Creative Corner

A Moment for Thought.....Excerpts from "Art Treasures of the Louvre"

Toulouse-Lautrec [1864-1901]

When Toulouse-Lautrec was a young boy, his legs were broken in two successive accidents; his body became deformed, his torso being normal but his legs stopped growing. His frustrated love for swift, graceful movement found expression in his many paintings of horses, dancers and acrobats. Under the influence of Degas and Japanese prints, he developed a fluid, simple line which he used with dazzling effect. He frequently found themes sympathetic to his mood in music halls and night cafes in Paris. His early demise was brought on by a life of dissipation that ruined his health. ... "endowed with a gift for incisive drawing, his characteristic is the crackling and leaping pictorial stroke; laid on in vivid arabesques, the color itself is compelled to seize the revealing detail in an attitude or face and even to develop it to the point of biting irony."
