## FAIR RULES & REGULATIONS



1. Exhibitor must be a resident of Platte County Wyoming Trade Area.
2. Only current year products will be shown except in cases where stated otherwise. If evidence is produced to show that this rule is violated, the entry shall be removed from exhibition. Only those classes shown in this book shall be exhibited or judged. With the exception of yearly special exhibits.
3. Youth Exhibitors must submit fair entries no later than entry deadline of current year. All entries must be submitted online at [fairwire.com](http://fairwire.com). Exhibitors may also come into the Fair Office or Extension Office to put their entries into the computer. For entry and judging schedules, please refer to that specific department. All livestock exhibits must remain in place until 6:00 a.m. Sunday. All Open Class, 4-H, and FFA exhibits in the Agriplex will be released between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Sunday. exception is Open Class exhibits will be released Saturday night from 8:00pm until 10:00pm. The buildings will open at 7:00 a.m. on Sunday. The Fair Board is not responsible for exhibits left after 10:00 a.m. on Sunday.
4. The Platte County Fair and its management will not be responsible for accidents (fire, theft, etc.) that may occur on the grounds to persons or property, although, every precaution to guard against them will be taken. FAIR MANAGEMENT HAS THE RIGHT TO REMOVE FROM THE PREMISES ANYONE EXHIBITING INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR.
5. The distribution of handbills or other advertising material is strictly prohibited and no tacking or posting advertising bills, cards, etc. will be permitted on any of the buildings or elsewhere. No person will be allowed to do any soliciting for any paper, merchandise, or articles unless they first obtain permission from the manager and pay the required fee.
6. For special exhibits and concessions, see Fair Manager. Fair Management reserves the right to close any concession at any time and remove it from the grounds.
7. Open class livestock classes will only be offered when at least three unrelated entries are received.
8. In June 1982, the 1940 agreement between the Wyoming State Department of Vocational Education and the Wyoming Agricultural Extension Service involving 4-H and FFA youth was reviewed and amended to read as follows: "If a boy or girl is enrolled in both 4-H and Vocational Agriculture or Home Economics, work done must be different in each. For example: 4-H or FFA members may carry the same type of supervised occupational experience program in vocational agriculture or as a 4-H project, but the exhibit must be different in each. The FFA exhibit must come from a supervised FFA program, and the 4-H exhibit must come from a 4-H project."  
  
A project done in school should be eligible for display or show through one, but only one organization.
9. Underage Tobacco/Vaping, illegal drugs and or contraband and alcohol use will not be tolerated. Use of illegal substances will lead to the local authorities being called and/or other consequences can and will be implemented at the fair managements discretion.
10. Special awards may be given, when sponsored.
11. In a case where no donor is designated there will be no special award presented.

## PROTESTS

All protests must be filed with the manager and must state plainly the cause for complaint and appeal and must be made within two (2) days following the final date of the Fair and accompanied by a non-refundable \$50 appeal fee, payable in the form of cash, money order or certified check.

## CAMPGROUNDS

1. Camper parking will be by reservation only. This includes all dry camping as well. Please call the Fair Office (322-9504) to register. Camper spots will be given as a first reserve basis. No camper parking will be permitted prior to the first Sunday of fair.
2. All campers **MUST** check in at the fair office prior to parking.
3. Camper parking fee—\$125.00 for the week and **MUST** be paid prior to parking camper or camper will be towed at owner's expense.
4. Dry Camping is allowed in designated areas only. Dry camping is \$25.00 for the week and **MUST** be paid prior to parking your camper.

## JUDGES

1. Judges are requested to read carefully the general and special rules under which this Fair is managed prior to entering their duties making special note of and marking all rules.

Judges, please report to management

2. before entering the show.

No judges shall make any award other than

3. those specified in the premium list, without the written consent of the Manager.

