APRIL PASTOR'S PEN

"What I've Learned Over the Past Fifty Years-Part Two"

Beloved Members and Friends of Grace EPC,

Last month, I mentioned that May 14, 2022 marks the 50th anniversary of my ordination to the gospel ministry. In this column and the next, I want to share seven (the perfect number according to Scripture!) things the Lord has taught me over those years:

1. Jesus is the Redeemer of all things—spirits, minds, emotions, circumstances. He doesn't usually change things immediately, but progressively. It's a joy to look back on life and see how He has acted as Redeemer (Job 19: 25-27).

2. Most Christians don't take the doctrine of Total Depravity seriously enough. We should never be surprised when unbelievers (i.e. Vladimir Putin) do horrible things. But we should also expect that redeemed sinners will sometimes sin in egregious fashion. We are, in Luther's terms, *simul justis et peccator*, at the same time justified and a sinner. Jesus loved people and trusted them somewhat, but He was not naïve (John 2: 23-25).

3. God loves us because of who He is and what Christ has done, not on the basis of our performance. It's hard to consistently believe that. "It's not because I am worthy that Christ died for me, but because Christ died for me, I am worthy" (Luther).

4. There are unusual situations in which the Lord calls someone to a ministry that will be very difficult on his family (i.e. Billy Graham, William Carey). But His usual pattern is to require His servants to see their family as their first priority in ministry (Psalm 127: 3-5). I thank God that Ann and I were able to lead our sons to Christ and that they have led their children to Christ. None of our kids or grandkids resent the ministry, praise God!

5. The Scriptures are "the comprehensive equipment for God's people" (II Tim. 3: 16, 17). Never assume that you know the Bible well enough or that there are

not significant new insights to be gained from in-depth study. I'm truly thankful for those who have used my New Testament devotional and pray it has deepened your walk with Christ.

6. If there are bad things in the past, make peace with them so that they don't mess up the present or the future. Revel in God's grace toward you and others (Phil. 3: 13, 14).

7. Procrastination is a thief that robs us of joy. Don't put off important things. In fact, choose to do the most difficult task facing you each day first. Then you can relax and enjoy the lesser tasks and the joys of the day. As Scott Peck wrote, "It's the only decent way to live" (Prov. 6: 6-11, 20:4, 24: 27).


I hope at least one of these ideas is helpful to you.

It is April already! One fourth of 2022 is behind us and we are moving into the Easter season. Think about this, on Easter Sunday we will remember and celebrate the horrific death and then the amazing resurrection of our Lord. For me this is the time that I consider that He went into this with full knowledge of what lay in store. He did it anyway so that I could have eternal life. I still find it absolutely incredible that anyone would do that for me. Think about this, Jesus is in the garden praying and during that time He knew exactly the pain, suffering, and humiliation that lay in store for Him. What was going to happen had been done to others and many of them did not survive the scourging so never even made it to the crucifixion. Yet with the thought that "not my will, but Yours be done", He presented himself to the guards. The other thing that I am constantly awed by is just the fact that for me to receive the blessings that He purchased all I must do is believe! Wow!


Okay, the first quarter is passed, and we are on a positive financial footing. We were a little concerned during February but pulled ahead in March, so we are about where we had projected. However, now starts the period when our attendance usually falls off a bit as our friends who live here part-time depart and the travel season gets into high gear. So, please continue to pray for our church and consider what you can do to ensure our continued growth going forward. I still want you to consider the growth that we are experiencing in our area and what we must do to enable us to show the pathway to our Heavenly Father that is so desperately needed. I read an article recently that outlined the 17,000 new homes that have been platted for this area. Most of these are within five miles of our property on US 27 with the others only slightly further. What is hard for me to wrap my head around is remembering that the town that I grew up in spoke of having about 5,000 residents and for that the count had to Leesburg within the next 5 to 7 years and it has already begun. Will we be there to welcome them?

I recently read an insightful excerpt from a book by Rev Laura Dunham. She wrote that Scripture teaches us that everything we have is a gift from God and that we live by His grace. This perspective

should help to keep us humble when we are deciding how we will use the income and assets that He has put into our control. A theology of stewardship must bear in mind that all of creation is under the reign of God, and He has made it our responsibility to care for His creation by using the time, talents, and money He has allowed us to control.

My final thought, if you are currently giving at a level at which you are comfortable that you are doing all that you can, my feeble attempts to describe our greater need will hopefully meet with some agreement. Maybe a positive nod, and nothing more. However, if you are bothered by my trying to highlight those needs, then maybe Someone is tapping on your shoulder. Remember, our job is to spread the gospel and that means that we must bring new people into our services and activities. However, to do that in a meaningful way we need more space.

