TODAY'S MESSAGE: LET CHILDREN HEAR...

Today, we recognize, show our appreciation to, and commission our Sunday School teachers. Our Sunday School teachers make it possible for our children, youth and adults to hear and study God's Word, the Bible, to learn about everything that God has done for them and how God shows His love to them through His Son Jesus Christ. That which began in baptism, namely our faith, and that which is also taught to our children in Sunday School, needs to be sustained in all of us throughout our entire lives. For the sake of our faith and therefore our eternal salvation, all of us need to be constantly listening to, reading, studying and learning from God's Word. Through His Word, God prepares His children for life, even eternal life.



In the Lord's Supper, Jesus gives us His body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins. The Lord's Supper is also a very sacred and intimate proclamation of fellowship among those who confess the same faith (doctrine, teachings) concerning God's Word and the Gospel of His Son Jesus Christ. Therefore, we practice close communion and ask that those who are not confirmed members of an LC-MS congregation receive instruction prior to receiving the Lord's Supper.

Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself.

1 Corinthians 11:27-29

Before receiving the Lord's Supper, we need to examine ourselves in the following way: (1) Am I truly repentant (sorry) for all of my sins and do I truthfully desire to change my sinful life? (2) Do I believe that Jesus is my Lord and Savior and that in the Lord's Supper I receive His body and His blood for the forgiveness of all my sins? And (3) Have I been instructed in the Scriptures and have I publicly confessed my belief that the teachings of this church and the LC-MS are faithful to God's Word and the Gospel of His Son Jesus Christ?

If you have questions about what God's Word says concerning the Lord's Supper, please speak with the pastor and/or pick up our brochure titled "Fellowship in the Lord's Supper". Those who are not confirmed are welcome to come to the altar, cross your arms and receive a blessing. For those who will be communing: Non-alcoholic wine is located in the center of each tray for those who have concerns with alcohol. We also offer the chalice as well as individual cups. If you desire the chalice, do not take an individual cup from the tray and the pastor will serve you from the chalice. Christ is present in both to grant you forgiveness.