4. Judges shall report to the superintendent any exhibitor or exhibitors who in any way, whether in person or by agent, interferes with them during their work or shows any disrespect to them. The superintendent shall, at his/her discretion, demand the exhibitor to withdraw from the competition if guilty of such acts.
5. At the discretion of the judges, any exhibit not promptly presented when called for, will be ruled out and barred from competition.

Each Shower will be assigned one (1) pen

6. per two (2) animals per species excluding Poultry, Rabbit and Beef. Extra pens will be used for animals only, not tack.

## SUPERINTENDENTS

1. It shall be the duty of each Superintendent to inform the judges of their department rules and regulations governing awards and to urge them to carefully read the rules before entering their work.
2. Each Superintendent is charged with caring for and placing of the exhibits by class number in their department. **THE SUPERINTENDENT MUST SEE THAT ALL AWARDS ARE DULY AND PROPERLY ENTERED.**
3. The Superintendent in charge **MUST CHECK THE ENTRIES AND KEEP THE EXHIBIT FILE IN ORDER FOR THEIR DEPARTMENT SO THAT THE SAME WILL SHOW WHAT ARTICLES OR ANIMALS WERE PASSED UPON BY JUDGES.**
4. Where awards are made in all classes, the Superintendent in charge must see that the name, registry number, etc. of the exhibit's awarded prizes are noted on the tags and/or call sheets.
5. Each Superintendent will be informed of time of judging in their department. They will endeavor to have all exhibitors present and urge them to lend their assistance by having entries ready.

6. All livestock Superintendents will be responsible for collecting health papers and turning them into the fair office.
7. All Superintendents will oversee Herdsmanship in their respective areas. All stalls, pens and surrounding areas are to be kept clean and free of trash.

## GOVERNING ANIMALS

1. All animals presented for exhibition or competition at the Platte County Fairgrounds will be considered under quarantine and not eligible for exhibit until a certificate of veterinarian inspection documenting that the animal's to be exhibited are in good health and free of contagious disease is presented to superintendent for review prior to unloading on grounds.
2. No animals will be allowed to exhibit or compete at the Platte County Fair without a current certificate of veterinarian inspection. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection for all animals except poultry and rabbits are only valid for thirty (30) days.
3. The Platte County Fair's veterinarians may implement any special inspection or quarantine procedure that is believed necessary to prevent the spread of contagious diseases to humans or other animals. An animal showing symptoms of a contagious disease shall be placed under quarantine or removed from the County Fairgrounds at the discretion of the Platte County Fair Board's veterinarians.

- Animals leaving the property due to sickness, must have three people sign a sickness release. Authorized signers may be any combination of the following. Veterinarian, superintendent, fair manager, fair board or sale committee member. Sickness release papers can be found in superintendent boxes, or in the fair office.
- 4.

5. The Platte County Fair's management team reserves the right to develop, employ, and enforce individual animal health inspections at any time. The Management of fair advisors will make this decision if they feel it is necessary for the health and/or well-being of animals, public health, or other specific health concerns.

6. All livestock entering the Platte County Fairgrounds will be required to be health inspected at the designated check point, except for horses, dogs, rabbits, and cats. These animals will be required to get health inspections from the veterinarian prior to entering the grounds.
7. All vehicles with livestock will enter the east arena gate. After passing inspection they will enter fairgrounds through the track area and around the arena. Animals will not be permitted to unload and stall until health papers are turned into area superintendent. Beef, swine, sheep, goats, rabbit, and poultry will not be permitted on the grounds to stall prior to 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday.

## JR. LIVESTOCK DEP.

1. Only 4-H or FFA members may compete in any of the classes in this department. 4-H members must turn 8 years old by January 1 of the current year and not passed their 19th birthday before December 31 of the current year.
2. A review board will deal with any questionable situations that may arise during the county fair. The review board will be composed of two Fair Board members, 4-H Leaders' Council President, 4-H club leader/FFA Advisor from club to which member belongs, Division Superintendent, Sale Committee Member of species in question, and 4-H Educator.
3. Exhibit must be the result of the exhibitor's project for which he or she is enrolled this year.

