Beloved Members and Friends of Grace EPC,

GRACE NOTES

The title above is tongue-in-cheek for I am neither a prophet nor the son of a prophet. But I do want to make some predictions about life at Grace in 2022. These are based on both my experience and the Word of God, so I trust that they are sound.

JANUARY PASTOR'S PEN "Prophecies for 2022!"

Prediction #1—The Word of God will be proclaimed faithfully from the Grace pulpit every Lord's Day. Pastors John, Rick and I may not be as eloquent as some preachers you hear online (i.e. Tim Keller!) but we are faithful to God's Word and know the church. We are, therefore, in the best position to apply the Word to our congregation. Our messages this year will affirm the truth that, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (II Tim. 3: 16, 17)

Prediction #2—The majority of the congregation will still gather in person at our church building rather than watching the service online. It is difficult to have fellowship with a television set. The writer of Hebrews emphasizes how important it is to have face-to-face encounters with other members of the Body of Christ. "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." The Day of the Lord's return is always closer each year, though nobody knows the time or the season. However, until He comes, we should be found worshiping, fellowshipping and serving as a united company of saints. Pastor Rick is overseeing a wonderful program of education, missions and small groups to help us grow. There is an exception for those whom the Puritans described as "providentially hindered." But if you're able to get to the grocery store or the hair salon, you should be able to come to church!

Prediction #3—Through the ministry of Pastor John and the Elders, members and friends of Grace will be given compassionate ministry in time of need. My prayer is that our shepherding program will be even more effective in 2022 in letting the congregation know that your elders care about you and are available to meet your needs. "Cared for people care for people" and Grace is a caring congregation.





There will be explosive growth in our area over the next few years so we must find a way to be waiting for those new folks with doors and arms wide open.

Alice had many different jobs, from working in a bank, to building frames and driving a school bus. She worked for the last 18 years as a Safety and Security Officer for the New York State Office of Mental Health. She worked in Manhattan Psychiatric Center, where she was promoted to

Sgt. She transferred to Sagamore Children's Psychiatric Center in 2006, to be closer to her Dad, who was on Home hospice.

Her son is a vertical transportation engineer, in other words, an elevator mechanic! He married in 2007 to a wonderful girl, a Dr. of Pharmacy. In 2007, they had twin girls, Ava and Sophia. The girls were 3 months premature and only weighed 1pound 10 ounces and 2 pounds, 11 ounces. Thank God they are 6 now and healthy, happy girls!

Alice first came down to Florida to visit a girl she had been friends with for 56 years. They grew up across the street from one another. Alice was still working and not planning on buying a home until she called and told Alice the house across the street from her, here in Hawthorne, was for sale, and at a price Alice could afford. Alice retired from State ser-



vice in June 2013 and moved down here in October. She has many hobbies which she is able to do here in Hawthorne, including acting, painting, dancing, and shooting.

She was invited to come to Grace EPC by Cindy Semenik, who has helped her grow in many ways and encouraged her to become a CCW instructor. They have become very close friends. She hopes she is able to help Grace EPC grow and share the Word of God. She feels very blessed to be living in Hawthorne and to have made such wonderful friends.

Castro's Mexican Ministry—How It All Began

Back in the 1990's our very own Grace friend, Mary Kinney, was a mission worker with the Presbyterian Border Ministry. During this time, the National Presbyterian Church of Mexico had asked the PCUSA to build churches in seven sites along the US and Mexico border. New and Exciting Changes Coming in 2022!!!


