

We learned a great deal, took notes, and are planning for a (hopefully) better exhibit next year.



Some have talked about providing a credit card service for sales. Others spoke about extending the sale opportunities by including tables for smaller items; or to improve publicity. Other ideas will certainly develop as we move forward. We have already expressed our desire to the Glendale officials, for us to repeat next year, in December.

January 22, 2015, marks the opening of the Ascension Lutheran Exhibit in Paradise Valley (Exhibit open Jan. 22-Feb. 9, 2015), thanks to Victoria Lans-

ing. To date, 29 art pieces will be provided to the public, mostly parishioners, at the Church on the Western border of Scottsdale. It will be our second exhibit at Ascension Lutheran, 7100 N. Demonstrator Sue Hunter

Sue Hunter was born in Arkansas but has lived in Arizona since 1960 and thinks of Arizona as home. The lovely desert colors, wide open spaces, and diverse landscapes of the southwest provide her with endless subject matter for her paintings. Color is an important aspect of Sue's art which is reflected in her impressionistic style ."I try to put into my paintings the emotions I feel using color, light and shadow effects to create design." She works in pastel, oil, watercolor and acrylics. Her subjects include landscapes, still life, figures and animals.

Sue graduated from Western International University and has studied art at Scottsdale Artists School, Scottsdale Community College, with local art instructors and has attended numerous workshops locally and in Europe.

Sue is a consistent award winner in juried exhibits and her work is included in many private and public collections. She had an article about her art in the March 2010 issue of Southwest Art. Her work has been juried into the Scottsdale Artists School's Best and Brightest show numerous times. She won Second Place for her pastel "Family Outing". She is a juried member of Arizona Artists Guild, Arizona Watercolor Association, Arizona Pastel Artists Association—Signature, Contemporary Watercolors, Mid-Southern Watercolorists—Signature, Scottsdale Artists League, Sonoran Artists League and Degas Pastel Society.

She teaches classes in watercolor, acrylic, oil and pastel at Shemer Art Center and in her studio. Sue also does painting demonstrations at various art groups and judges art shows as well as teaches workshops.



TRIBUTE Grant Washburn

Grant Washburn, our prodigious photographer was born and raised in Madison Heights, a suburb of Detroit, MI. He took his first pictures in high school with a Brownie Star Flash. Grant studied at Western Michigan University and graduated from Boston U, with a Master's Degree in Theology. Our Mr. Washburn was a pastor in the United Methodist Church from 1970 until 1995. He and his wife have two daughters and two grandchildren. The Washburns retired from the ministry to Phoenix, where Mrs. Washburn worked in Social Services and he was a case manager for long term Mercy Care.

Ten years ago, on a trip to Israel and Egypt, Grant bought a SLR Digital Cannon camera. This camera enables him to print his own work in large sizes on his home printer. He also mats and frames his photos, himself. Grant takes perfectly timed shots of landscapes, flowers and birds, getting the exact lighting and focus. His compositions are beautiful works of art. He especially likes to capture the flights of Humming Birds at the Desert Botanical Gardens. Grant also enjoys the meetings and activities of the Phoenix Artists Guild.

Creative Corner

Having trouble with backgrounds? It's been a bugaboo for many of us when choosing Still Life or Portrait as our subject. One would think that if it is indeed a "background" it should some how go unnoticed by the viewer. NOT! The design and handling of your background has everything to do with how your viewer perceives the POSITIVE areas of the work. In that sense, the background (and in the case of Still Life, the foreground as well!) becomes a negative design factor! First consideration is it's size relative to the positive areas - make sure it isn't larger than your subject! Consider its shape around your object - is it pleasing? Are edges between positive areas softened against the background? Do the colors in the background also contain some of the colors in the subject (harmony/unity)? Avoid attention-getting things like too much detail, too much value contrast, etc. Study some of the Master painters of past and present and take note of how backgrounds are handled. DESIGN it as PART of your painting.
