DECEMBER PASTOR'S PEN

"It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year!"

Beloved Members and Friends of Grace EPC,

That happy song, sung most notably by Andy Williams, expresses my feelings about the Advent season. A psychologist would say that I love Christmas because it was the one time in the year that my family of origin got along together. But, it's more than that. I love the music, especially the carols; I love the decorating; especially Christmas trees; I love the food, especially the thin sugar cookies covered with icing and sprinkles! At what other time of the year can you hear songs about Jesus in public places?

Christmas at Grace promises to be a time of joy and growth. The pastors will be preaching on the story of Christ's birth as pictured by Matthew. My first message has the tongue-in-cheek title, "The Boring Genealogy," but it is anything but that! The story of Christ's ancestors is both amazing and thrilling. We will also ask the question, "Who Were the Magi?" Most people don't know much about these Arabian travelers. The best known song, "We Three Kings," is full of inaccurate statements. The truth is far better.

In addition to sermons, the choir will share a marvelous musical, "The Thrill of Hope." Each Sunday will bring a different selection and the entire piece, with narration, will be presented on Christmas Eve. We will have a special guest preacher that night, Joseph, the stepfather of the Messiah!

I'm also excited about the sermon series in 2022. We will begin with, "Little Books With Big Messages." Each Sunday, one of us will attempt to present the message of an entire book of the Bible. You may be familiar with books like Ruth and Jonah, but what about Obadiah and Habakkuk? "All Scripture is God breathed..." (II Timothy 3: 16) and that includes the Minor Prophets. Our Lenten series will focus on the conclusion of Luke's Gospel with the marvelous story of the penitent thief on Maundy Thursday. The summer series will be, "The

Corinthian Correspondence." The message of First Corinthians tells us crucial truths for today's church—among them, the importance of unity, the necessity of church discipline, the centrality of love and the historical evidence of the resurrection. I'm still thinking about the fall and next year's Advent series, but I have some great ideas I'm tossing around in my head.

Muriel Littler



Remembering Scripture By Elder Pat Byrnes

The other morning, I (re)discovered an instruction from Deuteronomy for keeping God's word fresh in our hearts and minds. Dr. David Jeremiah's daily devotional for November is dedicated to the subject of remembering God's word. His title is "Witten on Your Heart – The Power of Knowing God's Word". He based his message on an instruction directly from God found in the seventeenth chapter of Deuteronomy. God speaks of the time when Israel will demand that a king be placed over them, which happened at the time of Samuel as described in First Samuel Chapter 8. This was many, many years into the future but God foreknew it and gave specific instructions intended to maintain His law as the guiding precepts for the nation. God first tells them that when the time comes He Himself will chose the king. Then starting in verse 18 through to the end of the chapter, He specifies how the king of His choosing will govern the people/nation according to His law. It reads as follows... "And when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, he shall write for himself in a book a copy of this law, approved by the Levitical priests. And it shall be with him, and he shall read in it all the days of his life, that he may learn to fear the Lord his God by keeping all the words of this law and these statutes, and doing them, that his heart may not be lifted up above his brothers, and that he may not turn aside from the commandment, either to the right hand or to the left, so that he may continue long in his kingdom, he and his children, in Israel."

Having read the entire Bible several times, by definition I have come across this instruction several times. But to be honest, I didn't recall it. Probably because I didn't write it down! Kidding a bit but there is a key point here. When we look at the history of Israel's kings the only evidence that any of them might have hand written their own copy and then read in it all the days of his life is from Psalm 119 of David. I did a quick (but not exhaustive) search through the history of Saul, the first King of Israel, and did not find any evidence that he wrote his own book of the law. David on the other hand, likely did. I say likely because throughout Psalm 119, it does not specifically mention that he wrote his

own book. But Psalm 119 is loaded with verses showing that David did indeed regularly have the words of God before him. Starting in verse 9-11, David says... "How can a young man keep his way pure? By guarding it according to your word. With my whole heart I seek you, let me not wander from your commandments! I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." Then in verse15-16... "In the way of your testimonies I delight as much as in all riches. I will meditate on your precepts and fix my eyes on your ways." Verse 30 "I set your rules before me."

David obviously had God's word before him, kept it before him, read it, studied it, meditated on it and strived to honor it. I would not be surprised at all if



he wrote a copy for himself to do all these things because the scrolls of the law were kept by the priests. And he may have been the only king to have followed this instruction in the history of Israel.

Kind of interesting that God would specify to write it down. I recall a sermon of five or six years ago by Pastor Dave where he encouraged us to takes notes during his sermons... to write things down. I don't remember all the statistics he gave us but the clear point was that recall probability increases dramatically when you go from just hearing to actually writing down what you hear.

Here is a quote from an article I recently found on this matter... "Research shows that when we write by hand, our brain receives feedback from our motor actions, and the movements involved in writing with a pen or pencil play an important role in letter and word recognition and recall." Same thing pastor Dave told us. God created us and knows the intricate details of our physical make up. He gave the same instruction... to remember it, write it down. To keep remembering it, go back often and re-read what you wrote down.


I have noticed this truth in a menial way... shopping lists. When I head out to Publix with the intention to purchase certain items, there are three possibilities. 1. I don't write a list and come home without several of the items I intended to buy. 2. I write a list, take the list and come home with everything I intended to buy. 3. This also happens... I write a complete list but get distracted and leave it on the kitchen counter. Amazingly, having written it down, even though I don't have it in front of me, I usually come home with everything... even if there are ten items!

David Jeremiah challenged his readers/students to try a "write it down" experiment. Upon request, he is offering a special journal for handwriting Paul's entire Letter to the Romans. So, I called and requested one and intend to try it. There are so many verses in this letter that are important to our witnessing or teaching activities that bringing them to immediate recall could be extremely helpful in those times. It will take a while but I promise to let you know how it works out. In the meantime, if you are beefing up your scriptural knowledge for witnessing/teaching, try writing it down.

That brings up one final thought. When I first started reading the gospels, I was amazed at the exactness of the descriptions of events, the conversations, and the sayings of Jesus. Perhaps as little as ten or as many as 20 years passed from the actual events/conversations/sayings and the recording of them in the gospels. How on earth did those four men do this? The answer is found in the fourteenth chapter of John's Gospel, verses 25-26. Jesus is speaking of many things to the disciples during the last supper and says this... "These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." Amazing!

Of course this is not out of character for God to take over and ensure recall of Him and His word. In

the fullness of time, when the purposes He has determined for His chosen people are fulfilled, God will give them the knowledge and remembrance of His word. Jeremiah describes this in chapter 31 of his prophetic book. Verse 33 says... 'For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God and they shall be my people." Yes we can and should make our own efforts to place the Word into our hearts and minds and we can be encouraged that we have a helper.




