From The Pastor

"And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful." Colossians 3:15

Whether it is a month designated to give thanks like November or that Facebook challenge for posting 100 days of thankfulness, this year is special for my wife and me to share with you at St. John and that is reason enough for us to give thanks. You were generous in your welcome. You helped to feed your pastor when his wife was still away in Wabash. You have

continued to explain and show what life is like at St. John and the school. Thanks are in order but it extends further to God our Father who has been exceedingly gracious to us all in Jesus Christ.

Luther in the Large Catechism does not dismiss the heartaches of a fallen creation

or fears that arise over the hands of sinners. However, the unusual goodness with life does allow the Christian to return to God as the Creator. He states, "Thus our hearts will be warmed and kindled with gratitude to God and a desire to use all these blessings to his glory and praise" (Tappert 413:23). Whatever we have at this moment is enough, which neither erases the problems nor hard decisions before life. Instead, thankfulness in whatever we receive still rests upon the same promise of faith in God and love for one another.

This takes us to what makes our Lutheran Confession distinct, because it belongs to the peace of Christ; a thankful justifying by God of sinners that is not in our hands, hearts or minds and it belongs to nothing in creation itself. Our Lord told His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you" (John 14:27). To be called by the Gospel of forgiveness is what we share as the baptized saints at St. John. Sounds simple enough, yet St. Paul shows the fact of Christ for you and me by His Word and Sacraments is to "rule in your hearts." Rule here is not like the Law's demands or the regulations of men. It is less what and more who, which takes us to Christ alone.

His peace mediates or umpires all things that belong to life and salvation. You might not see it that way considering how much instability and fears there are today, but recall the kind of peace Christ won. First, an eternal promise with God stands upon Jesus as Savior but He is also walking with us through these times as the Lord. The Psalmist David dealt with plenty, but he kept turning Israel back to the truth, "May the Lord give strength to his people! May the Lord bless his people with peace!" (Psalm 29:11) Likewise, when Paul claims the peace of Christ to rule in hearts it is enough to say, "And be thankful." Such strength and blessings from God does thankfully let us use whatever we receive to be for His glory and praise.


My Classroom Faces a What?!






