Rules

- Every care will be taken to protect the articles exhibited from all damage. However, the Fair will not in any way hold itself responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss sustained.
- The theme for the Grange Exhibits is the current Fair theme.
- Every effort should be made to use only local, homegrown products of fruits, vegetables, grains and dairy products, or one of a combination of any of the above types of products, according to the choice of the exhibiting Grange.
- Exhibits must be placed either Saturday, August 6 or Sunday, August 7 from 10am to 2pm. Exhibits must be removed Sunday, August 15 from noon to 2pm.
- Granges must notify Debbie Stephenson at 724-627-4752 that they will be exhibiting and what day they will set-up.
- Grange Exhibits must be ready to be judged by 8am on Monday, August 8. Only Judges and Fair officials may be present in the building during the judging.
- Questions concerning space, arrangements, etc. should be discussed with Debbie.

Score Card

(Total of 100 points based on Educational Value, Variety, Quality and Display)

- 1. Theme (20 points):** An expression of one idea that represents a grange and current Fair theme.
- 2. Conveys Message (10 points):** The message should be understandable to the viewer for whom the exhibit was intended.
- 3. Interest (10 points):** The exhibit should arouse and hold interest, draw attention and cause people to stop, look and THINK.
- 4. Instruction (10 points):** All specimens must be properly labeled as to the name of variety of that particular produce with easily read labels.
- 5. Variety of Exhibit (10 points):** The exhibit must consist of over 30 items, but not to exceed 50 items. The exhibit needs not display more than 20 canned goods, jellies, or dried items and should have the same quality as fresh produce. Items should be exhibited in standard clear glass jars, neatness and uniformity of containers, jar tops, etc. Paper caps permitted on jars.
- 6. Variety of Specimens (10 points):** There must be three (3) or more specimens in each item on display of smaller fruits and vegetables, and one (1) of larger kinds of produce such as cabbage, etc.
- 7. Quality (10 points):** Uniformity to produce as to size, shape and color.
- 8. Display Design (10 points):** Attractiveness, originality, color harmony and balance of design.
- 9. Display Appearance (10 points):** General appearance of entire exhibit.

Rules

- Open to Greene County, 4-H and FFA youth. Class divisions are based on contestants age as of January 1st.
- Animals must be halter shown.
- The animal must be broken to lead on a halter and groomed for show. Animals may be exhibited in long or short fleece.
- Garments must be made of fabric consisting of 70% Wool. The garment does not have to be made by the exhibitor. The garments may also be purchased.
- Contestants will be judged on the participant's poise and general appearance, presentation, behavior, and grooming of their sheep.
- Decorations on sheep are permitted and Highly encouraged.
- Awards will be given for each of the five divisions.

- Description of Outfit (fabric content, who made the outfit, how it was obtained)
- Details of the Sheep (Name, information on sheep, it's outfit or accessories)
- Items of Interest (Hobbies, sports, point of interest, future plans)