Mary Kinney



Mary Kinney lives in Lady Lake. She was born in southeastern Ohio when it was much like Appalachia is today, minus electricity and indoor plumbing. Her family moved to a dairy farm on Lake Michigan when she and her brother John were 4 and 5. God and church were their most important social issues.

Mary has lived in Michigan, New York, and Illinois over the years before moving to Florida. She married in 1962 (husband died in 1996) and she has 2 daughters, Debi who lives in Seattle and Judi, who lives with Mary. They moved to Florida in 1974, partly to get Debi out of the cold weather in New York because of her severe asthma, but also because during that last winter they had to climb out the dining room windows to shovel out the front and back doors!! When they moved to Florida, Mary worked in the patient business office of Florida Hospital, (now Advent Health) in Winter Park and for the next 20 years moved up the inter department ladder to middle management at Alta Monte Springs branch.

In 1994, a laparoscopic surgery became a six-hour emergency and near-death experience. She has thanked God several times for that experience. Suddenly she knew with no shadow of doubt that God is real and that there is heaven for her after this earthly life. What a wonderful Blessing!

Within a year God called her to be a mission volunteer, first in southeast Kentucky at a church with an 81 member craft co-op, and then two years later she went to the PCUSA Border ministry where she organized and ran an office in Nogales, AZ. God's plan was slightly different than what she first expected. They had five missions in the Mexican state of Sonora with US Pastor administrators, Mexican Pastor administrators, and bi-national oversight committee.

Within a year, the US pastor administrator contracted hepatitis C, and while he was still in the hospital, a mission team arrived from Colorado ready to go to Hermosillo, Mexico. The next six years for Mary

was hosting mission teams to all five mission sites, learning Spanish, traveling all over the States to speak on behalf of the ministry, and finding where God was working in all of this.

The two missions in Southwestern Sonora, Mexico were exciting missions, where souls were accepting the Lord on a daily basis. Pastor Mecho Romo Castro and Castro Ministeries are a product of the Guaymas Mission, as is his friend Pastor Roberto Mendoza Cruz, who is now head of evangelism and church planting for all of northwestern Mexico, as are many others scattered all over Mexico. Mary said "What a joy filled time being exactly where God wanted us!"

In 2004, she and her younger daughter, Judi went to Michigan to take care of Mary's 92-year-old father. Mary and Judi moved back to Florida after his death to get Judi settled. Mary was going to return to Guaymas, Mexico, but God's plans again were always better than hers. She keeps following Him.

Prison Ministry- An Opportunity Of A Lifetime By Captain Robert F Sandweg, USN Retired

Prison Ministry is most likely not the first place you think of when you are considering where to serve God and make disciples. But the need for the Gospel is great and men in prison are eager to hear the Word and respond to it. I hope this article will be an informative introduction to Prison Ministry and will generate some interest in Prison Ministry at Grace EPC.

I live in Western NC and I spend the Winter in South Leesburg, FL. I have attended Grace EPC men's bible study on Tuesdays for about 10 years and attended Grace EPC Sunday services for a few years before COVID began. I am well known to Pastor Dave and many of the men at Grace EPC can vouch for me.

I was introduced to Prison Ministry about three years ago by my friend and fellow ministry partner Roger Ciskie. Although I was out of my comfort zone initially, the Holy Spirit has confirmed that prisons are a place where the Gospel is especially welcomed. I also have come to know that prisoners are some of the "least of these" as the Bible describes and these men are certainly on God's heart. I have found great joy is serving in Prison Ministry and I believe that it is a worthy place to serve our Lord and Savior.

Not long after I first began my Prison Ministry, I witnessed 50 men fervently praying together as they were lead in a prayer of confession and surrender to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It was apparent that some of the men had surrendered their lives to Christ for the first time. Where else can you serve and experience such a moment? It was the Holy Spirit that allowed me to experience that moment and it confirmed to me that God was calling me to this ministry. For those who are called to minister in prison, I can assure you that you will never be the same. The joy of this ministry is almost overwhelming.

I am credentialed in (4) separate prisons in three states: NC, TN and in FL. There are two prisons not far from Leesburg, FL where myself and Roger Ciskie have served or are currently serving: Coleman Federal Prison, in Coleman, FL, just a few miles West of Leesburg, FL and Sumter State Correctional Institution, in Bushnell FL, about 40 miles from Leesburg, FL. Both prisons are fertile ground for the Gospel and the need for men to minister there is great. It is primarily at these two prisons where we are searching for a few men who may have an interest in serving there in our Prison Ministry.

