly affect our relationship with God: "For if in bitterness of soul he calls down a curse upon you, his Creator will hear his prayer" (Sir 4:6). The old question always returns: "How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods, and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?" (1 Jn 3:17). Let us recall also how bluntly the apostle James speaks of the cry of the oppressed: "The wages of the labourers who mowed your fields, which

you kept back by fraud, cry out, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts" (5:4).

188. The Church has realized that the need to heed this plea is itself born of the liberating action of grace within each of us, and thus it is not a question of a mission reserved only to a few: "The Church, guided by the Gospel of mercy and by love for mankind, hears the cry for justice and intends to respond to it with all her might".[153] In this context we can understand Jesus' command to his disciples: "You yourselves give them something to eat!" (Mk 6:37): it means working to eliminate the structural causes of poverty and to promote the integral development of the poor, as well as small daily acts of solidarity in meeting the real needs which we encounter. The word "solidarity" is a little worn and at times poorly understood, but it refers to something more than a few sporadic acts of generosity. It presumes the creation of a new mindset which thinks in terms of community and the priority of the life of all over the appropriation of goods by a few. Part 48 Next Month

From an early age Father Charbel felt the call to greater solitude. He sought permission many times from his superior to move to a nearby hermitage. But Father Charbel was very useful to the community. His superior did not want to give permission, and so continued to delay Charbel's request.

After serving for 16 years as a priest in the monastery, divine intervention would obtain the desired permission for him. Again Father Charbel asked his superior for permission to become a hermit. His superior again deferred, asking Father Charbel to study a matter of some urgency. His superior gave him permission to stay up past the usual hour to finish the task.

Father Charbel went to the kitchen of the monastery to acquire oil for his lamp. The servant, wanting to mock this sacral monk, filled the lamp with water. Father Charbel, absorbed in devout contemplation, did not perceive the prank and returned to his cell. Immediately Father Charbel returned to his prayers, and lit the water-filled lamp with ease. The servant, looking on, watched in awe as he saw the holy monk miraculously burning water. He called the superior of the monastery. The abbot stared wide-eyed at the bright lamp burning water for fuel, and could only exclaim, "Father Charbel, pray for me!"

Word of this miracle reached the Superior Sacred Host General of the Maronite Order. He days later o authorized Father Charbel to take up into eternity.

residence at the hermitage of Saints Peter and Paul close to the monastery.

From 1875 to his death, Father Charbel lived the secluded life of a hermit. He always held himself to the strictest discipline and would undergo strict penances and fasting. At over 5,000 feet above sea level, the hermitage provided little shelter from the harsh winter or the heat of summer. Father Charbel kept a hairshirt hidden beneath his habit. With little food and deprived of every comfort, Father Charbel was the happiest man on earth. Our Lord Jesus Christ became his strength and his joy, his only reason for being.

Father Charbel daily offered Holy Mass in the seclusion of his hermitage. He would spend hours afterward in thanksgiving. For 23 years, his offering the Divine Liturgy in the sacred mountain hermitage called down the blessings of heaven on him, his country, the Church and the world. Those who assisted always said the same about him: his voice was low, but his face shone with an interior joy. His deep union with His Divine Master radiated in every word and action.

Father Charbel's obedience became legendary, his angelic chastity encompassing his whole being, and his poverty going to extremes not reached by many other saints.

In December of 1898 while offering Holy Mass, Father Charbel suffered a stroke. The servant assissting him had to pry the Sacred Host from his hands. Just seven days later on Christmas Eve, he passed into eternity.

A LIGHT FROM THE MOUNTAINS

Following the funeral rites, Charbel's fellow monks carried his body to his tomb. As was the custom, his body was placed in a tomb in the monastery cemetery with no embalming and no coffin. For the last time Father Charbel was clothed in his monastic habit. The heavy snows of winter made the burial difficult for his brother monks.

The holy hermit thus lay forgotten by the world. But God's eyes were ever on His servant.

A short time after his burial, his fellow monks and nearby villagers noticed an extraordinary light coming from his tomb. The light shone for 45 days, and word quickly spread near and far. The monks soon sought ecclesiastical permission to exhume the body. This was done in the spring of 1899, four months after Charbel's death.

