Repairing balls marks is a huge help to the golf course, and the grounds maintenance crew. A ball mark can cause the grass in the depression to die, leaving not just a scar but also a pit in the putting surface that can knock well-struck putts offline. Repairing the depressions is very important. Equally important is doing it the right way because repairing a ball mark incorrectly can actually cause more damage than not attempting to repair it at all. There are several websites that explain the proper way to repair a ball mark. Always repair your ball mark and one other one on the green. If you would like to learn the proper way to repair a ball mark, please ask Nick in the Pro Shop for a demonstration.