4. Members must be present to show their own animals when judging takes place. If unforeseen circumstances arise, the superintendent must be notified of who will be showing in place of member.
5. Animals are allowed one check weight prior to accepting the final weight.
6. Platte County 4-H & FFA Herdsman Award: presented to one outstanding exhibitor in each species area including beef, swine, sheep, goat, poultry, and rabbit. This award recognizes youth who consistently maintain clean pens, organized tack and feed areas, walkways, and help keep the fairgrounds neat and welcoming for all exhibitors and visitors. The Herdsman Award highlights youth who have a strong work ethic throughout all of fair, help set up as well as tear down, and are willing to assist wherever they may be needed with a positive attitude.

Superintendents in their division have the

7. authority to ask that exhibitors remove their exhibit if animal(s) are not cared for in a husband like manner. Unruly animals or those that get away more than twice, may be asked to be removed from the Fairgrounds.

GENERAL CARE: Feeding, watering, cleaning pens/stalls, etc. of animals during the Platte County Fair should be the responsibility of the 4-H or FFA member. Older members are encouraged to help younger members.

9. All livestock brought to the fair must be ready to show (cattle and horses' halter broke).

10. No boars, stallions, dairy bulls, beef bulls, or billies will be allowed in any 4-H showmanship event.

11. Showmanship contestants must own and show their own animal.

12. Any FFA or 4-H youth that takes Jr. Livestock Sale animals to Wyoming State Fair is still responsible for delivering that animal to the buyer of his or her animal. In the case of a resale animal the resale amount must be reimbursed to the buyer of said animal if animal cannot be delivered.
13. No Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats, Rabbits, or Poultry will be allowed on the Fairgrounds prior to 7:00 a.m. Tuesday. **All Livestock exhibits must remain in place until 6:00 am Sunday morning at which time animals will be released.** Exception: Horses, Dogs, Cats and Calves (born in current year) are not required to remain on the fairgrounds for the entire week.
14. Each Shower will be assigned one (1) pen per two (2) animals per species excluding Poultry, Rabbit and Beef. Extra pens will be used for animals only, not tack.

**BEEF: MINIMUM 1050 LBS, MAX NO SELL, 1500LBS**

**SHEEP: MINIMUM 105 LBS, MAX NO SELL, 165 LBS**

**SWINE: MINIMUM 215 LBS, MAX NO SELL, 315 LBS**

**GOATS: MINIMUM 50LBS, MAX NO SELL, 115 LBS**



**LIVESTOCK CHECK IN/WEIGH-IN TIME  
TUESDAY, 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.**

Only livestock with health inspections will be permitted to unload and stall signs will be posted. This is for your safety and to ensure all livestock is healthy and free of disease. We want everyone to have a safe and healthy fair. Fair discretion to remove any animal that is deemed sick.

- All market beef, sheep, swine, and goats must be tagged at a tagging and weigh-in date. Beef is usually late January, sheep, swine, and goats late May.
- Members are only allowed to sell one animal.
- Members and parents are required to attend a mandatory meeting at the beginning of fair explaining sale procedure.
- All members and parents must sign and turn in a sale consignment form before members are eligible to participate in the sale.
- Members are highly encouraged to schedule a slaughter date for their sale animal prior to the fair. . The member's buyer will notify member if that date/facility is preferred.
- Following the livestock sale, members must complete a thank-you to all buyers and turn it in to the Extension Office in a self-addressed, stamped UNSEALED envelope.
- It is common practice to make a buyer thank-you poster to display during the fair then deliver to buyer once fair is over.

# Livestock Sale

## Guidelines & Regulations

### ANIMALS PROPERLY CARED FOR

Animals must be fed and watered, and stalls cleaned, or animals will be sent home.

### SALE ORDER

When you leave the show, ring tell your Livestock Superintendent you are going to sell an animal. Be polite and concise. Check the bulletin board to see if your superintendent listed all sellers, if not, let superintendent know. Only if it is our mistake will you be added to the sale order after it is made! ALSO, check bulletin board Friday afternoon so you will know when you sell. Please be ready with your animal and on time to sell, do not make us come look for you! No substitution of animals will be allowed.

