



UPDATE: FROM A READER of Fr. Dwight Longenecker

In the mid 1970's, my wife and I lived in Jerusalem for two years as missionaries with the Southern Baptist Convention. One day we were at College des Freres high school when school was letting out. I was moderating the photo club so I was around the school a couple of times a week. Mary came over and we were going to walk around the Old City where the school is located. The headmaster Frere Noel saw my brother Ed, another friend and Mary and me and asked us to come into his office. It was probably January as he'd recently gone home to Lebanon for Christmas. He said that something special had happened shortly before he went home in a nearby village. A young crippled boy went to daily Mass with his mother. The father was no longer living. After every Mass, she would stay inside to pray and the boy would roll outside (a wheelchair or some device) and sit on the church steps with a cup for money. A man came up to him and asked him what tithe he and his mother had given that month. The boy told him that they had been unable to give anything. The man told him to stand up and go around the side of the church and get his tithe. The boy explained the obvious, that he couldn't get up. The man insisted and the boy managed to stand and take a step and another until, much to his surprise he was walking. He went around

Healing Testimony of Veronique Michel Fghali Mrs. Veronique Michel Fghali, born in Bsous Lebanon, is married to Mr. Pierre Boulos Charfan from Qartaba. She is a teacher residing in Bayyada, Metn, Lebanon. Here is her account of her husband's health condition, which his medical reports support: "Due to a family history of cancer, I noticed an unusual sign in my chest. After conducting the necessary tests, it was confirmed to be malignant. I underwent surgery to remove the tumor on December 19, 2016, and the doctor recommended 20 chemotherapy sessions. I was terrified of chemotherapy, and since it was near Christmas, I knelt before Baby Jesus, repeating 'You said, take this cup away from me, but not my will, but Yours.' I was disheartened. A man named Sharbel, whom I didn't know, entered my home and handed me a gift. It was a belt of St. Sharbel I immediately tied it around my waist and said, 'St. Sharbel, if chemotherapy is canceled, I will never remove this belt. I went to my doctor, who, after laboratory tests, called me with the good news that treatment was unnecessary. To be certain, he sent a test to the U.S. After 15 days, the results showed that the risk increase with treatment was 11%, and without treatment, it was 10%. The doctor was amazed and told me, 'You got away with it.' However, he insisted I undergo radiation therapy. When I went for my MRI appointment, prayed to St. Sharbel, asking that the radiation machine malfunction if my healing was divine On the scheduled day, the hospital staff called to cancel due to a malfunctioning machine. This happened several times, so I visited St. Sharbel and St. Rafga, and afterward, I informed my doctor that I would not proceed with radiation therapy Strangely, he did not object and asked me to follow up in six months. My tests have remained clean and excellent since. I came to thank St. Sharbel for hearing my prayers and interceding for me and I registered the miracle on August 27, 2023 after seven years of healing. Thanks be to the heavenly doctor, St. Sharbel.

It was a picture of Saint Sharbel and the boy told his mother that was the man who'd told him to walk and where to get their tithe.

Fear can be a most powerful imprisoning force. Like the apostles who locked themselves behind closed doors after the resurrection for fear of the local leaders, there are times when our own fears lock us out of the future and into our past.

We find ourselves choosing not to be generous for fear that if we are, we will find ourselves empty-handed with no one to care for us because all or our resources have been used up. And so, because of fear, we lock ourselves into our own selfishness. At other times, we hesitate to be kind for fear that our care will be misconstrued or, worse, will be taken advantage of and abused. And so, for fear of continual demands upon our kindness, we lock ourselves into indifference. At other times, we find ourselves too cautious to speak out in the face of injustice because of a misguided respect for "someone else's business" or because we are afraid anger or rejection will come down upon us. So, we lock ourselves into silence.

It is always the Spirit, however, that enables us to unlock those doors once locked by our fear. While that new power enables us to venture into a sometimes-shattering world, it does not promise we won't be shattered in the process. All that Jesus promised is that the Spirit would bring us peace. Such peace happens to us whenever we choose not to succumb to our fears. It is indeed a new creation taking place in us, even now.

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
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
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
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
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The last two remedies: the Holy Rosary and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Here are extracts from an interview Sister Lucia of Fatima (one of the three children to whom the Virgin Mary appeared in Portugal in 1917) gave to Father Augustin Fuentes in 1957:

"Father, the Blessed Virgin did not tell me that we are in the last times of the world, but I understood this for three reasons:

"The first is because she told me that the Devil is engaging in a battle with the Virgin, a decisive battle. It is a final battle where one party will be victorious and the other will suffer defeat. So, from now on, we are either with God or we are with the Devil; there is no middle ground.

"The second reason is because she told me, as well as my cousins, that God is giving two last remedies to the world: the Holy Rosary and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. And, being the last remedies, that is to say, they are the final ones, means that there will be no others.

"And the third, because in the plans of the Divine Providence, when God is going to chastise the world. He always first exhausts all other remedies. When He sees that the world pays no attention whatsoever, then, as we say in our imperfect way of talking, with a certain fear He presents us the last means of salvation: His Blessed Mother.

"If we despise and reject this last means, Heaven will no longer pardon us, because we will have committed a sin that the Gospel calls a sin against the Holy Spirit. This sin consists in openly rejecting — with full knowledge and will — the salvation that is put in our hands.

"Also, since Our Lord is a very good Son, He will not permit that we offend and despise His Blessed Mother. We have, as obvious testimony, the history of different centuries where Our Lord has shown us, with terrible examples, how He has always defended the honor of His Blessed Mother.

