

"What Goes Around Now Comes With Jesus"

Parents already this month plenty of school pictures posted. It is nice to have memories of weddings, birthdays, and even funerals. Many devices let us save much of today unlike ages past. However, memories are not simply data or picture perfect. We are not immune to heartache and shame. The prophet Isaiah says, "You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You" (Isaiah 26:3). These words remind us that the depth of sin attacks even our memories or the mind. There are those moments that we do not talk about, like recorded, or want to remember. Some try to ignore what was evil and even imagine it never happened. Others try to resolve bad memories looking for revenge in the future. There are also those consumed by memories that can cause constant despair, and miss all the other blessings God still gives for life. What goes around comes around and memories keep arising whether good, bad, or the ugly.

Psychology studies the mind helping us ways to think differently. While we cannot rewrite the

past, the present is different. Yet, more than better management of self, God is mindful of sinners. The Father thinks of us in His Son and Christ remembers His place to be our Savior and Lord. Only in Jesus do harsh memories have relief under the redemption won by the cross. God's faithfulness is what gave Joseph in the Old Testament a different way to see life. He said to his be-



traying brothers, "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today" (Genesis 50:20). Joseph recognizes what happened to him when his brothers sold him into slavery. Yet, he refuses to dwell on such evil memories and let them consume him. Instead, Joseph by faith saw the Lord of grace cared for his life in the midst of his darkness. Moreover, what was beneficial to his well-being also supplied a way for saving many.

The Gospel won freely and fully by Christ is no mistake. God's plan is to give "perfect peace" to troubled minds hurt in life by sin, death, and Satan. Being captivate to Christ is mindful of His forgiveness and faithfulness. St. Paul says, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:21). Jesus is good. The cross is good. God's Word is good. No forgetfulness is with Christ. His death and resurrection has overcome all and the Father is mindful of His Son. The cross is the glory of God against all evil and what comes around now is Jesus for you. His Word not a memory but acts with power to give faith in Him. Baptism more than a rite, but holds God's faithful promise upon your life. To remember what our Lord instituted in His Supper exceeds any good with God present for you against evil.

The Church has a one-track mind to keep attention on Christ. Minds soothed, trained, and purified by God and His Word do overcome evil. Bad memories die in Christ and good memories live on in His greater glory and gracious kingdom that comes. In September, many things kick into gear and there will be memories along with it all. In the good, bad and ugly Christ will not forget you and so we are mindful of Christ. He is worthy of praise and honor, since from the darkest of evil has come the best good from God for sinners. Great is His faithful at all times and the love of Christ is kept alive for many.

Our Philosophy for Christian Education

St. John Lutheran School is committed to walk with families, "Helping children grow in Faith, Knowledge, and Service." This happens ultimately with everything centered on Jesus Christ and His Word truth. Having a Christian education is to say "what we believe, teach, and confess" also comes through the lens of Lutheran Christianity. The Bible as God's Word is the foundation while the Small Catechism is the tool that shapes and teaches (catechizes) what this means for life. It is there in weekly Chapel, prayer and devotions, music and art, and the faith applied to the daily task of academics. In order to be effective, the faculty receive doctrinally sound material, ongoing instruction in Lutheran teaching, and the attention of St. John's pastor. This applies to called or non-called workers of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS).

As a church and school, it is really about God's Holy Word and all the good things it would provide to help families grow in faith to God and love lived out in life. While "religion" typically gets treated as purely an academic among others, Lutherans know how the formational aspect of the faith matters most of all. Whether it is listening to Bible stories, memorizing Bible verses, singing hymns, daily prayer, and growth in the liturgy or catechism. What children learn by doing al-

lows the Christian faith to go with them in life and is a blessing for the home, church, and society. Since we currently care for lower levels of instruction, children will receive the basic building blocks that will be a good foundation on Christ.

While a great deal can be done in a school day, the primary educators are the parents. This is clearly laid out in the fourth Commandment, "Honor your father and your mother." Dads and moms serve uniquely as God's representative for the daily task bestowed and to nurture human life. It means other authorities like our school support, guide, and encourage parents so that your child becomes a responsible member of society, hold to a good character for life as intended by God, and is brave in their witness to the Gospel. 