### NO SALES & CHECK DEDUCTIONS

Once an animal enters the sale ring, it must be sold to the highest bidder. No sales are not allowed. There will be a commission taken out of every check and brand inspection fees are taken out of beef, sheep, and goat checks.

### SALE RESPONSIBILITIES

After you have sold your animal in the sale ring, someone will help you put your animal back while you take the sales receipt and a buyer board to the buyer, be sure to ask and see if your animal is to be a buy back. BE POLITE AND THANK THEM. Then RETURN the sales receipt to the front table and check on your animal and make sure it is back in its pen. Remember that the animal is still your responsibility until you deliver it to the buyer. You must feed water and care for it until you deliver it to the buyer. It must stay on the fairgrounds until at least 7:00 a.m., Sunday.

### BUY BACKS

A buy back list will be posted on Saturday. Check and see if you are on it. If so, be there to help load your animal. If you are going to State Fair with your sale animal, let us know immediately or it will be gone with the rest of the buyback animals. The Fair Board has requested that Buy Back animals be loaded out on Sunday morning if possible. All animals sold, whether a buy back animal or not, must be delivered to or arrangements made for delivery of the animal, within fourteen (14) days of the end of State Fair (by September 1.) If the animal is not delivered or prior arrangements made for delivery, the sale will be treated as a "no sale" and the buyer will be refunded their money and the seller will keep the animal. No resale of buy back animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds.

### THANK YOU NOTES

Thank you notes should be neatly written, in an unsealed, addressed, stamped envelope, and submitted to the Extension Office soon after County Fair, no later than September 15, or you run the risk of forfeiting your sale check. You must bring a thank you note into the Extension Office in person to pick up your check. Remember, you must write a thank you note to your buyer(s) and bring it/them into the Extension Office before your check will be released!! Checks WILL NOT be given to anyone but the seller or their parent.

The Platte County Fair Board has voted to discontinue the payment of all fair premiums. Effective Jan 1 2023.

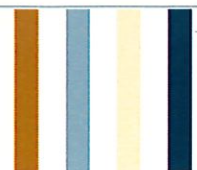

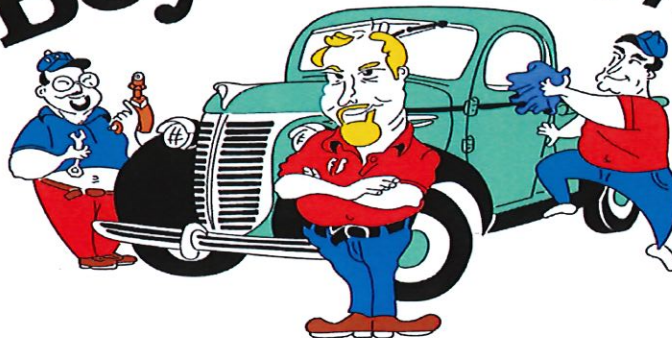

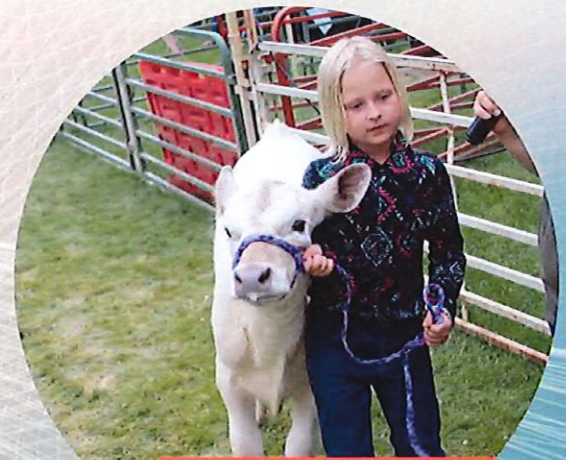
