Home & Garden Check-In Sunday, August 8, 2021 from 10 am to 3 pm

Home & Garden Judging Monday, August 9, 2021 at 9 am (closed to public)

Special Baking Competition... Live Judging on Monday, August 9 at 6:30 p.m. Entry check-in 30-minutes prior.

Home & Garden Pick-Up Sunday, August 15, 2021 from noon to 2 pm

Rules and Regulations:

1. There is a \$.25 per item entry fee in all these departments. Entry fees must accompany entry blanks.
2. All Home & Garden entries must be pre-registered and postmarked by July 5. Exhibitors are encouraged to list every entry that they may have available to bring. No refunds on entry's.
3. Entries for exhibitors 19 and under should be entered in Department 11. Entries received in any other home and garden department will compete with adult entries. The same item cannot be entered in both age categories!
4. Actual items to be exhibited will be accepted ONLY between 10 am and 3 pm on Sunday, August 8, 2021. The Special Baking Competition entries (pre-registered only) will be accepted on Monday, August 9, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. for the Live Judging.
5. Fair management reserves the right to refuse to accept any entry deemed by fair management to be in poor taste.
6. Fair management has the right to open any and all canned good items!
7. Only two* entries per category per exhibitor will be accepted. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to decide in which category an item will be entered. **Note: Canned Products, Butters, Spreads, Jams, Jellies, Marmalades & Preserves will only accept one entry per category.*
8. Judging for the Home & Garden classes will take place on Monday, August 9. No exhibitors or spectators will be permitted in the hall during the judging.
9. Any entry not deemed worthy will not be placed. Judges' decisions are final.
10. "Best of Show" rosettes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
11. Exhibits will be guarded and every effort will be made to protect them from damage. However, neither the Fair Board nor the management is responsible for accidents, loss or damage.
12. Fair management may at any time order the removal of any exhibit or part of any exhibit that has become unfit for show.
13. Exhibits will be removed from the hall only on Sunday, August 15, 2021 between noon and 2 pm. No exceptions will be made. Perishable items will be destroyed if not picked up at this time – others will be kept for one week.

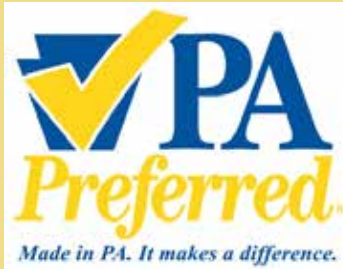

5. At least two (2) PA Preferred™ ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients are PA Preferred™ grains (such as oats or flour), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. A PA Preferred™ logo is not required because not all PA Preferred™ products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient. For a list of acceptable products, visit papreferred.com. Additionally, PA Preferred™ staff will assist in locating PA Preferred™ ingredients, as needed.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. *(All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)*
8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2"x11" paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. **The PA Preferred™ ingredients must be listed clearly in the ingredient list, specifying the ingredients and the company that made/grew them** (ex. PA Preferred Eggs - Weis brand; PA Preferred Milk - Galliker's brand). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cookies-brownies-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
9. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
10. **Judging Criteria:**
 - Flavor (aroma, taste, good balance of flavorings) 30 points
 - Texture (appropriate for the type of cookie, brownie or bar)..... 25 points
 - Inside Characteristic..... 20 points
(even grain, evenly baked; free from air pockets)
 - Outside Characteristics 15 points
(uniform size, shape, appearance; overall appeal)
 - Creativity 10 points
 - TOTAL 100 points**

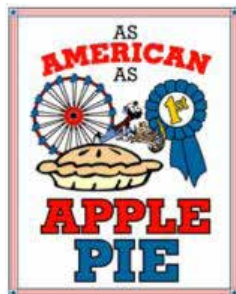

 4. Exhibitors using other themes will be disqualified at the state level.
 5. Posters must be flat. Posters rolled or folded will be ineligible for judging.
 6. Posters will be evaluated on use of the theme, visual appearance and creativity in relation to the exhibitor's age.
- All entrees must be brought into the Home & Garden Department on Sunday, August 8, 2021 between 10 am and 4 pm.
 - The first place winners' posters will be sent to the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture by the Greene County Fair for the state competition.
 - State Competition Premiums: First - \$100.00; Second - \$75.00; Third - \$50.00.
 - State Competition winners will be notified in advance and invited to attend an awards presentation at the Pennsylvania Farm Show in January 2022. They will also be required to provide their social security numbers for award disbursements.
 - All posters will become the property of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture for possible future promotional activities for the Pennsylvania Farm Show and Pennsylvania State Association of County Fairs. Any duplication of posters from previous years will be disqualified. Posters will not be returned via mail.

5. All participants will be judged on poise, appearance, neatness, and ability to communicate during a personal interview and on stage while presenting their speech and modeling in an evening gown.
6. The selected fair queen must compete in the Pennsylvania State Fair Queen Contest which will be held in January at the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center representing the Greene County Fair.
7. The selected fair queen must participate in local parades and events during her reign representing the Greene County Fair.
8. The selected fair queen and her parents/guardians must sign an official contract outlining duties, responsibilities, acceptable attire, and behavior for the period of them that the title of Greene County Fair Queen is held by the individual.
9. The selected fair queen will be required to follow the written guidelines for behavior and attire in accordance with the Pennsylvania State Fair Queen Program rules.
10. The selected fair queen must also meet all requirements and commitments of the Greene County Fair Queen Program and follow the rules set forth by the program and the Greene County Fair Board during her reign.
