- Practices will be intentional with a curriculum, games and fun competitions daily
- It will be hot this summer remember your hat, water, sun block and snacks
- We will follow local health department and CDC guidelines and COVID proto calls. IF your child does not feel good do NOT come to practice or a game. Notify coach Doug if your child tests positive or has been exposed to COVID.

- Players will demonstrate sportsmanship, teamwork & a positive attitude
- Players will respect captains, coaches, fellow players, spectators and facility staff
- Players are making a commitment to Be on the team. What specifically does this mean? To get the most out of the program we want players to attend practice weekly (open opportunities). Review match list and make your best effort to attend matches. Smaller teams in 2023 for more playing time which make it more important that individuals commit to being at the matches
- Can't make a match communicate ONLY THROUGH google form.
 Communicate early

Spectator / Adult Conduct

- Spectators are here to have fun and support
- Cheer, encourage, support players
- Refrain from player contact during a match
- No caddying, giving advice
- Enforcement of the rules is up to the coaches and Jr. League Officials NOT the spectators
- Spectators agree to demonstrate sportsmanship, positive attitude, and respect. Be a role model for all of our young players
- Spectators will not argue with other spectators, players, coaches or captains
- All oncourse situations should only be handled by a Great Lakes Bay PGA Jr. League Representative

Format of Play

Game – Two teams competing in a 2 person scramble against another 2 person team. Most games will have four tee times which will include four 2 person teams.

Match - Pairs competing head to head for 9 holes

Flag – Format is match play. At the end of three consecutive holes whomever has won more holes (had the lowest score) will earn a flag or Point. In a 13U match there is a total of 12 Flags / Points available. In a 17U match a total of 9 Flags / Points are available

Matches for 2023 are a shotgun start which means all competing teams will start at the same time. parents are expected to arrive a minimum of 30 minutes prior to starting time.

Prior to the match players and parent representatives will receive score cards. All home teams are required to provide an adult to help score and monitor each playing group. Each home team will need 4 adults for 13U.

If an adult would like to rent a golf cart they can do so at the courses discretion. Golf courses will charge their standard rental rate for a golf cart rental.

Important Information

- If you can't make a specific practice time players are encouraged to come to another teams practice. We want to assure players get ample practice time in prior to the season starting. Encourage parents to work with their children outside of Jr. League practices.
- It is imperative that players attend matches. Score cards are completed the day prior to the match and it is very difficult to adjust on the fly. If a player is going to miss a match I ask that you complete the google form: (Sent in a Separate email to all players and available on www.DougTempleGolf.com. In the event of last minute changes use the GroupMe App to communicate directly to your

- teams head coach. We will need the team the player is on, the child's name, and dates they will not be playing. Please do your best to give at least two weeks notification.
- I Repeat Use Google Form to notify team if a player is missing a match. In the event of a day of cancellation direct message your teams coach through the GroupMe App

Post Season Teams / Play

- 2- all star teams for the 13U league division will be selected for the Great Lakes Bay Region. 8 Players per team. Players must be 10 years of age by July 31.
- 2 all star team for the 17U team will be selected. A total of 6 players will be on the post season team. Players must be 14 by July 31.

Post season play / practice will begin end of July and will be in addition to the individual team practices

Post Season Expenses

State Championship – No Entry Fee. The Great Lakes Bay Jr. League does sponsorships and hosts family events the last Sunday of June, July and August to raise funds to offset family expenses such as hotel / food.

Regional Championships	\$200 Entry Fee per player - includes practice round + 2 days of competition, team hat or visor, Saturday lunch and awards.	
National Championships	\$500 Entry Fee per player - includes 2 practice rounds + 3 days of competition, 5 nights of lodging at Fairmont Princess, ground transportation, welcome reception, most meals, and uniforms/gifts/awards.	

Course Set Up for Matches

Based on age there will be a Front, Middle and Back Teeing ground. Boys 11 & Under and girls 13 & under will play at approx. 2200.

Circle (front) Tee Yardages:

- The maximum yardage for the FORWARD tees is 2,200 yards. When possible:
- o Par three's should not exceed 110 yards.
- o Par four's should not exceed 255 yards.
- o Par five's should not exceed 350 yards.

Boys 12-15 and girls 14 and older will play at approx. 2600 yds

Square (Middle) Tee Yardages:

- The maximum yardage for the MIDDLE tees is 2,600 yards. When possible:
- o Par three's should not exceed 130 yards.
- o Par four's should not exceed 300 yards.
- o Par five's should not exceed 415 yards.

Boys 16 and older will play at approx.. 2900 yds

Triangle (Back) Tee Yardages:

- The maximum yardage for the BACK tees is 2,900 yards. When possible:
- o Par three's should not exceed 145 yards.
- o Par four's should not exceed 335 yards.
- o Par five's should not exceed 460 yards.

Will be longer for State and Regional Championship events

Pace of Play is no more than 2 hrs. 30 mintues.
