## **Extra Special Friends**

Have you heard the amazing news?! God has blessed our school with 69 students from 50 families! Thirteen families are new to the SJA family this year alone. To God be the glory!

Extra Special Friends is an opportunity for adults in our congregation to partner with our students. SJA has a long tradition of Special Friends; younger students are paired with older students and that relationship is nurtured throughout the school year. Extra Special Friends are volunteers from the congregation who are additionally paired with individual Special Friends groups. Activities such as book reading, puzzles, and games were scheduled where an adult ESF and their student SF could get to know each other.

The purpose of the Extra Special Friends program is to help "bridge the gap" between school and church. Relationship building is the key. Adults who may otherwise not have any connection with the school get to know individual students on a personal level. The goal is that those relationships can extend the discipling work the school staff is already doing with our students.

March 8


March 28 (also Grandparents and Grand Friends Day)

I wanted to share the very exciting news that AI Kaul has accepted our offer to become the next Executive Director of Valley Lutheran High School. A start date is yet to be determined.

As a brief introduction, AI is currently serving as Chief Development Officer and Vice President of the Foundation for Wellspring Lutheran Services. Wellspring is a faith-based non-profit recognized service organization of the LCMS. AI has more than 30 years of executive leadership experience, holds a bachelor's degree in Psychology and a masters in clinical Social Work with a major in interpersonal practice and a minor in business administration. His leadership roles include foundation development, human resource management, and fund development. AI and his wife Beth, along with their 3 boys, are all Valley Lutheran alumni. AI has previously served two terms as the chair of the Valley Lutheran Board of Directors, has been on the VL Foundation Board for several years, and was a member of the Campaign Cabinet for the GROWING Campaign.
