

# **Evangelism Task Force**

This article by Pastor Greg Laurie points out something that without it, we can't possibly effectively tell others about Jesus. We should be asking our Lord to break our hearts for the same thing that breaks His!

Please read the last paragraph very carefully.

# An Essential for Evangelism

My heart is filled with bitter sorrow and unending grief for my people, my Jewish brothers and sisters. I would be willing to be forever cursed—cut off from Christ!—if that would save them. - (Romans 9:2–3)

General William Booth, the founder of the Salvation Army, once said that if he had his way, he wished part of the final training for Christians going into the work of evangelism would be for them to dangle over Hell for twenty-four hours. It wasn't so they would fear it for themselves, because they had the hope of Heaven. Rather, it was so they could see the reality of what awaits those who do not know Jesus Christ.


In Romans 9, Paul identified something that is essential for effective evangelism. He wrote, "With Christ as my witness, I speak with utter truthfulness. My conscience and the Holy Spirit confirm it. My heart is filled with bitter sorrow and unending grief for my people, my Jewish brothers and sisters. I would be willing to be forever cursed—cut off from Christ!—if that would save them" (verses 1–3).

In fact, if we are lacking this quality, then everything else really is of no consequence. Paul had a Godgiven burden for those who did not know Jesus Christ. He cared. It burned inside of him. And in his case, it was for his own kinsmen, the Jews.

Do you have a God-given burden for those who don't know Jesus Christ? And if you don't, do you want one? Be careful. If you ask God to give you this burden, you may be surprised at how quickly He answers you. The results could be life changing.

As I have said so many times, God is not looking for ability; He is looking for availability. In time He will help you in your ability. He will help you in your technique. He will help you in all those things. But what you need to start with is a Godgiven burden for the lost. **Pastor Greg Laurie, www.harvest.org**

#### STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE

It is now late January and again I am starting with a blank page staring at me. It is usually at this time that I am looking at whatever I can find that will prompt a thought with which I can start and then hopefully expand on. This process includes a lot of prayer as I ask Him for help. So, now I think back several weeks to one of our Tuesday morning breakfasts. The question was asked, what did we look forward to in 2023? That was then followed by a question about what we hope for regarding our church. I stated that I prayed that we would have an additional one million dollars in our building fund. Then someone asked why I thought that a new building was in God's plan for us. This took a moment, but I remember several things that have occurred during the past few years that show me that our church is traveling on the path laid by the Father. First, two churches became one with very little fall out. Then, with the assistance of a church member the property on US 27 was donated to us. Then there was the pandemic during which many churches either folded or lost significant attendance, while we came through not only intact but are now seeing our attendance grow. Lastly, we were able to purchase our current facility with cash due to our own giving plus a significant gift for that purpose followed by an accommodation by the seller. In addition, consider the leadership that He brought to us. When Pastor Ken had to leave, we got Pastor Gary from the Presbytery. He was replaced by Pastor Dave who took us through the previously mentioned merger. When Pastor Dave needed help Pastors John and Rick appeared. Then we also had another Pastor John to lead the choir and when he left Peggy took that over. I am pointing this out because the church never went looking for any of these folks, they found us, liked us and were here when their services were needed! Either we are the luckiest Church, or we had some Divine help. Now, I am a firm believer that when following God's path, He will help. So, if anyone thinks we are going in the wrong direction, I would like to hear that and especially the reasoning.

Did you know that Presbyterians have been passing the offering plate during worship services for over 140 years? I didn't either. But, while the article that I read was pointing out how mechanisms for giving have changed over the years, it showed me how hard it is for us to break old habits. It also indicates to me that there is some necessity for the practice. In our case there is usually as much support received that way as from all others.

Now as always, the subject is giving. When I look around, it seems to me that most of us feel like we don't have enough and spend much of our time trying to accumulate more and the rest of our time trying to figure out how to keep it. Giving away what we have is directly opposed to this idea, but that's why it's so powerful. Which brings me to the last point. Thankfully the economy of God doesn't work the way ours does. When we use what He has provided, when we're faithful with it instead of holding onto it with all our might, God reproduces it. I read somewhere that no one has ever starved because they tithed too much. God just doesn't work that way. When we trust God with our money, giving it

away instead of holding onto it for fear He won't provide, He does provide. Not only that, He will go above and beyond what we have done. God won't be out-given. When we're generous with the things we count on to keep us safe, we're placing our wellbeing and our faith in the hands of the only one who can truly take care of us. It's never been about the money. It's always been about the faith!

Please think about this as you prayerfully consider your support of our continued growth.

# My Morning Resolve with My Lord...




