Rules:

- 1. All livestock must be in place by 12:00 p.m. Tuesday, or they will NOT be allowed to show or sell, unless unforeseen circumstances arise.
- 2. All beef projects must be tied in their assigned stalls from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (exception on show day). All committee members will enforce this. If beef projects are not tied in stalls during the hours specified, they will be given one warning, and then all PREMIUM money will be withheld.
- 3. Only proper show equipment will be allowed in the show ring, i.e., leather, nylon, or rope show halters. No metal, mechanical or halter breaking devices will be allowed.
- 4. All market beef exhibited must be in the name of one individual owner by February 1 of current year, which is the ownership deadline. All breeding beef exhibited must be in the name of one individual owner by June 1 of current year, which is ownership deadline.
- 5. Market class is open to steers and heifers that were properly tagged.
- 6. Must be born after January 1 of current year.

- 1. Contestants must be 4-H or FFA members.
- 2. Proof of ownership by June 1, of current year
- 3. Entries are to be submitted online at www.fairentry.com or put on the computer in the Extension Office/Fair Office by Friday, July 1of current year.
- 4. Record Books are due by September 15th of current year. at the Platte County Extension Office.
- 5. Animals do not have to be fitted and judges do not consider fitting or showmanship.
- 6. Heifers must show on a halter. Pairs will show loose.
- 7. To show a cow and calf, the cow must have been shown as a yearling heifer the previous year.
- 8. If the contestant has more than one animal to show, another 4-H or FFA member may show the other animal(s).
- 9. To be shown in the three-year-old class, a cow must have been shown in the Supreme Cow Contest as a yearling
- 10. Cow and calf pairs (or heifers not showing in the Jr. Show) must be on the fairgrounds by 11:00 am on the day of the show.

DEPARTMENT: CAT SHOWS Superintendent – Sam Freedburg

Rules:

- 1. The "Household Pet" cat is a mixed breed of unknown descent.
- 2. A purebred cat is one belonging to a recognized breed with characteristics maintained through generations of unmixed descent; may be registered with a recognized registry.
- 3. Kittens must be at least 4 months old and not older than 8 months of age. Adult cats are older than 8 months. Because of susceptibility to disease, no kitten under 4 months of age will be accepted for competition.
- 4. No pregnant or nursing cats may be entered.
- 5. All cats and kittens must have their claws clipped. Declawed cats may enter the show and will not be counted down for declawing.
- 6. Do not enter your cat if you feel it will not be easily handled by the judge.
- Each cat or kitten must be wearing a harness or collar (not a safety collar) and a leash. The exhibitor must always wear the leash on their wrist for safety reasons.
- 8. **Exhibitors must furnish their own carpet square during judging.** Exhibitors must provide a proper cage or carrier for their cats/kittens. Exhibitors must bring their own litter and litter box.
- 9. All exhibitors should wear long-sleeved shirts or blouses with trousers or skirts. No shorts allowed.
- 10. All cats exhibited must be in the name of one individual owner by June 1, of present year, which is the ownership deadline.

Health Requirements:

Cats must have current rabies and distemper shots. It is strongly suggested, but not mandatory, that all entries have this combination vaccinations, plus feline leukemia. Vaccinations should not be received within three weeks prior to the show. Health Certificates are required.

Cats found to be ill or with parasites (fleas, ear mites, etc.) will not be allowed to show and will be dismissed from the grounds. No cat or kitten may enter the show if there is any (feline) infectious or contagious disease in the household within three weeks prior to the show date.

DEPARTMENT: DOG SHOWS Superintendent – Claire Klatt West of Exhibit Hall

Rules:

- 1. Wyoming 4-H members qualify to enter the State 4-H Dog Show by competing in their county 4-H dog show and:
 - a. Showmanship Champion Junior, Intermediate & Senior
 - b. Obedience receiving a qualifying score of 170 or above.
 - c. Confirmation Youth placing in the top 4 at County Fair
 - d. Agility & Rally Must compete at the same level at the State Show that they qualified for at the county level.
- 2. For Purposes of classification into junior (age 8-10), intermediate (age 11-13) and senior (14 years of age but not 19) age divisions, all 4-H members ages are determined as of January 1 of the year of the show.
- 3. All dogs must be at least 6 months of age by May 1 to compete at the State 4-H Dog Show and 1 year of age by May 1 for agility classes.
- 4. All animal entries of Wyoming origin must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued at the point of origin by an accredited veterinarian. Certificates for dog entries must show current immunizations as per state veterinary guidelines. No animals will be allowed to exhibit at the Platte County Fair and the Wyoming State Fair without a valid Animal Health Certificate. Shot records will be checked.
- 5. Vicious dogs will be dismissed from the ring and must be removed from the premises.
- Females in heat will be allowed in classes. However, they will go through at the end of all classes.
- 7. Spayed, monorchid and neutered dogs may be shown without judging discrimination.
- 8. Dogs must be clean and well groomed.
- 9. The show committee reserves the right to ask anyone violating these rules to leave.
- 10. Judging of classes will be done with AKC rules as guidelines; however, specific Wyoming 4-H Dog Show Rules (Rule numbers 1, 2, 3 & 4) will supersede AKC Rules.
- 11. Entries for Rally classes and Agility classes will need a current Wyoming 4-H Jump Height card at check-in to verify correct class entries.
- 12. All dogs must always be on leash (excluding competition) and under control. Platte County Fair rules prohibit any dog from being any place but the campground and the site of the dog show. Dogs must NOT be taken near stock barns. Once judging is completed, all dogs must be removed from the Fairgrounds.