I am currently trained and approved to facilitate two Faith-based courses of instruction at Coleman Federal and at Sumter State Prison. One course is "Godly Leadership" and the other is "GPS Life Journey". "Godly Leadership" is based on the eight Beatitudes taught by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew chapter 5). It is essentially a Leadership course where the men learn how to live out their Christian lives as Jesus taught and as Jesus demonstrated to His Disciples.

"GPS Life Journey" is a course in which the men discover God's plan for the next stage of their lives. It is an intensely personal jour-



ney of discovery and requires much prayer, self-reflection and Biblical understanding. The facilitation of both courses will require a significant amount of time and effort on the part of the facilitator. However, the Lord will provide all that is required including the joy and peace that accompanies this ministry.

Both of these courses are typically taught once a week for (2) two hours to (2.5) two and a half hours and last (8) eight weeks in length. The facilitator of these courses would be required to undergo a period of training and some on the job experience before they would be approved to facilitate these courses on their own. Both courses have a workbook that must be purchased by the facilitator and provided to the men free of charge as part of the course. You can expect to bear any expenses, whatever they are, in connection with these courses of instruction as there is no funding available to the men in prison. However, the expenses should not be burdensome.

All prisons have their individual requirements that must be met prior to allowing volunteers to have contact with prisoners. Volunteers are required to apply to each prison facility and be approved before they can begin volunteering. A criminal background check and volunteer orientation training at each institution are a few of the requirements that will be completed by all volunteers. Orientation training is generally a few hours a year and include Federal and State specific guidelines for volunteers.

I pray that there may be a few men who will pray about this opportunity and who may be interested enough to inquire further about Prison Ministry. I have previously discussed this opportunity with Pastor Dave Dorst and with Pastor Rick Rosenkrans. Pastor Rick asked me to write a short article for the monthly newsletter at Grace EPC in order to stimulate interest in this vital ministry. I pray that God will send us a few men whom we can disciple as ministers of the Gospel to men in prison.


Precious Moments Captured in a Photo

Notes from the Evangelism Task Force

What is the Evangelism Task Force? If you are not familiar with it, Grace has set up a Task Force or committee under the leadership of our Pastor of Evangelism, Pastor Rick with about 12 elders and some spouses. This Task Force reaches across most aspects of Grace EPC. As we are to be evangelistic in all that we do, as our denomination name states (Evangelical Presbyterian Church), our Task Force has representatives from our church from media, missions, shepherding, future outlook, small groups, advertising, visitation, and our clerk of session. It is our task to train our congregation and give them tools to be able to be bold for Christ in sharing the gospel in order to grow the Kingdom and to advertise our church and our Lord.

So, in saying that, we hope to keep you informed and updated with the work of the Task Force so that you may know what tools are available for your use and what training will be available. We were extremely excited with the attendance at the "Share Jesus Without Fear" Sunday School sessions. We hope to have more of the same or repeating that same course as we can use refreshers to learn it better.

The Task Force has been busy coming up with "tools" for you to use in your evangelism endeavors. You may have noticed a new directional sign to guide people to our parking lot and church along with a lovely invitation sign that Mandy designed. In the Narthex, you will find tracts of all kinds, invitation cards with the verses that Bill Fay shared in his course on the back. That way, if you use your phone for your Bible, the verses are printed on the card for your use. We have grocery bags with Grace EPC printed on them, as well as pens that we would love for you to take and giveaway. You may want to use them as a gift as you invite others to worship. There are smaller business cards for you to hand out with the church information on them also. We also have beautiful green travel mugs for sale for \$15 each that we will use to give to attenders that we will visit. We hope to use the sales from the mugs to fund future visitation gifts.

We are also launching a new ministry of children's Praise Packs. We want to be prepared for visiting family of our congregation or anyone who may visit with children. As Easter is approaching, if you have any children planning on visiting, please let Mandy know. She has packs for 3 age groups, so you can let her know the age, boy or girl, and their name and she can have their names on them as well. Teens might like them also, or we have copies of the New Testament if they would like one of those. The purpose of these packs is to introduce and share Jesus. We hope to have opportunities for all y'all to be able to attend events like Farmer's Markets or other venues to hand out some of our giveaways and invite others to church and share Jesus. So with that, I would like to share a paragraph from Ligonier.org:


