NRN – Nepali Diaspora Skills Directory

The first conference of Non Resident Nepalis (NRN) held in October 2003 at Kathmandu recognized that Nepal's over-dependence on foreign expatriates (people of non-Nepali origin) to plan and implement projects in Nepal can be supplanted by NRNs. The engagement of NRNs would not only reduce project costs and enhance the effectiveness of skill transfer program, but would also motivate further capital investment from NRNs.

Bikash Bahadur (not real name) is a civil engineer working in Canada. For over 25 years he has worked on major tunnel and dam projects in many countries. Like every Nepali expatriate scattered around the world, a big chunk of Bikash's heart belongs to Nepal; his love for his motherland is immense and his longing to contribute towards Nepal's and Nepalis' well being is unrelenting.

Meanwhile in Kathmandu last year, a group was having a meeting about an irrigation project about to be undertaken in Rautahat. They were having problem locating an independent expert who could do value engineering on the contractor's proposal. The group desperately needed access to some sort of a contact mechanism whereby they could search for such an expert.

At almost every corner of world, one is likely to find NRNs engaged in various skilled professions, however with the exception of word-of-mouth or personal contact, currently there is no means to list and/or search such skills. Like Bikash Bahadur, there are many Nepalis abroad who wish to come to Nepal and get involved in a project where their expertise and knowledge are put to good use. A skills database of Nepali Diaspora would provide an outlet for the NRNs to offer their services in Nepal and enable the developers in Nepal to access the skills repository.

Against this background, it is the pleasure of International Coordination Committee of NRN (NRN-ICC) to announce the launch of trial version of the Nepali Diaspora Skills directory at <u>www.ncgcanada.org/ndsd</u>. Nepali Diaspora Skills Directory (NDSD) aims to become a meeting place where NRN's and Nepali Projects find each other. At NDSD, people from all over the world can enter their skills and contact information which can be accessed by members of Nepali Government, businesses, social organizations, NGO/INGOs and other interested parties searching for people with relevant skills.

The first phase of the directory development has been completed. Visitors to the website are presented with a simple form to be filled out. Information such as name, contact email address, specific skills and availability dates have to be entered into the website. As number of registered members increases, this list will serve as a means of searching for skilled Diaspora from around the world and being able to contact them via email.

Besides member's skill information, various projects also have a home at NDSD. Information such as project name, location, duration, required skills, project contact email address etc can be entered into the directory. A list of projects that have been stored in the directory will be available for viewing by any visitor. If anyone becomes interested in a particular project, an email can be sent to its contact person through the directory website. Additionally, any person who is interested in starting a new project in Nepal can list their project in the directory, and browse the list of available talent in the member list.

In the next phase, directory searching will be enabled so that visitors can more easily search for interesting projects. Project organizers/sponsors will also be able to easily search for interested members who possess required skills.