DIVISION: DOG OBEDIENCE

DEPARTMENT: DOG SHOWS DIVISION D01 West of Exhibit Hall

Obedience Rules:

- 1. A 4-H member may compete in only one obedience class per dog. A 4-H member may enter a maximum of two dogs in obedience classes. For class entries, their first dog is referred to as the "A" dog. The other dog is referred to as their "B" dog. An exhibitor competes in an "A" class with their first dog and in a "B" class with their second dog.
- 2. The first-year beginner novice class is for members who are in their first year of the dog project, not the first year with a new dog. It is designed as a training class for members who do not feel competent to start in the On-Leash class. Members may compete in the first-year beginner novice class only once.
- 3. Members advance from On Leash A to Novice A or from On Leash B to Novice B. On Leash B is for the dog or exhibitor with previous experience in the class. An exhibitor who begins in the A group stays in the A group for each class. The same is true for the B group.
- 4. 4-H members with an obedience dog shown previously by another 4-H member, or a dog that has a title from another organization or has three qualifying scores from the designated annual county 4-H show, handler or an obedience title must show the dog by these guidelines:
 - a. Junior and Intermediate 4-H'ers may move back or down one level.
 - b. Senior 4-H'ers must show the dog at the highest level the dog has achieved.
- 5. Males and females will be shown in the same class. Females in heat will be shown last and must be kept away from the obedience ring until call time.
- A dog having a qualifying score of 170 points at the designated County Fair may advance the following year to the next higher class but must advance after receiving 3 qualifying scores from the designated annual county 4-H show.

Once the higher level of obedience is selected for the dog, the member may not drop back to the lower level with the same dog.

- 7. Score Sheets: The Wyoming 4-H dog score sheets were designed for the benefit of 4-H members. They are intended as guides for judges. Judges use their discretion in deciding the seriousness of errors.
- 8. All dogs must enter/leave the show ring and compete with a six-foot leash.
- 9. High in trial will be calculated based on the raw score plus 5 additional points with each increase in level of difficulty.
- 10. Bait and/or toys are not allowed in obedience competition.
- 11. Dogs soiling or urinating in the ring during judging will be disqualified and receive no score.

Rules:

- Classes will be subdivided by breeds within a class if numbers warrant. First place winners in classes 12-21 will
 compete for the Best in Show award in conformation.
- 2. Exhibitors entering more than one dog in any class may be assisted only by another 4-H member, if the dogs must be shown at the same time.
- 3. Classes 12-19 will be judged according to AKC standards, but it is not necessary that dogs be registered; they must be purebred—both animal parents of the same breed.
- 4. Classes 20 & 21 are for cross-bred dogs parents of different breeds and will be judged according to the predominant breed characteristics.
- 5. Before entering your dog, check the list of breeds that are eligible for each group before entering your dog. This information is also available online at wyoming4H.org under the dog link of the projects tab.
- 6. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on the leash.

Agility Rules:

- All competitors will start at level one. Advancements are allowed after one qualifying score to the next level. After three qualifying scores in Level One, Two and Three, advancement to the next level is mandatory. Same day advancement is not allowed from one level to another level.
- 2. No dogs under one year of age by May 1st of the current year.
- 3. The level at which a member qualifies at the county level is the level in which they will compete at the State 4-H Dog Show.
- 4. A dog receiving a qualifying score of at least 75 points at the county 4-H show fair may advance the following year to the next higher class but must advance after receiving 3 qualifying scores from the designated county 4-H show. Once the higher level in agility is selected for the dog, the member may not drop back to the lower level with the same dog.
- 5. Youth, with a dog shown in previous years by another 4-H member, or a dog that has a standard agility title from another organization, or has received three qualifying scores from the designated annual county 4-H show, must show the dog under these guidelines:
 - A. Junior and Intermediate aged 4-H youth may move "back" or "down" one level.
 - B. Senior aged 4-H youth must show the dog at the highest level that the dog achieved.
- 6. An entry in the State 4-H Agility Contest must have competed in a county agility contest to qualify. To enter Agility, you must also have participated in another 4-H dog exhibit (obedience and/or conformation) during the current 4-H year at your county fair. A qualifying score is not required in obedience classes, only participation at county fair.
- 7. Level 1 leashes can be up to 6 ft. in length. Level 2 dogs must run off leash or with a tab no longer than 6 inches.
- 8. Collars must be of a flat, buckle variety with nothing hanging from it such as tags.
- 9. All Dogs must enter and leave the ring on the leash.
- 10. Bait is not allowed in agility competition.
- 11. Dogs in heat will run at the end of each class.
- 12. All Dogs will be measured and placed in the proper height class before their agility class starts.
- 13. Fastest times will be used to break ties on scores at all levels.
- 14. A time for handlers (only) to familiarize themselves with the course they are competing in will be established and announced.