"Prayer and sacrifice are the two means to save the world. As for the Holy Rosary, Father, in these last times in which we are living, the Blessed Virgin has given a new efficacy to the praying of the Holy Rosary. This in such a way that there is no problem that cannot be resolved by praying the Rosary, no matter how difficult it is—be it temporal or above all spiritual — in the spiritual life of each of us or the lives of our families, be they our families in the world or Religious Communities, or even in the lives of peoples and nations.

"I repeat, there is no problem, as difficult as it may be, that we cannot resolve at this time by praying the Holy Rosary. With the Holy Rosary, we will save ourselves, sanctify ourselves, console Our Lord, and obtain the salvation of many souls.

"Then, there is devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our Most Holy Mother, holding her as the seat of mercy, goodness and pardon, and the sure door to enter Heaven."

I fell into bed exhausted after an especially long day. My mind focused on an approaching deadline for a project I'd only half-finished.

Maybe our souls crave a deep rest that can only come from a relationship with Jesus. He loves us more than we can comprehend (John 3:16). Jesus wants to help when we feel stressed out or burned out (1 Peter 5:7). Once we learn to depend on His power, we can turn anything that weighs on our mind over to Him - and settle down in the restorative rest of His presence.

This saint's early life started out a bit rocky as well. Let's just say he didn't exactly feel the love early on for the Church that eventually made him a saint.

Peregrine Laziosi was born in Forli, Italy, in 1260. He was the only son to affluent parents. This was a turbulent time in Italy for the Catholic Church, Forli, which was in northern Italy, was part of the Papal States. Residents in these states chose sides, either the anti-papal faction or the pro-Church faction, sometimes switching sides when it suited them.

Peregrine's family chose the anti-papal side, and he became involved in the faction's activities as a young man. When Pope Martin IV placed the area under an interdict, closing the churches in an attempt to bring the people to their senses, the forces against him rose up all the more.

Attempting a different method with the faithful in Forli, the pope sent as his personal ambassador a future saint, Philip Benizi, to the town to try to bring the rebels back to obedience to the Church and the pope. Benizi would have an uphill climb to say the least.

While addressing a crowd one day, Benizi was attacked. The crowd heckled him, beat him with clubs, and threw rocks at him. Peregrine joined in the fray, punching Benizi in the face so hard he knocked the poor priest down. He immediately regretted it.

Can you picture a scene like this today? With our country so divided over politics, it's not hard to envision. We might not punch someone from the opposing side, but we often say things we later regret. Or maybe we are so sure we're in went to the chapter room of the Servite house the right, the regret never comes.

As you can see, even future saints struggle with controlling their emotions and the desire to be on the right side of a fight. Usually being right is much less important than showing love and respect to others. It's even possible to be both right and respectful. With God's grace to help us, we can engage the opposition in a

manner that honors who we are as children of God.

After the blow he dealt Benizi, Peregrine threw himself at his feet and begged his forgiveness. The good priest smiled and forgave him without hesitation. It became a turning point in Peregrine's life.

He converted to Catholicism and took Benizi's suggestion to pray in the chapel at the cathedral. To his surprise, the Blessed Mother visited him in a vision, telling him to there that Benizi had founded. He followed

> In those years, Servites were known for performing acts of physical penance as a devotional practice. Peregrine imposed on himself the penance of standing whenever it wasn't necessary to sit. He developed varicose veins in his legs after many years of standing. This lead to one of his legs becoming ulcerated, gangrenous and malignant.

> The doctor told Peregrine that to try to save his life, they would have to amputate his leg. In those days, surgery was often as dangerous as the problem it tried to fix. Peregrine knew his life was precariously balanced between two terrible options that would likely mean his death.

> If you're like me, we often don't think about the real emotions of people who lived hundreds of years ago. We tend to see them as two dimensional. But Peregrine would have had the same emotions and fears we have now when a grim diagnoses is given.

> I've had quite a few people close to me fight a heated battle against cancer. Some have beat it, others have not. Some are still in the process of fighting it. The suffering they experience is still a mystery to me and probably colors my vision when it comes to God. Anger and confusion as to why these things happen always break into my thoughts.

> Peregrine surely felt all those things when his own life hung in the balance. Instead of staying angry with God, he turned to him for help.

> The night before his surgery, Peregrine where he lived and prayed before the fresco of the Crucified Christ. He was eventually so exhausted he fell asleep at the foot of the cross. While he slept, he dreamt that Jesus came down from the cross and touched his leg.

When he woke in the morning, the cancer was completely gone. His leg had been miraculously healed.

You might be wondering what exactly Peregrine prayed for at the foot of the cross. It is said he prayed for God to heal him, if it was his will. His surrender to the will of God was remarkable, even in the face of death.

Can we do that? It's a difficult task, but our Lord does ask us to surrender to his will, just as Jesus did in the Garden of Gethsemane. We can ask God for the grace to do this in our own lives. He is never stingy with

Even with these graces, sometimes answered the way we would like. Our limited human understanding of God's bigger picture keeps us from seeing how our circumstances fit into that picture. Don't let that lead you into despair.

Our role in the fight is not small, regardless of how our prayers are answered. We can help those fighting cancer to find grace and peace along the way. And we can find it for ourselves. God is waiting for us to ask him for it.

I have no magic bullet for the cancer and suffering question. I'm not even qualified to try to begin to answer it. All I know to do is pray like your life depends on it. Miracles still happen, and that's all we can hope for. But hope we will because we have a God who loves us.

The miraculous healing of Peregrine spread far and wide over the years. After many more years of serving the sick and poor, he died from a fever on May 1, 1345, at 85. St. Peregrine was declared blessed by Pope Paul V in 1609, and he was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726. He is the patron saint of those suffering with cancer, AIDS and other malignant diseases.


