Creative

Painting light – by Julie Frye

Why do art teachers (the good ones at least) insist that LIGHT – its direction, its temperature, is so darned important in painting???? Well as Elaine and I stress each time we critique, establish your light source at the very beginning and then set about building your composition around it! This applies of course to paintings which depict Nature – Landscapes, Portraiture, Still Life etc. where the light describes the subject and helps us achieve depth on the two-dimensional surface we are working on.

There are some questions to ask yourself when the painting you are working on doesn't look as though it has light in it.

For our general purposes, most indoor situations have too many light sources (windows, lamps, doors, etc.) so be careful of that when setting up a still life. Be sure it is lit properly with a spot-light so you can control where your highlights are. However, in an outdoor situation, say painting a landscape en plein aire, the light source is paramount in the success or failure of what you attempt to depict on your canvas. As mentioned in earlier articles, the light changes rapidly so you need to establish your light source and stick to it throughout the process.

Of course, the color of the light is also important, so ask yourself, "What <u>color</u> is the light?" and "How bright is it?" You're not so much painting a green tree as you are painting light hitting that tree. If the tree is in sunlight, the highlights on the mass of leaves would be warm and of course light in value. In the shadows, you will see cooler and darker values. Note carefully how the light helps describe the cylindrical shape of the trunk and branches. As your light shifts, a preliminary value sketch, quickly done and not detailed, will remind you of the direction of light you began with.

To depict LIGHT, you must adhere to the important rules of good painting outlined many times by your instructors, regardless of medium. Have you indicated a dominant, subdominant and small element in your composition? Are there sufficient value changes to suggest form according to the light source? Does the light flow throughout your painting to lead the eye to your focal point?

Light is key – light is wonderful. Light is color, color is light! Resolve to make diligent and careful observations of Nature in the New Year! You will see your paintings improve –I guarantee it!



EXHIBITIONS

The call-to-artists is up for the "Interpretations III" show and sale at the WHAM West Gallery in March 2018. The WHAM West Gallery is located at 16560 N. Dysart Rd. in Surprise, AZ. Prospectus is on the Alliance website at azartalliance.com. This exhibit is open to Alliance juried and nonjuried artists through "Entrythingy" The artwork will be juried so those seeking Alliance-juried status can work toward becoming juried (so with lower entry costs in future shows). Deadline for entry is December 20, 2017.



> COMPUTER CORNER:

Beware scam popups:

You're cruising the Internet when suddenly a scary looking window pops up telling you that your computer has been infected. It may look a lot like a regular Windows screen, or the dreaded "blue screen", so as recommended by the message, you click on 'OK' clean up my computer button' and they've got you!

The scam popup will take over and keep you from doing anything, while offering to fix your problem if you will just enter your credit card number! They'll also disable firewalls and virus protection programs.

These very ominous but convincing scams are tricking people all over the world, and increasing with malware attacks.

They can use official sounding names like Windows Ultimate Booster or Windows Safety Master, and if you click on anything, even the cancel button, they'll do their damage.

If you see anything strange pop up on your screen, don't click on anything no matter how convincing it looks. Instead, use the "three-fingered-salute" (Ctrl-Alt-Del) to start your Task Manager which allows you to end the process altogether.

You can THEN select your virus/malware protection software, to clear out any "remnants".
