### **By Elaine Waters**

As artists, we all have the goal to be BETTER ART-ISTS. We, as instructors, encourage our students and

artist friends to paint from their own resource photos.... And not to copy copyrighted paintings of other artists. Because we painters are not usually professional photographers, our photos are not usually wonderful, so we may fall into the trap of combining photos to make a painting. This can be very dangerous and a lot of undesirable things can happen.

The light sources in the resource photos will probably be different, so the painting will NOT have a consistent light source. The lights and shadows may come from multiple sources. Some light from above, some from the right, and some from left. This is not good.

The artist may attempt to tell a story, but the composition may be weak because the artist is trying to tell TOO MANY STORIES. Are the resource photos related or are the subject, the background and other miscellaneous features put together to tell a story? This usually doesn't work because of one very important issue. That VERY IMPORTANT ISSUE IS PERSPECTIVE. If the perspective, the horizon line , and the scale of objects is appropriate and the same in all the resource photos, it may work, but it is very difficult to pull off successfully.

We don't usually see all of these problems in the work of a professional artist, but many times student and amateur artists will use too many resources.... A bird from one photo, a fence post from another, a distant barn and a horse in a pasture.... and then will try to tie them all together with a lot of flowers in the foreground. I'm sorry folks.... It just doesn't work!

When planning your painting, limit your resource photos, feel strongly about your center of interest, know your light source and keep it consistent.... Be careful with perspective AND MAKE SURE YOUR PRESENTATION IS PERSPECTIVELY CORRECT! Don't try to tell too many stories in each painting.... Tell one story and save the rest of the stories for other paintings!

#### EXHIBITS

The "A group Effort" exhibit in Chandler closed in August. A beautiful array of fine art and a wonderful huge group of photographs of the event by our own Jaxine (as seen in the Alliance Newsletter). Take a look.

The Holland Gallery exhibit ("ART inpARTnership II"), October 1 through October 27 represents the second annual Alliance 12-month exhibit cycle. Entry deadline was July 24th with over 150 pieces competing. 63 artists will participate with over 55 pieces of art showing. Hanging will be September 30th, with reception October 8th.

The Alliance Online Gallery is open continuously to juried artists, 2D and 3D including jewelry. For a 6 month period, all artwork is posted online quarterly. Deadline dates to submit for a quarterly are January, April, July and October 1st, with artwork to be posted online each 2 weeks after each deadline. Cost is \$50 per 6 month period. 
