As Scripture says, "I am not a prophet, nor the son of a prophet," but I do want to share with you my sense of God's future calling for me at Grace EPC. Your Session had a "vision sharing" meeting this summer and concluded that God is calling us to build a new sanctuary on our property on Route 27. Our current facility does not have enough space for the growth that the Session foresees in the future.

At our last Session meeting, I told the Elders that I would be willing to continue as Pastor of the church until there is a new building. I also asked that there might be a time table attached to the fundraising process so that there is a concrete game plan in place. We obviously need to know whether there are adequate resources to provide for a new facility. I'm praying that we might unite behind this vision and see how God blesses us. You should look forward to communication from our Building Committee in the near future. I'm excited about the prospects!



Speaking of the future, I want to encourage you to consider obtaining copies of my New Testament devotional for 2022 for yourself and for your family members. This really was a labor of love for me over many years and I believe it will be my major contribution to the larger church. If you commit to doing the daily studies, you will become acquainted with all of the major, and most of the minor, themes of the New Testament. Each day gives an opportunity for prayer, in -depth Bible study and practical application of God's Word. I have purchased a number of copies directly from White Blackbird Books, the publisher. The two volumes sell on Amazon for \$50, but I am able to purchase them for \$35. I am not making any money from the sale of these books. My son Jonathan gets \$2.50 for every book purchased from Amazon (nothing from the direct from publisher sales), and he has yet to get rich! My great desire is for people to use this devotional.

Save the morning of November 27th to decorate our church. This year we are also asking for help with getting the poinsettias.



How often have I started with "good grief", it is now November, and

Finance Committee this year is almost gone. How time flies! But do you remember how time crawled when you were young? That next birthday or the next holiday just took forever. I read an article recently that explained this phenomenon. See, when you were 5, a year was 20% of your entire life. Think about this, the decade between age 10 and 20 was forever but think about that same amount of time between ages 50 and 60. Now consider that as our age increases those periods seem to accelerate. Why? I think it is because subconsciously we realize that instead of looking at time as a function of how long we have been here in God's kingdom, we start looking at it as something to be embraced and enjoyed and as a larger part of that which we have left. Grace Notes

Dana & Pat Brigham



In 1975, Patricia and Dana were married, once in their Miami church by their Pastor with family, and the next day at Cedar Key, Florida, by the Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court, along with Dana's best man from Ybor City, both of whom were born again believers.

On their honeymoon, Dana drove Patricia to Philadelphia to attend Sunday services at the Chapel for Westminster Theological Seminary, where ten years earlier Dana had found and accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior. From there, they drove to Mt. Celo in North Carolina and stood at 3,500 feet to pick a few daisies, where Dana first sang to Patricia the song about a girl named Daisy.

Patricia and Dana began studying theology with the Liberty Baptist University correspondence course, and attended Florida Bible College, built on a personal witness using a tract entitled, "Am I Going to Heaven?" (copies available), before becoming members of Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church and students at Knox Theological Seminary, which included a course in Evangelism Explosion using a tract entitled, "Do You Know?" (copies available).

As Seminary students, they confirmed that the family of man began with the creation of life and liberty for Adam and Eve, defined in 2 Corinthians 3:17. That life and liberty was lost as a result of Satan's dialectical materialism, disguised today as sanctification without justification. Satan's blasphemy caused the declaration of war recorded in Genesis 3:15. That war was divided along family lines between those born with a navel and those born again and listed in the Lamb's book of life. The war was "finished," as stated in John 19:30, elucidated by Luke 23:39-43, taught to Nicodemus in John 3:1-21, consistent with Romans 1:16-17, according to Ephesians 2:8-9, with the assurance stated in 1 John 5:13.

In 1635, Thomas Brigham, traveled from Bristol, England, to settle in Boston, Massachusetts, seeking the same lost life and liberty. Then, shortly after the Civil War of 1861-65, descendant Arthur Brigham left Boston and traveled to Birmingham, Alabama, where he met and married Eva G. Prince. They moved to the pioneer town of Miami, Florida, also seeking the same lost life and liberty during Civil War prejudice between North and South.

Dana's Father, E.F.P. Brigham, was born in Miami, and Eva became Florida's first woman Real Estate Broker. Dana's Mother, Marion, graduated from Wellesley College with Christian classmate Madame Chiang Kai-Shek. There, courses in Bible were mandatory and taught by "Bible Smith," later discovered to be a Communist.

Dana graduated from Northwestern University, enlisted in the Army, became a Korean veteran, and assisted his Father in a Miami courtroom successfully defending Bible reading in Florida classrooms.

While in law school at Temple University in Philadelphia, Dana found the truth in Acts 16:25-26. He then visited the National Headquarters of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church and later became an OPC Youth Counselor, as he had previously been with the Presbyterian Church (USA) before finding the corruption of the church in Amer-

ica identified in Machen's book, "Christianity and Liberalism."

Patricia left the Miami office of the F.B.I. after 12 years to manage the law firm of Brigham & Brigham, where a plaque in the office entrance read, "This Building and the Work We Do Here are Dedicated to the Glory of God."

