All 4-H & FFA exhibits in the Agriplex will be released between 7:00 – 9:00am SUNDAY. The building will be open at 7:00 a.m. Sunday. The Fair Board is not responsible for exhibits left after 10:00 a.m. on Sunday.

## General Exhibits Information

1. Entries must have been exhibited at the respective county fair and have been designated eligible for state fair entry.
2. The Wyoming State Fair, State 4-H Office, and UW County Extension Educators or staff are not responsible for the loss of or damage to, any exhibit or animal.
3. It is the responsibility of 4-H youth to verify correct entry of their exhibits with their 4-H Educator.
4. Due to the absence of interview judging at the state fair, the accompaniment of a brief explanation with your project may help the judge when assigning a ribbon placing. Points to consider may include process, tools used, skills learned, goals achieved, additional help from others.
5. Because 4-H promotes a learning experience associated with project enrollment, entries are evaluated within the context of the division in which they are entered. i.e., entry in Leathercraft is evaluated on leathercraft skills.
6. Posters, pictures, artwork, and photography exhibits should come with a method for hanging them on hooks attached to pegboard. If the items cannot be hung, they will be displayed on the floor or table.
7. Display boards or poster boards must be able to stand on their own on a table.
8. Any exhibit that puts the safety of others at risk of injury or harm, as deemed by the State 4-H Office, may not be allowed to be publicly displayed and/or judged.
9. Oversized exhibits will be displayed as space permits.
10. 4-H exhibits are placed as judged using the Danish system of recognition (purple, blue, red, white). Additional awards or recognition are available pending donor support.
11. Exhibits Due -- All static exhibits must be in place on Monday.

6. Member will be responsible for taking cake/cookie exhibits to Douglas for competition at the Wyoming State Fair, if chosen. All cakes left in Douglas at the end of State Fair will be disposed of. Ribbons will be saved and sent to the respective county offices.

- Any Platte County 4-H member who is enrolled in a 4-H Fabric and Fashion project during the current year is eligible to compete in the Fashion Revue.
- Garments may be from reused fabric and may be all or partially hand knitted or crocheted.
- Members MUST pre-enter every outfit separately (to include constructed and ready-to-wear) for Fashion Revue.
- Narration sheet is due with pre-entry. No exhibit tag is necessary, but all garments MUST be labeled with name and address.
- Fashion Revue garments may be construction judged.
- Members may model as many outfits for the judges (to include constructed or ready-to-wear) as they would like, but outfits must be of different styles. Example: a dress, a sport outfit, and a tailored wool suit, not 3 sport outfits.
- Members will be limited to a maximum of three outfits to model at the Public Fashion Revue.
- To be eligible for awards, 4-H members must participate in Public Fashion Revue as well as Interview Judging.

**Rules:**

1. *Due to the absence of interview judging at State Fair, the accompaniment of a brief explanation with your project may help the judge when assigning a ribbon placing. Points to consider may include process, tools used, skills learned, goals achieved, and additional help from others. Those exhibits without statements will lose one ribbon placing.*
2. Recipes are required with all entries. Recipes will not be returned and become the property of 4-H. Recipes must include the member's name, age, year in project, and county they are representing.
3. More than one entry may be entered per class if entries display different techniques. For example, a 4-H member could enter a sponge cake, coffee cake, and an angel food cake.
4. When single items are exhibited (rolls, cookies, biscuits, etc.) enter **3 items for each class.** (See #8 below).
5. When whole items are exhibited (cakes, loaves, etc.), enter **one fourth of the item.** Take an end cut of a loaf of bread, cut top crust to bottom crust. Bread Machine bread—Mixes are not allowed. (See #8 below).
6. Exhibit food on 6 inch or smaller plastic coated or Styrofoam plate when possible.
7. **Name, age, year in project, and county are required to be listed on ALL items.** Recipes and written statements accompanying baked items should be on 3" x 5" index cards, with plastic wrap between the food and the card. (See # 8 below). Recipes will NOT be returned and become the property of 4-H. Should an item be chosen for state fair, please provide a separate card with recipe, name, age, and county.
8. Only enter foods that can be safely stored at room temperature. Foods entered must be suitable for freezing prior to State Fair. Foods determined to be unsafe at room temperature will be disqualified, with the decision of the judge being final. **(Do not enter pies, casseroles, or items with cream cheese frosting, etc.)** Foods prepared with any mixes will be disqualified!
9. When preparing foods for exhibit, plan to keep 3 items from the same recipe (rolls, cookies, etc.), the end-cut of the loaf of bread, or 1/4 of the cake that was prepared from the same recipe for County Fair. **Keep it at home in the freezer.** *In the event that that item is selected to compete at State Fair, please contact the extension office for dates and time to drop off items to be transported.*

The 4-H Member is responsible for making sure all written statements and recipes accompany the exhibits going to State Fair!

**FOOD PRESERVATION**

**Rules:**

1. *Due to the absence of interview judging at State Fair, the accompaniment of a brief explanation with your project may help the judge when assigning a ribbon placing. Points to consider may include process, tools used, skills learned, goals achieved, and additional help from others. Those exhibits without statements will lose one ribbon placing.*
2. Recipes are required with all entries. Recipes will not be returned and become the property of 4-H. Recipes must include the member's name, age, year in project, and county they are representing.
3. All exhibits must attach the following information in some fashion:
  - i. **Product name**
  - ii. **Processing method (boiling water or pressure)**
  - iii. **If pressure, list pounds of pressure**
  - iv. **Processing time**
  - v. **Altitude where product was processed**
  - vi. **Style of packing (raw or hot)**
  - vii. **Source of recipe**
  - viii. **Drying process and internal temperature (for jerky)**
4. Due to potential hazards of food-borne illness, judges may or may not choose to open, taste, unseal and handle, etc. any entry.
5. Clear, clean standard (usually half-pint, pint, or quart) Mason home canning jars in good condition with two-piece

metal canning lids (flat lid and band) must be used. Regular or wide-mouth styles may be used.

- All canned fruits, vegetables, meats, and pickle products must be prepared following the procedures referenced below, including appropriate altitude adjustments. Jelly products (jellies, jams, conserves, marmalades, butters) must meet the minimum processing times, including appropriate altitude adjustments. 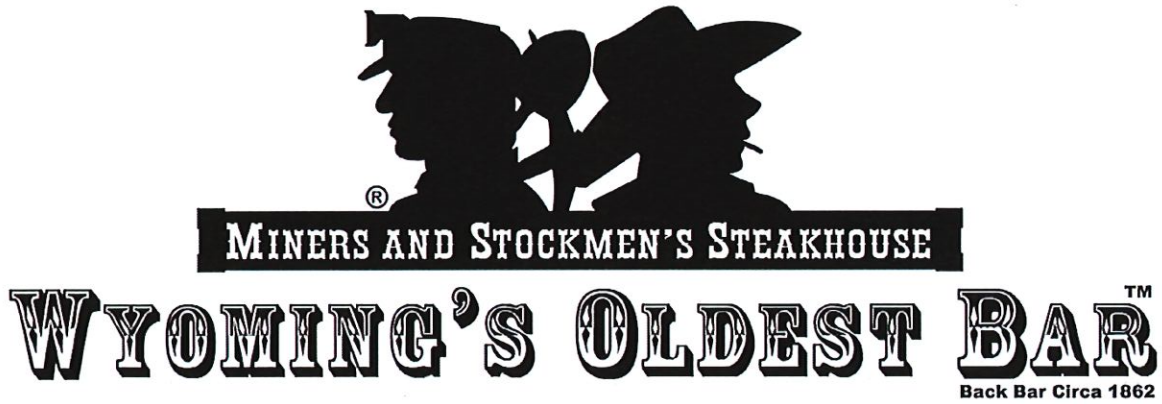