Frequent rains had flooded the cemetery several times, but the body was found completely incorrupt. The newly-opened tomb revealed the peaceful remains of Father Charbel floating on mud in a flooded grave.

The monks of Annaya carefully cleansed and reclothed the body which remained flexible with no signs of decay. Father Charbel's remains were transferred to a wooden coffin, this time in a corner of a private chapel in the monastery.

Another unusual occurrance came with exhuming Father Charbel's body. A liquid described as a mixture of sweat and blood issued from the body's pores. As a result, the bloodstained clothing on the relics of this holy hermit needed to be changed twice a week. Pieces of cloth soaked in this liquid were given to those who approached Father Charbel with their petitiions. News spread of numberous cures and healings.



The testimony in the following miracle involves miracle after St. Sharbel Feast Day

Mrs. Marilyn Joseph Fakhoury was born in Zahle in 1959, married to Antoine Michel Khairallah and they

have one son. She tells about her health condition. "In June, I felt an ache in my stomach, and I went to St George Hospital in Beirut to seek a consultation with Dr. Salem Khoury. He put me on a gastroscope and took a biopsy. He found that I had stomach bacteria with cancer." So I had anti-bacteria treatments for 14 days to get rid of it. After five months, I underwent another biopsy, and the bacteria had disappeared completely from my stomach, but the cancer was still there. I prayed a lot to Saint Sharbel asking for his intercession with the Lord Jesus Christ. My only medication in this difficult stage was Saint Sharbel's oil, so I used that and applied it daily on my stomach. After six months, I underwent a biopsy on May 7, 2019, and it was found that the cancer decreased from stage five to stage one. On May 5, 2020, I underwent another transplant biopsy and they found I was completely recovered from cancer. "I went with my husband to the Monastery of Saint Sharbel. We thanked him and recorded the miracle with the entire medical report on June 18, 2020.

Second Miracle: Regarding a brain Surgery where St Sharbel operated on woman called Valerie Khoury. The final MRI a cross appeared in place of the tumor...

On November 19, 2016, while teaching dance classes, Valérie suddenly lost consciousness. She was urgently transported to Notre Dame hospital in Lebanon where Dr. Georges Hanna diagnosed her. After being examined, she was diagnosed with epileptic seizures and a neurological brain disease, an arteriotic malformation.

Dr. Hanna sent her to the hospital of the Sacred Heart of Jesus for further examination by Dr. Gh. Abi Chedid. The latter performed brain arteriography and detected an anomaly that is located at the seat of language in the brain. He then ruled out any surgery due to the major risks Valérie may suffer and instead requires her to have adapted treatment while asking her to live a calm life and avoid stress. At this point, the Doctor's Committee recommended the exams be repeated every six months.

In May 2020 Valérie felt very bad and had difficulties talking and some general discomfort. She was depressed and was taken to the hospital. Her doctor decided to increase her dose of treatment. However, he decided to perform an MRI, but Valerie refused because she was scared of it...

Valérie's mom has a great devotion to St Charbel. Valérie entrusted herself to the sacred heart of Jesus and swallowed a pinch of dirt taken from St Charbel's grave and anointed her head with St Sharbel's oil. She begged him to intercede with the Lord to heal her.

That same night St Sharbel operated on her in her sleep. Valérie woke up with a hematoma in her head and lost consciousness. Transported to Notre Dame hospital of Lebanon, Dr. G. Hanna put her through an MRI as agreed before. Amazed to see that Valérie is no longer showing signs of the anomaly (The MRI showed normal brain activity and a cross appeared in place of the tumor)So he sent her to another Hospital for a second opinion. Arriving there, Dr Abi Rached, renewed the exams and performed a new arteriography. Amazed and without being able to explain it medically, he observed that Valérie's anomaly has actually faded and was cured.

He then performed an encephalogram and found that the epileptic anomaly had also completely disappeared. He then looked at her saying: "your healing is the result of a higher power." And for the first time he revealed to her saying: "You had like a "bomb" in your head".

Through the prayer of her family, and friends Valérie regained health and a normal life. With them all, she went to the Monastery of St Sharbel to thank him and deposited her medical record and recorded this beautiful grace on

June 18, 2020.