Rally Rules:

- 1. Eligible entries are identified and entered by each county 4-H Educator, in consultation with Dog Leader.
- 2. Youth can enter a single dog in only one rally class.
- 3. Dogs soiling the ring will be disqualified.
- 4. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. Those competing in on leash classes should do so with a 6-foot leash.
- 5. Collars may be flat buckle (leather or nylon) or choke chains.
- 6. No bait (dog treats or toys) is allowed in the ring.
- 7. Entries must achieve qualifying scores at their county level before competing in the state 4-H Dog Show. The level at which a member qualifies at the county level is the level in which they compete at the State 4-H Dog Show.
- 8. A dog must advance levels after receiving 3 qualifying scores. Once a level is selected for the dog, the member may not drop to a lower level to compete with that dog.
- 9. Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) Class Only-Participation ribbons will be given in the Advanced and Excellent classes regardless of qualifying score. If qualifying scores are received in both classes, then placement ribbons will be given.

Classes are based on age of the youth and the experience of the dog and include:

Novice Dog: A dog competing which has not obtained three qualifying scores from competitions nor has a Rally title from another organization.

Pre-Advanced Dog: A dog which has received three qualifying scores as a Novice Dog but has not earned a qualifying score as an Advanced Dog.

Advanced Dog: A dog which has received three qualifying scores from competitions, received a score of at least 70 points in a Novice Dog class, or that has a Rally title from another organization.

Excellent Dog: A dog which has received three qualifying scores from competition, received a score of at least 70 points in an Advanced Dog class, or that has a Rally title from another organization.

Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE): After receiving three qualifying scores from competitions, the handler and dog move up to this level. At this level, the handler and dog will compete in both Advanced Dog and Excellent Dog classes at the same show. The handler and dog must earn a qualifying score of 70 in each of the classes (Advanced and Excellent) to earn ribbons and or prizes. Handler and dog may show at this level indefinitely.

Rules:

- 1. All livestock must be in place by 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday.
- 2. Does only will be shown in the Dairy Goat Show.
- 3. All breeds will be shown by ages. If numbers warrant, the superintendent may split entries into Alpine, Nubians, LaMancha, Pygmy Breeds, Saanen, and Recorded Grade.
- 4. No horned animals will be allowed in (purebred) dairy goat classes except for Pygmy. Pygmy goats will be judged by their own score card. Pygmy's will be shown "on leash".
- 5. Pre-show milk-out at 7:00 a.m., the day of the show.
- All dairy goats exhibited must be in the name of one individual owner by June 1 of current year, which is the ownership deadline.

- ABUSE: The Platte County Fair does not condone excessive bracing, slapping, or lifting the legs of market goats in the show ring or while on grounds.
- 9. The slapping or lifting of Market Goats in the show ring is not allowed. All goats must have four feet on the ground during the judge's inspection or handling. Lifting feet off the ground or placing feet on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. Exhibitors will receive one warning if they are found lifting or slapping goats. Second offenses will result in automatic exhibitor and animal disqualification.

- 5. Qualifying run is all 10-head roped to earn any points. If seniors do not rope cows, no points will be awarded.




- 1. Exhibit coops will be furnished free of charge but see the superintendent in charge before placing fowl in coops and get your proper classification. Any health or sanitary measures prescribed by the superintendent must be carried out under his/her supervision. Birds should be deloused before being brought to the fairgrounds.
- 2. Judging will be by the rules of the American Poultry Association. All poultry will have weights taken at fair.
- 3. A bird can be shown only under one entry. No single entry can be shown in the pair entry or vice versa. Each entry must be entirely separate.
- 4. Due to the rapid development of diseases in poultry, certificates of veterinary inspection must be issued within 48 hours of the show. Superintendents and designated helper will inspect all birds for parasites prior to entry to building. Veterinarians may be available at the show to conduct health inspections.
- 5. Poultry can be fed only commercial feed during the fair.
- 6. AN EXHIBITOR MAY NOT EXHIBIT MORE THAN TWELVE (12) LOTS TOTAL. NO MORE THAN TWO (2) ENTRIES PER PERSON PER CLASS.
- 7. Competition in chickens and turkeys will be limited to the following specific breeds and varieties. Each contestant must provide own feed, feeders, and waterers. Each contestant is responsible for pen cleanliness in area around pen. The Bird of Show can come from any cage except for Open Class.
- 8. EXHIBITOR MUST BE PRESENT DURING JUDGING
- Poultry Exhibitors should use sawdust under all cages and keep soiled sawdust cleaned each day replacing with clean sawdust each day. There will be awards in herdsman ship for Poultry.
- All poultry exhibited must be in the name of one individual owner by June 1 of current year, which is the ownership deadline.