Later, Patricia and Dana traveled to Jerusalem with Brother Mark Cambron, who was a Jewish scholar and the Vice President of Florida Bible College. In Jerusalem, Mark privately took them to the pinnacle where they stood overlooking the Kidron Valley on the place identified in Matthew 4:5-6: "Then the devil taketh him up into the holy city, and setteth him on a pinnacle of the temple and saith unto him, if thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down..."

Patricia studied and became a California Bar candidate and was a critical help with Dana's clients, including the only Watergate Defendant who was not convicted. The winning stratagem included the book, "Witness," by Whittaker Chambers, a former deep state Communist that surfaced as a witness for Christ and wrote his concerns for the lost life and liberty in his Foreword entitled, "Letter to My Children," which includes us.

With Patricia's help, Dana is a member of The Florida Bar Association, honored for 50 years in good standing. Among his many civil and criminal clients over that period of time to the present, Dana has served as General Counsel for Florida Bible College and Make It Clear Ministries.

Patricia's father died when she was only 14, and before her brother had become a Miami Motorcycle Police officer and later a Senior Captain with Delta Airlines flying internationally. Both Dana and Patricia are licensed pilots as well, and at the time of his retirement her brother purchased tickets for the entire family to travel with him on his last flight to Brussels. Just months after he retired, he was flying a single wing aircraft when the wing came off at 3,000 feet and his plane plummeted to the ground, killing him. As a tribute to him while at Knox Seminary, Patricia wrote the story of her witness to him and his salvation, which Knox asked permission to publish.

Our prayer is that everyone is reborn by God's justification through faith alone, consistent with Ephesians 2:8-9.



The Gospel vs. Theology ~ Just a Musing By Elder Pat Byrnes

In the opening chapter to his letter to the Romans, Paul expresses his fervent desire to visit them because of his eagerness to "preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome" (verse 15). He then states the most fundamental truth in the whole New Testament in verse 16... "For I am not ashamed of the gospel for it is the <u>power of God for salvation</u> to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek". As his letter progresses, Paul spells out the content of the "good news" with several key snippets such as in chapter

3:21-25... "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the law and prophets bear witness to it – the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith." And again in chapter 10:9 "...because if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved".

One of the things that I contemplate from time to time is the basic simplicity of this message pitted against the depth and complexity of the nature of God as revealed in the Bible as well as the deep mysteries that are hinted at but not revealed. Theology is the study of the nature of God. Such study is necessary and relevant because it helps us to be more deliberate and careful in our thought and speech about God. As we progress in our Christian walk, it profits us to move steadily from the Gospel message, taken to heart the day we are born again, to as deep as we can possibly go into theology.

The interesting thing about theology is that different people can read the same scriptures and come away with different interpretations and conclusions on lots of matters pertaining to God. Our Villagers small group is embarking on a study of the nature of free will in light of God's complete sovereignty and mankind's sin nature. It uses a teaching of a while ago by Dr. RC Sproul of Ligonier Ministries. Part of his approach was to highlight the theological differences that have been debated on this issue down through the history of the church. From some of these differences have come the many denominations that have evolved over the centuries. Listening to Dr. Sproul, I am persuaded that our reformed theology is closer to the scriptural mark than many others. But the Bible is not so totally clear (as it is with the Gospel) about every theological matter so we need to be as tolerant as possible with those differences. Not so with the gospel... just as Paul railed against "a different gospel" (Galatians 1:8) we should too when we see it.

But setting aside the truly apostate, it has been my experience that despite differences in aspects of theology, at the heart of the various denominations is the power of the gospel as Paul stated in Romans 1:16. I have been a Methodist, an Episcopalian, a Lutheran, a Presbyterian, and now a reformed Presbyterian. In each case, my family and I participated only because the gospel was recognized at that place for its power and reality and Christ was lifted up appropriately. As such, we had common ground with the membership even though the theology might be one way or another. Knowing what I now know and understand about theological matters, I might have questions for someone like Billy Graham whose theology was likely at variance with ours on some points. But can you think of anyone more prolific in reaching souls for Christ than Billy Graham! Every time I listen to one of his crusade messages, I am struck by his incessant, repetitive, hammering home of the gospel of Jesus Christ. The power of the Holy Spirit flows when the gospel is preached.

One of my favorite preachers/teachers today is Dr. David Jeremiah of Shadow Mountain Community Church outside of San Diego, California. I differ with him on several theological matters as well as prophecy interpretations. But God is using him powerfully and prolifically through his relentless focus on the basic gospel message to bring people to Christ. The power of the Holy Spirit flows when the gospel is preached.

So, what is the takeaway? First, I am eternally grateful for the basic gospel message shared with me by a mentor 50

years ago and the power of the Holy Spirit sealing it that day into my heart. I am also grateful for ongoing opportunities to dig and dig into scripture to learn all that is humanly possible about the nature of and matters of God. As we confront opportunities to share our faith with the unchurched, we can keep a lot of that in the back of our minds while we focus on the true conduit of power... the gospel of Christ. For sure, the Holy Spirit can use even an esoteric theological discussion to bring someone to pay attention to the gospel. But we can learn from the many prolific evangelists coming from many theological backgrounds that we can be confident in the gospel to achieve God's purposes. What He has spoken He will accomplish.

Media Team: Flipping the slides on Sunday, working the sound board or camera.


Newsletter Writer: Do you enjoy writing, would you like to try your hand at an article for the news-letter?
